Our AOOBs are a fantastic representation of what small groups can achieve when they work together.

Rodney Diery – Over 20 years' service to Volunteer Fire & Rescue Services, 14 of these years as Captain. Rod has dedicated much of his time as a volunteer to the group including recruiting and training new members.

Citizen of the Year – Senior (Was nominated for Citizen of the year but as he is of the 'Senior' age he has one in that category)

Graeme Robertson – For his work as chairman of the Kulin Bush Races event. Graeme Robertson has been the Chairman of the Kulin Bush Races since it began in 1995. Graeme's leadership, support and encouragement for his team over the past 23 years has been exceptional and an unparalleled example of leadership, enthusiasm, determination, positivity, professionalism and diplomacy.

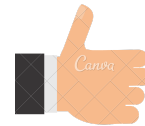

CAMP KULIN SUMMER SEASON A HIT

6/2/2018

For immediate release

Camp Kulin's Summer 2018 has proven a hit with campers, families and volunteers from right across WA and interstate.

Running over December and January, 182 campers aged 8-15 from 68 suburbs travelled up to 1565km each way to attend the summer camp program. A team of 57 volunteers aged 16-75 years old donated over 5250 hours of their time, equivalent to over \$157,000 of time. This included six former campers from the first Camp Kulin kids camps who had reached volunteer age and wanted to return to give back to the program that helped them when they were children.

Catering wise, the Camp Kulin team prepared and served 2104 meals and 1183 morning and afternoon teas, equating to over a tonne of food. This includes over 3400 pieces of bread, 1190 rolls, 1400 pieces of fruit, 200kg meat, 118kg lasagne, 140kg salad ingredients, 50kg cheese, 25kg cereal and 38kg condiments.

Campers took part in over 18,000 minutes of activities over the summer, designed to teach essential life skills such as leadership, respect, trust, self esteem, confidence, communication skills, perseverance, ambition and emotional regulation. This included Camp Kulin's nationally recognised teambuilding and leadership program, gaga dodgeball, giant human hungry hippos, Quidditch, 9 square in the air and lots more.

"Camp Kulin has taught me how to be grateful, respectful, cheerful and just a better person in general," camper Kawther Sabah, 15 said. "The opportunities are so great, like I can get to change myself to the way I want to be and I can learn so much."

Camp Kulin Founder and Manager Tanya Dupagne said the 2018 Summer Season was the biggest yet for the camp program.

"It's been a huge start to the year for us, and we're looking forward to what's to come. Over the next two weekends we will be running our first Aspire Inspire programs for ladies from regional WA, thanks to the AgriFutures Rural Women's Award and Westpac," she said. "We then move into our fifth birthday celebrations on the 24th February, where the community are invited to join us to celebrate five years of the program."

Kulin Bush Races 2017/2018 Funding Guidelines

1. Grants are made to:

- a) Community organisations or groups based in the Shire of Kulin, operating on a not for profit basis where the purpose of the grant benefits the community.
- b) Local Government Authorities where the purpose of the grant benefits the community.

2. Conditions of application:

- a) Application is to be in writing using the Grant Application Form and submitted by 19th March 2018.
- b) Quotes outlining funding requirements are to be attached to the application.
- c) Supporting minutes are to be attached to the application.
- d) A current audited Financial Report is to be attached to the application.
- e) A budget of the proposed project is to be attached to the application.

3. Conditions of grant:

- a) The grant must be used for the purpose for which it is given.
- b) The grant must be used within 6 months (by 30th September 2018) unless otherwise stated by Kulin Bush Races (KBR). KBR must be advised if any delays occur relating to the expenditure of the grant and a written request must be made seeking approval for extension of time.

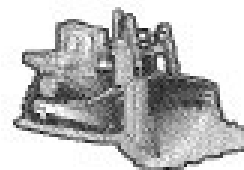

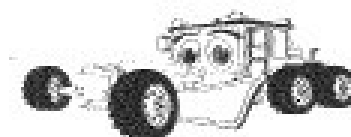

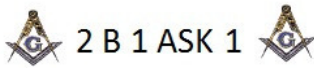
