

CEO CORNER

Welcome back to another CEO corner for 2021 and the start of the 2021/22 Financial Year. And the big wet winter continues. Many thanks to all community members for their patience and understanding with the multiple road closures that have occurred in recent weeks due to the significant rainfall and runoff events. Shire staff do not take the closing of roads lightly, and the reasons are twofold; one to protect the integrity of the road and two; more importantly for the safety of road users and the public. This was most evident around Katanning the past week where tragically a motorist was caught in floodwaters. A huge thanks to Judd and the crew, who have been flat out the past week dealing with the many road closures and reopening throughout the Shire, as well as assisting Main Roads with their closures.

This week saw Kulin host another rendition of GenAg at the FRC with over 70 participants and guest speakers. Congratulations to Tom Murphy and the Rural Bank team, the Kulin Community Bank as well as Shire staff on an awesome event. A great opportunity for networking and a variety of speakers touching on many innovative sustainable agricultural topics. The event was topped off by the catering from Acres of Taste.

On Monday 26th July the WA Department of Transport hosted Regional Forums on Agricultural Supply Chain Improvement (ASCI) in both Wagin and Merredin. President West and I attended each of the Forums. Key points of focus were how the State government is looking to spend \$200M of funding towards rail investment throughout the wheatbelt. Tier 3 rail is a passionate topic that was discussed at both Forums and there are many challenges around reopening this system and which is the most appropriate line to reopen first. Obviously, Kulin Shire Council is advocating for the Narrogin to Kulin line to be reopened, but further planning is also required on appropriate gauge of line, connection from Narrogin to Merredin, well as potentially finding an alternative rail line into Perth from the wheatbelt other than via Northam. Council has also put an initial submission to ASCI.

Last week also saw Council put in a submission to the Standing Committee on Public Administration's inquiry into the delivery of ambulance services in WA. Key points of the Standing Committee are:

- how 000 ambulance calls are received, assessed, prioritised and despatched in the metropolitan area and in the regions.
- the efficiency and adequacy of the service delivery model of ambulance services in metropolitan and regional areas of Western Australia
- whether alternative service delivery models in other jurisdictions would better meet the needs of the community
- any other matters considered Garrick Yandle CEO

relevant by the Committee.

Friday 30th July sees the Wheatbelt South Regional Group Meeting held in Wickepin. This meeting sees Councillor Robins as Chairperson where Kulin Shire Council is also to be awarded over \$2.3M in funding for Fence Road South, Dudinin-Jitarning Road, Kulin-Holt Rock Road and Yealering Road.

Thursday 29th August will see the first soil turned on the Kulin All Ages Precinct. The contractor will be onsite near the VDZ commencing works. The first section built will be the Skate Zone, followed by the Pump Track and Hangout Zone, with an Obstacle Zone to hopefully be built at the end subject to further funding. Thanks for CKC who have contributed funding towards the project as well as Council and the Federal government's LRCIP funding stream. The whole project has been a community collaboration between Council, Shire staff, CKC and KDHS. We ask that the community is respectful in their movements around the construction site, which will have appropriate barricade fencing.

Winter sports season is nearing the business end of the season. The KKFC Blues continue their annual charge towards finals. This weekend sees the KKHC Vipers in the Roe Districts Hockey Association Grand Final with all 4 teams participating. What a fantastic effort from all involved and let's hope they can bring home 4 from 4.

As always plenty happening in Kulin, until next time safe travels.


















Road Flood Damage





The wild weather has taken a toll on my photography but has stimulated early orchids and kept shrubs flowering for weeks longer than usual. In 2019 our firies burned the jumble of fallen logs around Jilakin Rock. Well done Kulin Brigade, now it is easy and safer to walk around and we have found species not listed here. Ten to forty spider orchids dance in clusters and hundreds of snail orchids bend in the wind. Multi-coloured and strange fungi light up the grey litter.

We are delighted that Sandy Murray is writing the history of the Kulin Wildflower Place & Herbarium. It is inspiring to re-discover all the work the members tackled over the decades. The photos evoke warm memories of those who are no longer with us. The group began as Kulin-Kondinin Herbarium way back in 1994 and was officially opened in October 1995 on the first Kulin Bush Races weekend. We have been through many changes but survive. We provide a valuable scientific resource and natural landscape advice for locals and tourists. Our West-Aussie travellers are in awe at the wide variety of forms and colours that they can see so close to town. There are mallee woodlands, varied shrublands on sandplains, saltlands with an amazing range of plants, our stunning Gimlets, Salmons and Red Morrels plus fungi and micro-flora covering the ground.
