---

Certainly not many complaints coming about there being a tough start to the season. Perhaps it could present an opportunity for a few local farmers to showcase some pictures of the best “bogged tractor” to the editors of this publication and there could be an award for the photo! Do we have any candidates out there anywhere? Maybe a few out west of Kulin?

This week we were fortunate to host the Roe Tourism Association meeting. Another great opportunity hosting at the FRC and showcasing our wonderful facilities. The meeting was catered for by local business Acres of Taste, further showing off the wares of our locals. Roe Tourism has an opportunity for hospitality and tourism business to become affiliate members of the group, specific details of this membership can be obtained from Taryn in the Shire office. Roe Tourism is a regional group of local governments, local hospitality organisations and tourist operators who gather quarterly to discuss strategic tourism issues within our region. The major focus of the group is on self-drive routes between towns allowing tourists to enjoy the quirky sites of the south eastern wheatbelt at their leisure. It promotes the region as whole and the connecting routes

between towns from Quairading to Corrigin to Kulin to Lake Grace to Hyden to Kondinin to Narembeen to Bruce Rock and back to Quairading, as well as the interconnected routes between these towns. It also focuses on the arterial routes from the south into towns such as Kulin and Lake Grace. The meeting poses an opportunity to share ideas as well as focus on strategic tourism initiatives within the region. In the past 6 months Roe Tourism has engaged a communications coordinator to revamp the external electronic media communications. This has entailed a more focused directive on social media posts that showcase the great tourism aspects of the region. Moving forward the group is in the process of engaging a professional photographer to capture images that will be used in future Roe Tourism promotion.

Whilst on the tourism and community hospitality front, Kulin has a few significant events coming up in the coming months. This includes the Great Southern Colts Carnival on the weekend of 11th – 13th June and then GenAg on Tuesday 27th July. Two great community lead events with plenty of volunteers that also bring people from far and wide to town and showcases all our community has to offer. I know Don Bradford and Tom Murphy are hard at work coordinating the logistics of both these events.

Winter sports season is also in full swing. Some significant events hosted in Kulin already further showcasing our wonderful facilities and the volunteering efforts of local club members. Great to see the oval in top condition and handling the recent wet weather. Unfortunately, the rough and tumble of winter sports often produces a few casualties and injuries along the way. A big shout out to our FRC Manager Ruth Tyson who unfortunately sustained a severe injury in hockey the other week requiring surgery and significant rehabilitation. ## ROADWORKS UPDATE

We have been able to bitumise CBH Access Road and Jilakin Street over the past couple of weeks. Line marking will be done on Thursday 20th and Friday 21st of May.

The intersection at the end of Jilakin Street and Lake Grace Road will remain as is until after winter, when we will be back into construction on the Lake Grace Rd. This will also include upgrades to the CBH Access Road intersection at the swimming pool.

We have also been tidying up the intersection of Rabbit Proof Fence Road and Muller Road with gravel being carted and formed up. This will remain gravel over winter with signage in place, and will be completed after winter grading.

The trucks will continue gravel sheeting over winter where and when possible. Winter grading will begin from the week of the 24th of May, with the forecast of a small amount of rain due.

## Contact Registers in Shire facilities

From 5 December 2020, Shire of Kulin is required to maintain mandatory contact registers for WA Health Department COVID-19 contact tracing.

Individuals can either scan the SafeWA QR Code or manually sign in at each venue.

The following venues/buildings will have contact registers:

- o Kulin Aquatic Centre and Waterslide
- o Freebairn Recreation Centre
- o Freebairn Recreation Centre Gym
- o Kulin Memorial Hall
- o Kulin Public Library (located at Kulin Post Office)

The WA Government has developed a free app, SafeWA, which is a digital contact register system. The SafeWA app can be downloaded from Apple App Store or Google Play. The app is not mandatory, and an alternative paper based system is also available.

-Failing to comply to the new requirements could result in fines and penalties of up to \$50,000 for an INDIVIDUAL and \$250,000 FOR A BODY CORPORATE or 12 months imprisonment.

- Any person aged 16 years and over who attends the facility, including patrons, staff, volunteers and contractors will be required to register their contact details. Records are not required to be collected for children under 16 years.

## AUSTRALIA REMINDED TO CLAIM COVID-19 WORKING FROM HOME TAX DEDUCTION

Moore Australia today reminds individuals in Australia to keep a diligent log of the hours they worked from home during the recent COVID-19 lockdown. This will help them claim their allowable tax deductions when it becomes time to submit their tax return.

After WA was plunged into another lockdown during the recent long weekend, it has become apparent how agile the Australian workforce has become. To support employees who work from home either during COVID or regularly, the ATO entitles them to claim tax deductions

for expenses incurred. To simplify the process of claiming home office expenses, the ATO introduced a shortcut method which applies for the 2020-21 financial year due to the impacts of COVID-19. Individuals can claim a fixed rate of \$0.80 per hour worked from home. The shortcut method covers expenses such as phone expenses, internet expenses, depreciation on furniture & equipment and electricity and gas.

David Tomasi, Chairman of Moore Australia commented: "To their credit, ATO has significantly simplified the process of claiming tax deductions related to working from home. Although Australia has fared well throughout COVID, our working patterns

have changed in step with the rest of the world, as expected. It is important that Australians are aware of their entitlements under the 'new normal.'"

To claim home office deductions using the shortcut method, individuals need to keep a record of actual hours worked at home. The shortcut method is not compulsory, and individuals can still claim based on actual expenses incurred, however, they would then have to comply with the necessary, and more complex, record keeping requirements.

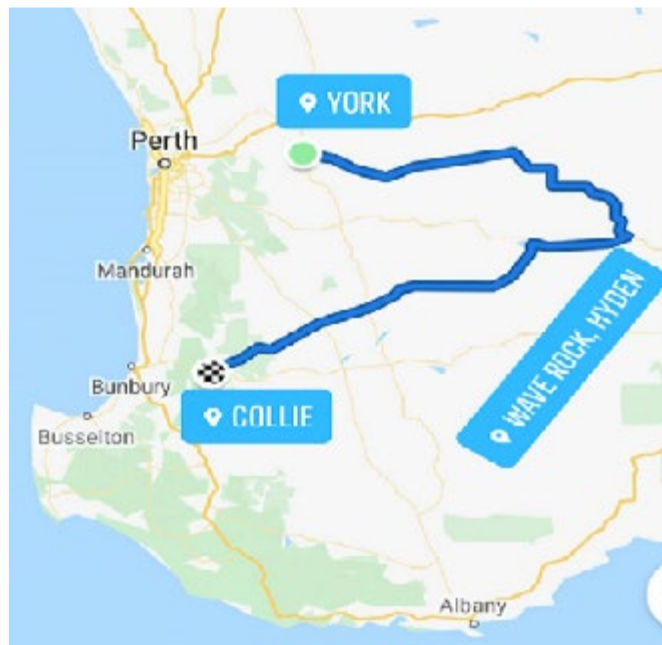
