- Wheatbelt South Regional Road Group in Wickelup.

Word has come through from our Auditors that our 2019/20 Audit and Annual Financial Report has been approved to go to Audit Committee and Council. This will be at the next Council Meeting on Wednesday 17th March.

Following this it is likely that our Annual Electors Meeting will be held in conjunction with the April Council Meeting on Wednesday 21st April.

On a staff note, congratulations to Judd Hobson who ticked over 20 years in Local Government last week. Judd is on his second stint at the Shire of Kulin, as well as spreading his wings at the Shires of Wandering and Westonia. He has held various roles including commencing on the works crew, Aquatic Centre Manager and now Works Manager. He is also actively involved in the Local Government Supervisors Association as Vice President. Well done to Judd on his 20 years of service, and as is evident with the number of projects on the go around town, he has plenty on his plate at the moment.

The summer sports season is heating up. KDHS have the Interschool Swimming Faction Carnival on Friday 19th March, Kulin Tennis Club recently held their singles championships and will be hosting a Zone Day on Saturday 20th March. Commiserations to the Men's Pennant Bowls team on bowing out of the finals last weekend. This Sunday sees the Roodogs in the Cricket Grand Final with their opponent to be determined on Saturday. As you may have seen there hasn't been much action on High Street lately. The plan was to have it sealed by now and the kerbing to be completed on Monday 15th. The recent rains have caused a delay and we have had to walk away and let the surface dry out before we can try to finish.

The good news is that the rain has tested out the new underground drainage and I am pleased to say it handled the downpour very well.

The plan moving forward is to start the final grade on Monday 15th of March and have it ready in a couple of days. Our bitumen contractors have been kind enough to slot us in once we are ready, so hopefully that will happen within the week following. The kerbing will be completed as soon as possible after that.

We will be removing the temporary fencing along High Street on Friday the 18th of March, and I please ask everybody to avoid walking through the road as we continue to work. There will be ribbon and some fencing at critical points, so please respect the space we need to get the job finished safely.

Jilakin Street and CBH Access Road have also been affected by the rain and there will be more action on those shortly.

Once again I thank you for your patience as we try to put the finishing touches on and, dare I say it quietly, hopefully there's no more rain for just a couple of weeks.

Postal voting

Early voting (by post) is made available at all State elections but is important in 2021 for those who may be uncertain about casting their ballot in person.

An application for a postal vote can be completed electronically on the Commission's website (<https://www.elections.wa.gov.au/postal-vote-apply>) or a printed form can be requested by contacting the Commission on 13 63 06 and selecting option 2.

Ballot papers will be posted to electors from Monday 22 February 2021. If posted by the elector on or before polling day, completed postal packages can be accepted via mail until 9:00am on the Thursday following polling day.

Early voting (in person)

The WA Electoral Commission is working closely with the WA Department of Health to manage the risks around COVID-19 at the 2021 election, but the constantly changing situation means the WA Electoral Commission cannot plan the lead-up to and the actual election with absolute certainty. Most importantly, the WA Electoral Commission is encouraging everyone who has concerns about attending a polling place on election day to vote prior to election day, either by postal vote or at an early voting centre.

HARVEST BAN INFORMATION LINE 9880 1511

This is a recorded message and is updated with current harvest ban information

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BAN

Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans are issued by your local government and are put in place when your local Bushfire Control Officer identifies the use of engines, vehicles, plant or machinery as high bushfire risk activities, during particular times of the day.

Kulin Shire will distribute this information via SMS and the harvest ban information line.



TOTAL FIRE BAN

A Total Fire Ban is declared on days when fires are most likely to threaten lives and property. This is because of predicted extreme fire weather or when there are already widespread fires and firefighting resources are stretched.

Total Fire Bans are put in place by DFES.

IN CASE OF FIRE RING 000

If there is a fire you must call 000 immediately. Shire of Kulin staff are unable to register the emergency.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

Burning is restricted from 16 Feb 2021 to 15 March 2021.

KULIN OVAL WATERING

The Shire of Kulin wish to advise that the town oval is no longer being watered with re-use water. Access to the oval is no longer restricted.

Contact Registers in Shire facilities

From 5 December 2020, Shire of Kulin is required to maintain mandatory contact registers for WA Health Department COVID-19 contact tracing. Individuals can either scan the SafeWA QR Code or manually sign in at each venue.

The following venues/buildings will have contact registers:

- Kulin Aquatic Centre and Waterslide
- Freebairn Recreation Centre
- Freebairn Recreation Centre Gym
- Kulin Memorial Hall
- Kulin Public Library (located at Kulin Post Office)

The WA Government has developed a free app, SafeWA, which is a digital contact register system. The SafeWA app can be downloaded from Apple App Store or Google Play. The app is not mandatory, and an alternative paper based system is also available.

-Failing to comply to the new requirements could result in fines and penalties of up to \$50,000 for an INDIVIDUAL and \$250,000 FOR A BODY CORPORATE or 12 months imprisonment.

- Any person aged 16 years and over who attends the facility, including patrons, staff, volunteers and contractors will be required to register their contact details. Records are not required to be collected for children under 16 years.

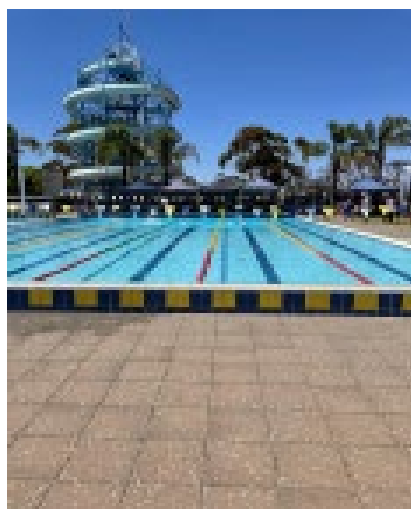

KULIN AQUATIC CENTRE AND WATERSLIDE

Well it's near the end of the season. The weather has been hit and miss this season which hasn't helped trying to keep the pool warm but it looks ok from where I'm sitting.

The Faction Carnival went off well and the kids swam really well with lots of records being broken on the day, so well done to the kids and to the coaches for all their efforts. The Inter School Swimming Carnival is coming up on the 19th of March so should be a good day and the kids will bring home some more medals I'm sure.



The Swim to Rotto challenge is still going and the lap tally is ticking along nicely. The last report, including last seasons laps, takes us from Kulin to Mardi station just south of Karratha, but with the tally increasing all the time we have made it to around 30km north of Whim Creek on our way to Port Hedland to date.

Total laps for this season is 35,696 which works out to 892 km since the start of November. Awesome effort by everyone and with three weeks left we may just get there. Keep up the good work.

The distance from Cottesloe to Rotto is 19.7km or 788 laps in this pool, and we have a few new arrivals. Van with 845, Garrick 880, Caelyn 914 and Ruth on 1078. Good job.

A few of the regulars still following the blue line and racking up the km are Jennie with 3,360 laps or 84km, Bec 2,830 laps or 71km, Clint on 2,532 laps or 63km, and Jaqui on 2,528 laps and 63km as well. Huge effort from all these swimmers.

I'd like to thank the kids on the slide for their efforts over the weekends. These guys do a great job monitoring the patrons on the slide which makes things run smoothly throughout the day.

That's all from down here until end of March. We are looking at a closing date of Sunday the 28th of March, so hopefully we get another hot spell between now and then.

KULIN CHILD CARE CENTRE

Some of our recent community intentional teaching experiences have been; World Wildlife Day and Clean up Australia Day.

Our Educators set up lots of Wildlife inspired play spaces, including small world play and a great interactive experience showing the children the effects of an Oil Spill on animals and the ocean. To demonstrate this, we mixed up a concoction to simulate crude oil made from cooking oil and cocoa. The children used all sorts of items to mop up the oil; paper, card, tissues, cloth - we soon noticed that the oil was very difficult to clean up and seemed to spread more. One idea from the children was to make a channel from rope to guide the oil to one area.

At KCCC we incorporate recycling into our everyday practices, we use a compost bin for our food scraps which we transfer to our compost pile out the back or feed to our worm farm, we put all our recyclable waste into a yellow bin or use it for craft activities, and any other waste into our red bin, which by the end of the day is very minimal, considering how many people are in the building. Our Educators also set up its very own interactive recycling station where the children could sort through various items of 'clean waste' into metal, wood, paper and plastic.

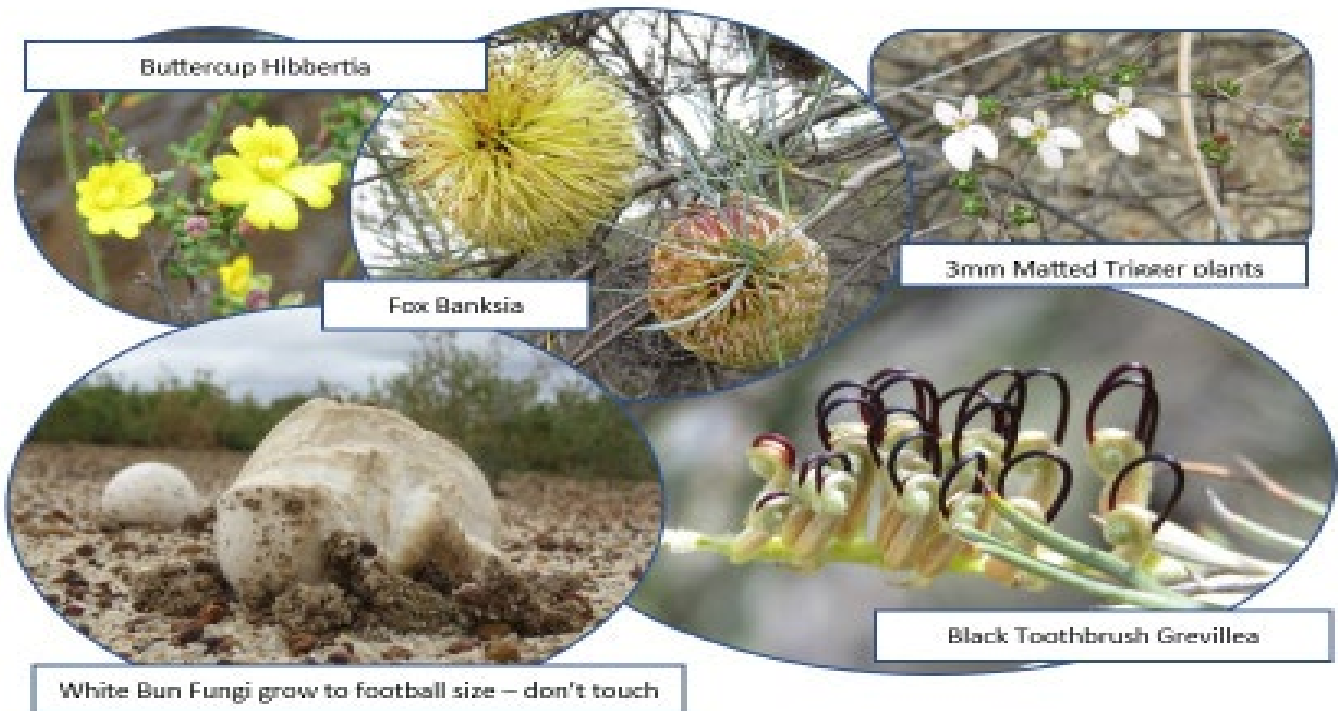

Over 100 plants are listed as flowering for Kulin this month but the seasons seem slightly topsy-turvy. Convoys of orchid seekers should arrive in late March and all through till November. The first to appear are the Leafless, the Hare & the Pygmy. Slow down for the mallees & Salmon Gums on the flats and gravel rises.

The GALLOWAY 6HP HIT and MISS ENGINE

No wonder our farming grandfathers had no need for a gym. After a hard dawn-to-dark day in the paddock, they had to pull fly-wheels to fire-up chaff-cutters then feed the horses. No natty fork-lifts to move anything, just lift and carry wherever. Visitors are always intrigued when Clarrie starts it up; after belches of black smoke it put-pop-puts along.



It was bought second-hand from Wickepin in 1918 and Clarrie's Dad, David used it to cut chaff until 1950. No spark-plugs so you spun the fly-wheel and the magneto created a spark straight into the combustion chamber. To avoid the strain, Clarrie added a starter motor from an Austin truck and a battery. The Salmon logs that it was mounted on are still okay 100 years later. The wheels are just to move it around now.

KULIN'S FIRST TRACTOR - various sources

I wonder what young John Manny would say if he could see the massive red machines cruising across the paddocks now. John was a naturally innovative mechanic who just wanted to make life easier for his Dad. Ralph Emerson recognized his talent and added financial nous then Charles Brantingham brought his global visions and they took over many other companies. Sadly John missed the glory days as he died at 30 in 1856 with 28 farm machine patents to his credit. After the crippling recession of 1921, J.I. Case Co bought the business and the E-Bs were discontinued. In the early years Cyrus McCormick accused John of copying but John hired E.M. Stanton who briefed a self-taught lawyer. Due to venue changes the President-to-be, did not actually defend in court. AS President, Abe Lincoln chose Ed Stanton as his Secretary of War

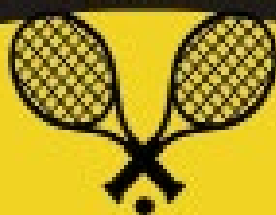
