Keep it clean or feel green
Bacteria on raw meat, chicken, eggs and fruit 'n' veg can spread from your kitchen to your food, making you sick. Simply clean your hands, utensils and benchtops with hot, soapy water before, during and after cooking to prevent food poisoning.

CLEAN

Be smart. Keep foods apart
The majority of food poisoning happens at home. Separate raw meat, chicken and eggs from ready-to-eat food. Use separate utensils and chopping boards to prevent cross-contamination.

SEPARATE

Nuke it don't puke it
Cook meat, chicken, eggs and seafood thoroughly to kill bacteria that can make you sick. When cooking meat, ensure the juices run clear and there's no pink inside. Only reheat food once, and until it's steaming hot.

COOK

Chill it or chuck it
Bacteria that cause food poisoning grow best between 5°C and 60°C, known as the temperature danger zone. So, keep cold foods cold (below 5°C) and hot foods hot (above 60°C). Anything left in the danger zone for more than four hours should be thrown away.

NOTICES FROM THE SHIRE OF KULIN

TO THE HOUSEHOLDER - COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP

With the coming spring and even though there are no Bush Races, many visitors will still be arriving/travelling in our Shire for a multitude of reasons, not the least that Kulin is quite simply a fantastic place to be.

With the above in mind the Shire is requesting all residents to set aside some time now to spruce up their little piece of heaven. Time to clean up around your home for the spring and to get in early to get rid of potential fire hazards that will exist once the grasses dry off. There is also the issue that long grass and rubbish makes an ideal home for snakes and other unwanted pests. In terms of Bushfire control, in past years Council has not seriously considered issuing infringements however this year there will be no warnings given to anyone not complying with the firebreak order.

THE FIREBREAK ORDER THAT APPLIES TO TOWNSITE LAND IS AS FOLLOWS:

“Land Area less than 1 hectare:- All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;

It be recommended that at least a 2m wide area, immediately

within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs.”

For information any land of one hectare or above the rural provisions apply. We look forward to your support and cooperation in helping clean-up Kulin.

KERBSIDE RUBBISH COLLECTION

The Shire will be conducting a kerbside pickup throughout the townsite on Thursday 10th and Thursday 24th of September 2020.

This will be a great opportunity to get rid of any rubbish not suited to the weekly depot pickups.

- Small electrical goods, small furniture, tree and garden trimmings etc.
- Larger items may be removed from your yard by phoning office staff to organise for pick-up. Please let us know if you would like something removed.
- Please NO broken glass or lawn clippings.

SHIRE OF KULIN - BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

NOTICE TO ALL OWNERS AND/OR OCCUPIERS OF LAND WITHIN THE SHIRE OF KULIN

PURSUANT TO THE POWERS contained in Section 33, you are hereby required on or before 31 October 2020 and thereafter up to and including 15 March 2021 to have a 3 metre firebreak clear of all inflammable material on all rural and townsite rural land owned or occupied by you:

1. Immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and
2. In such other positions as is necessary to divide land into areas not exceeding 500 hectares, each completely surrounded by a firebreak; and
3. Immediately surrounding any part of land used for crop; and
4. Parallel to and within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps on the land; and
5. Immediately surrounding receptacles used for the storage of fuel, whether they contain fuel or not; the firebreak required to comply with this item shall be no less than 5 metres wide; and
6. Immediately inside land which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not); the firebreak required shall be no less than 7 metres wide. Where the land is prepared for clearing by burning after 19 September 2020 you shall provide the firebreak immediately.

TOWNSITES – AREA LESS THAN 1 HECTARE

All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs

and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;

It is recommended that at least a 2m wide area immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs.”

(Note: any land of one hectare or above - rural provisions apply.)

FIREBREAK VARIATION

If it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impractical to clear firebreaks to comply with this notice due to soil erosion, the spread of salinity or for any other reason, a request for a variation may be made to the Council no later than the 1 September of each year. Such a request must be in writing and include a detailed plan showing the proposed location of firebreaks or of the alternative fire protection methods to be used.

HARVESTING OPERATIONS - MOBILE FIRE FIGHTING UNITS

An operational mobile engine powered firefighting pump unit with no less than 500 litres of water shall be in attendance during grain harvesting operations. If the unit is trailer mounted the trailer must be attached to a vehicle at all times during harvesting operations and the unit must be in the paddock, or adjoining paddock, where the harvesting operation is being carried out.

AUTOMATIC HARVESTING BANS

A Harvest Ban will apply automatically on Christmas Day and New Year’s Day.

OTHER MATTERS

If for hardship reasons, it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impossible to clear firebreaks required by this Notice, you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to seek alternative options. Claimants of hardship, should do so with sufficient time to allow alternatives to be enacted. Claims of hardship does not automatically exempt owners and occupiers from the requirements of this Notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this Notice is a fine not exceeding \$5000. A person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of the Shire or a contractor performing the work directed in this Notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the due date. If the requirements of this Notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

BUSHFIRE BRIGADE INFORMATION

VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION STICKERS

Volunteer Fire Fighters / Bush Fire Brigade Members please be advised that the grey Vehicle Identifier Stickers will expire on 30 September 2020; and need to be replaced with the new blue stickers (valid from 1 October 2020 – 20 September 2022). These stickers are available from the Shire Office. If you would like one posted out please email Nicole eso@kulin.wa.gov.au and provide your vehicle registration plate number and the make & model of your vehicle.

Please see below key information from DFES regarding these stickers:-

- DFES encourages the use of Vehicle Identifier stickers to identify private vehicles owned by persons pre-authorized by Local Governments to enter the fire ground and assist with emergency response operations;
- As emergency response is often supplemented by local farmers/land owners with private vehicles who may not be members of local fire brigades they assist to provide timely identification of private vehicles and persons suitable for access on the incident ground;
- Vehicle Identifier stickers are affixed to the lower left corner of the windscreen of a vehicle to identify it as a private vehicle owned by a person who is authorised by Local Government to assist with operations;

CONDITIONS

DFES has set minimum conditions which the person being issued a vehicle identifier sticker must agree to:

- It is the responsibility of the owner and driver of the vehicle to comply with the Road Traffic Act 1974;
- Appropriate Personal Protective Equipment and Clothing will be worn at all times; and
- The driver will ensure that the vehicle's presence at an incident is recorded on both arrival and departure. The vehicle identifier sticker does not infer that a vehicle is a fire fighting vehicle, but that it may be assisting or supporting an incident, or to enable passage of brigade members through a Vehicle Control Point for the purpose of deployment to the incident (e.g. to travel to a local brigade station or to crew an appliance deployed to the incident).

Control Officer to ensure that persons attending an incident has appropriate PPE (personal protective equipment), the same responsibility rests with those attending so please ensure you wear the required clothing, otherwise insurance issues may arise.

Please email to@kulin.wa.gov.au or call Tom 9880 1204 to place an order (must include sizing). You must be a registered member of a bushfire brigade within the Shire of Kulin, and have not placed an order in the past 5 years. Orders will be taken up to Friday 12 September 2020.



BEEF PLOVE PRESSURE COOKER/SLOW COOKER

INGREDIENTS

2 ½ cups short grain brown rice, 500 grams, rinsed and drained
500 grams beef, chuck or beef stew meat cut into cubes.
I used 500 grams mince.
4 Tblsp olive oil
4 Tblsp unsalted butter
1 large onion diced
3 large carrots thickly julienned
3 cups, 720 ml warm water
1 Tspn salt
½ tsp black pepper
½ tsp ground cumin
½ tsp ground paprika
½ tsp ground coriander
1 whole garlic unpeeled, cut in half crosswise.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Rinse and drain rice and set aside. Saute beef in 4 Tblspns Oil, wait till oil is hot but not smoking. Saute until lightly browned (5 mins), stirring occasionally.
2. Add 4 Tbsp butter and chopped onion and stir 3 minutes until softened.
3. Add julienned carrots along with all seasonings (1 tsp salt,

½ tsp pepper, ½ tsp cumin, ½ tspn paprika, ½ tspn coriander) and saute 5 mins until softened, stirring occasionally.

4. Spread rice evenly over the top (Do not Stir). Push garlic halves cut-side-down, halfway into the rice. Pour very warm water (not hot), directly over garlic cloves so you don’t disturb the rice. Use the back of a wooden spoon to poke 5-7 holes through the rice to the bottom of the pot, (this helps to disburse the flavour)

5. Cover and cook on high for 30 minutes, let cooker rest and naturally depressurize for 10 min before switching to venting position to release steam. Make sure the steam is fully released and the pressure valve has floated down before opening pot.
6. Remove garlic, for extra flavour squeeze garlic cloves back into pot. Combine all ingredients


KULIN WALK TRAIL






Nominations received after the closing date will be ineligible for this year's awards.

Selection Criteria

The winners will have been judged to have shown active citizenship and:

- Significant contribution to the local community.
- Demonstrated leadership on a community issue resulting in the enhancement of community life.
- A significant initiative which has brought about positive change and added value to community life.
- Inspiring qualities as a role model for the community.

Eligibility criteria

- Nominees should reside or work principally within the local authority making the award.
- Awards may be granted posthumously in recognition of recent achievements.
- Groups of people or couples will not normally be eligible except when meeting the criteria for a community group.
- A person may receive an award on more than one occasion in recognition of their particularly outstanding community contribution or involvement in an alternative initiative.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated in future years.
- Nominations must be apolitical in their nature and should not in any way bring the awards program or local government area into disrepute.
- Sitting members of State, Federal and Local Government are not eligible.
