Welcome back to another CEO corner for 2021 and the end of the 2020/21 Financial Year. The past fortnight the Kulin Shire and its communities have experienced an array of mixed emotions. Continued frequent rainfall events, combined with chilly mornings, continue to provide farmers with ever growing optimism for a bumper season, as a good old fashioned winter sets in. Farming is the lifeblood of our community and local economy and the start to this season is one that hasn't been experienced for many a year and let us hope this continues. Whilst farming is the lifeblood of our community it is the people which really make our communities. It is with great sadness, reflection and celebration that we acknowledge the loss of 2 community stalwarts over the past 2 weeks.

Mr Gary Strother from Holt Rock was the Shire's Chief Bush Fire Control Officer for many years. He was an instrumental part of the Holt Rock community, and he will be sorely missed. Many will know Gary's lasting legacy to be the Holt Rock Hoedown, a local country music event hosted by the Strothers that attracted many a country camper and musician from far and wide. Its reputation as an outstanding local community event across the region is unsurpassed. I believe a fitting celebration of Gary's life was undertaken at Hoedown HQ last Friday. Our thoughts are with Gary's family on their recent and sudden loss.

Mr Greg Hadlow, Freeman of Kulin Shire, was a larger than life, gregarious character who touched so

many within the community during his 17 years as Shire CEO in Kulin. His legacy is one of innovation, progress and community spirit, which combined with key local identities, helped mould Kulin into the fantastic community it is today. Greg left his mark on Kulin like no other CEO has, or probably ever will and his classic phrase remains etched in the Council kitchen "There is nowhere in Kulin like the Wheatbelt". In recent times Greg suffered ill health, which he took on in typical Greg fashion, playing golf, catching up with his mates and living life to the fullest right to the end. He was revered in local government across the state. Our thoughts are with Greg's family on their recent loss.

Last Saturday saw Kulin's first combined winter sports day for the season, with netball, hockey and football all playing at home. However, the day was not about the sport, but about community spirit, as the town bonded together to raise funds for the Mark Hughes Foundation and brain cancer in support of Kulin local Teneille Crook. And didn't Kulin do this in typical Kulin fashion, with Allison Lucchesi being the main driver behind the event. Beanies were sold, raffles held and a mega auction took place with over \$20,000 being raised. How good was it to see so many MHF beanies being worn around the grounds on Saturday as a show of support and solidarity for Teneille, Lachy and family. A huge shout out to Minnie for bringing everything together in what turned out to be a fantastic community event. This week at the Shire we farewell a

number of staff. Ryan Brandis who was our Building Maintenance Officer has moved on from the Shire to try his luck locally at establishing his own business. We wish Ryan all the best in his new endeavours. Nicole Poletti our Trainee Finance Officer is also moving on to bigger and better things with the Town of Mosman Park. We wish her well also. These are both local Kulin people who the Shire are proud to have employed over the course of their careers.

This week also sees our Finance team finalising the End of Financial Year figures for 2020-21 and putting the finishing touches on the budget for 2021-22. Next year we look to be again having an injection of COVID stimulus money to assist with key community projects. The Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program rounds 2 and 3 will see another \$1.5M of projects delivered in the next 18 months. 21/22 also sees Judd and his crew embark on one of our biggest road construction programs ever with the WSNF funding of \$2M towards Fence Road upgrade south of Dudinin.

Next week sees school holidays, hopefully COVID and the latest lockdowns do not affect Kulin too much. At this stage we will await the advice of the State government and act accordingly.

As always plenty happening in Kulin, until next time safe travels.

Greg commenced in Local Government in Quairading 1975 as a junior office assistant, gaining promotion within local government authorities in Mt Marshall, Boyup Brook and Dowerin before commencing as Shire Clerk in Westonia in 1987. His career continued solely in the industry

Greg gave 41 years of dedicated service to the Local Government Sector. He was an outstanding leader not just in Kulin, but in the region.

In recognition of the outstanding contribution Greg made to the progress and development of the Kulin Region, Kulin Shire Council bestowed upon him the title of Honorary Freeman of the Municipality of Kulin in 2016.

Greg tendered outstanding and dedicated service to the Shire of Kulin and community as Chief Executive Officer for 17 years. During these periods of his service, Greg enthusiastically and completely undertook to advance the Kulin community through the provision of infrastructure and services to ensure the Shire of Kulin remains a proactive and progressive community. His legacy to Kulin will be the contributions he made over and above his role as Chief Executive Officer and the passion he undertook projects like the establishment of the community banking (Bendigo Bank) and the Camp Kulin program. Other initiatives include - Kulin Health Centre, Joint Emergency Services Building, Kulin Waterslide, Freebairn Recreation Centre, Aquatic Centre upgrade, Kulin Bush Races House, Development of Tin Horse Highway, Lease for Life Homes, Visitor Discovery Zone, New caravan park and RV Friendly and the extension of Kulinda Village.

During his tenure as Chief Executive Officer with Shire of Kulin, Greg had an unwavering conviction in Kulin as a proactive town that will not only sustain itself into the future, but, due to the 'can do' attitude, the community will continue to thrive. The success of the Shire of Kulin is due to the consistent performance of Greg in his role as CEO, and as an active community member. Greg's style of management was a mix of authoritative (visionary) and democratic. EUOLOGY NEIL MORRISON STONE



On 28 November 1932, Neil Morrison Stone was born in the Kondinin District Hospital. He was the 3rd child to Ernest William and Mary Elizabeth Stone, his oldest brother being Colin William and Sister Delys Jean.

In January 1933, when Neil was 2 months old, his father was tragically killed whilst clearing trees with his open cab bulldozer. In time, Mary re-married their farm worker, Frank Pope. When Neil was a teenager Mary and Frank adopted a son, Ronald.

Neil grew up on the family farm and attended the East Kulin School, which was 5 miles from the family homestead. Many teachers boarded with the family, and travelled to school via horse and sulky, Madam being Neil's favourite horse.

When East Kulin School closed, Neil then rode his bicycle to the gate and caught the school bus to Kulin School, where he attended until he was 14. One memory he had of these days was when the creeks flooded, so this resulted in a good holiday for 2 months. He returned just in time to attend the interschool sports, which was very important to him.

The family did not read much but spent evenings sitting around the open fire and talking about the day's events. The battery wireless was a treat, which they listened to stories for about 2 ½ hours.

Neil's Mother Mary had no car. He remembers they would wait at the top gate for the neighbours to take them to town once a week to get stores. His highlight of this trip was the sixpence each child received which would go to buying their own selection of lollies. As Neil loved lollies, he deliberated on the best selection to be value for money. On these trips, Neil loved watching the local blacksmith preparing horseshoes.

Neil had the job of collecting firewood for his mother after school. But his positive approach was, "well that was easy, as trees surrounded the homestead and I didn't have far to go for it". By the age of 10, another chore was added to his list, milking the cow before school each morning.

Neil used to make his own fun. He would build toys from all sorts of thing. An old tin with string attached and filled with stones would give hours of fun to pull along. Two tins with long string attached to each were made into stilts. But gee, it was a challenge to walk on them! As he grew older, a homemade shanghai (ging) was the go, stones as the ammunition this was a great weapon for shooting birds. Chasing and trapping wild ducks in a wire trap filled in many

hours. Many days were spent building cubby houses with his older sister Delys. Loving sports, even a tennis ball was fun. He remembered Meccano sets, cards, drafts, table tennis, cricket, football, running, practicing high jump, all of which he was very good at. He recalled making model miniature farms and how they were a lot more fun than the real farm!!

As Neil got a little older, he was sometimes allowed to accompany his older brother, Colin, trapping rabbits for their skins, as well as snaring kangaroos for their pelts to sell, but this proved to be non-profitable. The boys would sometimes eat rabbit cooked on hot coals from burning tree logs which were lit for clearing that day.

His much younger brother Ron has fond memories of Neil teaching him many sports along with how to shear.

As a teenager in Kulin, Neil enjoyed gymnasium, badminton, tennis, football and the highlight of a fortnightly picture show. At the age of fifteen, he played in the men's football team. He regularly reminisced about attending dances in the halls where the floors were waxed and sprinkled with cornflakes to make them slippery, but the HUGE highlight was the super supper consisting of tables laden with delicious cream cakes.

Neil worked for around 4 years, recalling his wages were 2 pounds per week, with board taking half! Working in RA Fisher's shop, Neil sold Holden cars, Big E Harvester's, Tobacco and cigarettes & Mobil Oil and more. He recalled smoking a cigar once, but never did it again!! There, Neil proudly told the story of working as a barber, cutting hair – mainly for men, and occasionally for women. The story goes that the first time a lady came in for a haircut, old Mrs Andrews, and asked for a haircut, Neil was a little bemused and a bit worried about how to approach cutting her hair as he had NEVER cut a lady's hair before. However, when the job was done, he got the tick of approval from Mrs Andrews, as she came back for more haircuts asking for Neil.

Neil often recalled stories of the time he was in NASHO'S (National Servicemen's Association of Australia), shining his shoes, ironing his shirts, polishing his gun, marching upright He was proud to carry the NASHO Banner to the ANZAC Service which he attended annually.

Neil worked on his mother and Frank's farm for about 6 years, until he married his childhood sweetheart, Billie Wilson. Neil first met Billie on the Kulin School bus when he was 13. They married on 2nd October 1957. Moving to Wychitella Farm near Jilakin Rock which belonged to Billie's Father, Tom Wilson, Neil began share farming prior to purchasing the property.

Neil and Billie had two children, Gary and Shirley. Neil cleverly added extensions to the old farmhouse to accommodate his growing family with the help of his father-in-law. They worked the farm and looked forward to annual holidays at Albany and Denmark. These holidays cemented a strong bond with Gary's best mate Grant Hartfield, now known as their extra son.

Ill health sadly brought the end to his farming life. This saw a move into Kulin. After a couple of years share farming, it was decided selling the farm was the best option. After spending 10 years in Kulin, the ocean, fishing and cooler weather called Neil & Billie to Albany in 1987. Neil played social bowls and was a pennant player for Emu Point Bowling Club. With retirement he was able to enjoy his passion of fishing, heading north for holidays, tinkering in his workshop making and fixing things which he was very clever at.

Neil & Billie moved back to Kulin close to family, where Neil enjoyed playing bowls with his Kulin friends once again, for as long as he could.

A decision was made in later life that Neil needed more care, so they moved out to live at Shirley & Mathew's Farm where it was familiar. Wide-open spaces and looking at the sheep and lambs walking close by gave him great happiness.

Returning to the farm completed the full circle. What a legacy, what a life!

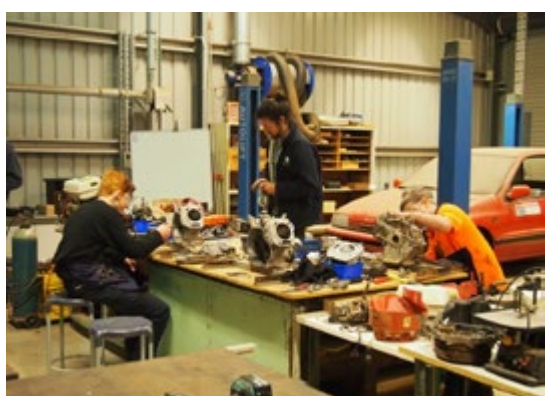
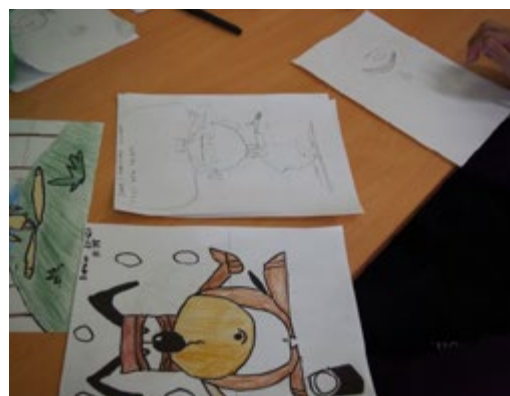
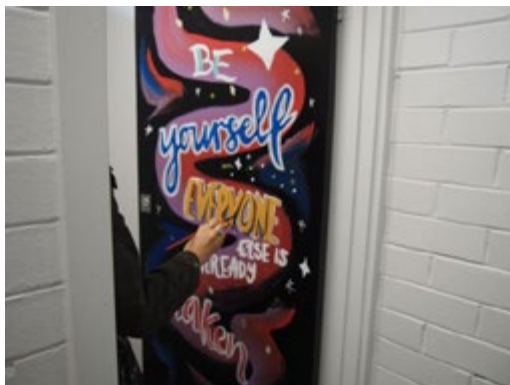

BANK CLOSURES A FAILURE TO SUPPORT REGIONAL COMMUNITIES

29 June 2021

Nationals Wheatbelt MPs have expressed disappointment at the National Australia Bank (NAB)'s decision to close up shop in Wyalkatchem, Three Springs, Kondinin and Wagin.

Local Member for Central Wheatbelt Mia Davies said the announcement was a blow to the communities who relied on bank presence for their financial services, including household, business, and personal transactions.

"During a time of uncertainty, with a pandemic, significant weather events, and growing housing and health crises, this news adds insult to injury to regional West Australians," Ms Davies said.

Ms Davies said decisions like this were out of step with community expectations.

"NAB's decision based on decline in foot-traffic through the affected branches shows an organisation unable to adapt to changing circumstances such as a global pandemic and a callous approach to supporting communities during a time of need," Ms Davies said.

"In the wake of the Royal Commission into the banking sector which included investigation into the culture and governance of banks and financial institutions, you'd think there'd be thought given to more than the bottom line for services like this.

"I know they're not the only major bank to withdraw services from small country communities, but it's a bit rich to suggest they're making the decision off a decline in foot traffic in branches over the past 12 months."

Member for Moore Shane Love said the news was a huge blow to the community especially after parts of the Midwest and Wheatbelt were continuing to deal with the aftermath of Cyclone Seroja.

"There are many areas, people, homes and businesses that were badly affected by the cyclone – it is well-known the widespread rebuilding effort could take years," Mr Love said.

Mr Love said it was an ideal time for banks to be on the ground providing much-needed support for those experiencing devastating losses and a lack of State Government assistance.

"Banks need to have a presence in these communities to understand their situation, and instead of closing doors based on algorithms, these organisations should work humanely and lend a helping hand wherever needed."

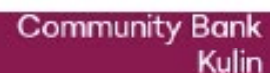
