Butlers Garage Museum is the home of an old Hit & Miss stationary engine. The engine has spent most of its life on

Strathallen farm west Kulin. Its early history is a little vague, it was probably sold by Joy & Gibsons Perth. We know the engine came to Wickepin by train, then by horse dray to Kulin circa 1915. Later the engine was brought by David King to cut chaff for the team of horses (before 1920). The engine worked at this job for the next 30 years. For the next 70 years it sat on 2 salmon gum logs in the yard at Strathallen.

Under the guidance of Bill Herwig & Clarrie King, the engine has come back to life again and can be seen at the museum on Wednesday and Saturday.

90 Years of The Flying Doctor

The Royal Flying Doctor Service is one of the largest and most comprehensive aeromedical organisations in the world, providing extensive primary health care and 24-hour emergency service to people over an area of 7.69 million square kilometres.



After 90 years of service its time to look back on all the RFDS does for those living in rural and remote areas of Australia. Before there was the Flying Doctor there was little medical help for people who lived in places far from cities. If they were seriously injured they had to travel hundreds of kilometres by horse, cart, or camel to reach a doctor. They often died before they got there. The RFDS is constantly working to see that those living in rural and remote areas can enjoy the same health outcomes as those living in city areas.

The RFDS is an vital service to us here in the Wheatbelt and we are extremely grateful for their 90 years of servicing the local and surrounding remote communities.



Sweet Easter Cookies

Ingredients

- 1 Cup unsalted butter
- 1 Cup granulated white sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon almond extract
- 1 egg
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3 cups all-purpose flour

Icing

1 1/2 cups icing sugar mixture, sifted 25g butter, softened 1 tablespoon milk, or water Few drops of food colouring



Method

1) Brush a baking tray with melted butter. Combine the flour, sultanas, mixed peel, sugar, yeast, mixed spice, cinnamon and nutmeg in a large bowl. Stir in the salt.

2) Make a well in the centre. Add the milk, butter and egg. Use a wooden spoon to stir until just combined. Use your hands to bring the dough together in the bowl.

3) Turn onto a well-floured surface. Knead for 10-15 minutes or until smooth and elastic. Brush a large bowl with melted butter. Place dough in the bowl. Turn to coat. Cover with plastic wrap or a damp tea towel. Place in a warm, draught-free place to prove for 1 1/2 hours or until dough doubles in size.

4) Preheat oven to 200°C. Punch down the centre of the dough with your fist. Turn onto a lightly floured surface. Knead for 2-3 minutes or until dough is smooth and elastic and has returned to its original size. Divide into 12 equal portions. Shape into balls. Place, side-by-side, on the prepared tray. Place in a warm, draught-free place for 30 minutes or until dough has risen 1-2cm.

5) To make the cross paste, combine the flour and water in a bowl until a smooth paste forms. Transfer to a piping bag fitted with a 2mm plain nozzle. Pipe in a continuous line along the centre of each row of buns. Repeat in the opposite direction to make crosses. Bake for 20 minutes or until golden and the buns sound hollow when tapped on the base.

6) Meanwhile, to make the glaze, place sugar and water in a saucepan over medium heat. Cook, stirring, for 3 minutes or until sugar dissolves and mixture thickens slightly.

7) Brush the tops of the buns with the glaze. Serve hot with butter

Method

1. Preheat oven to 350° F.

2. In the bowl of your mixer cream butter and sugar until light and creamy,

3. Beat in eggs 1 at a time and add extract.

4. In a separate bowl combine baking powder and salt with flour and add a little at a time to the wet ingredients. The dough will be very stiff. If it becomes too stiff for your mixer turn out the dough onto a countertop surface. Wet your hands and finish off kneading the dough by hand.

5. (Do not chill dough). Divide into workable batches, roll out onto a floured surface and cut into your choice of Easter themed cutters, you want these cookies to be on the thicker side (closer to 1/4 inch).

6. Bake at 350 for 6-8 minutes. Let cool on the cookie sheet until firm enough to transfer to a cooling rack.

7.Using a wooden spoon, combine icing sugar, butter and milk in medium bowl until smooth. Add a touch of extra milk or water to get a glossier consistency.

Step 2

Add enough food colouring to tint icing to desired colour. Mix well and let your imagination run wild and decorate how you please.



NOTICE OF BAITING PROGRAM FOR WILD DOGS

The Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group advises that from January 1st 2018, heavy baiting programs (using 1080 meat baits) to control wild dogs will be carried out by Licensed Pest Management Technicians on Unallocated Crown Land to the east of the State Barrier Fence. In addition to 1080 baiting programs, technicians will be using foot hold traps treated with Strychnine to remove Wild Dogs that are currently impacting the livestock industry in the Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group region.

From January 1st 2018, the standard wild dog control methods will be ongoing and this may include setting of traps and dispersing of 1080 meat baits in the groups operational area.

The poison baits will remain toxic for a number of months or until substantial rainfall is received. People are advised to take care when working within or visiting these areas.

Warning signs have been placed where applicable on Unallocated Crown Land and main access roads.

Picnic sites and recreational reserves are **not** included within the baiting program; however, baiting may take place adjacent to such areas and domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times.

1080 baiting is an integral part of the wild dog pest management program to protect livestock from death and injury caused by wild dogs.



Exercise caution to prevent your pets from being poisoned by 1080 baits.



If a wild dog is sighted, please report to the Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group immediately.



If poisoning occurs, contact a doctor or Poisons Information Centre (phone 13 11 26).




