CEO CORNER

Welcome back to another CEO corner for 2021 and the start of the 2021/22 Financial Year. Many of you will have noticed that July's Ordinary Council Meeting has been pushed back a week to Wednesday, 28th July to allow staff to cover off 20/21 Financial Year administration and finalise the 21/22 Council Budget. As indicated previously, this year we look to be again having an injection of COVID stimulus money to assist with key community projects. The Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program rounds 2 and 3 will see another \$1.5M of projects delivered in the next 18 months. 21/22 also sees Judd and his crew embark on one of our biggest road construction programs ever with the WSFN funding of \$2M towards Fence Road upgrade south of Dudinin.

A couple of major projects will be commencing in the next month.

The All Ages Precinct will commence in late July with completion hopefully by early October. This will take place near the VDZ between the Stage Area and the Railway line. During construction temporary fencing will be installed

and access to the area will be restricted.

FRC court replacement will take place during the window between Netball and Basketball seasons from around 23rd August to 10th October.

Winter seems to be reintroducing itself with the Wheatbelt. What a wet few months it has been. It seems like every couple of days the crops get another drenching with 10-20mm. Water now seems to be running off into dams and plenty of feed around for stock. Hopefully the season continues in such good vein.

COVID still poses an issue around the country. Obviously, Perth metro area went into lockdown for a few days the other week and extended restrictions for the best part of 7 days. Over east there continues to be a huge impact in NSW and potentially again in Victoria. Council and staff will continue to monitor the situation and provide information as required. Hopefully the latest jolt will prompt a more far-reaching vaccine rollout across the country, although we are somewhat fortunate that we haven't had as many cases or challenges as other

countries around the globe. The unfortunate timing of the latest challenges again coinciding with school holidays has probably been the bigger frustration for everyone, however we can only deal with the situation presented to us by the Premier and follow the rules as required.

We have been notified that over the next couple of weeks Western Power will be doing a significant amount of works around Kulin townsite. This will affect Shire run premises as well as local businesses. Hopefully not to much disruption around the place, but there will be traffic management in place so please be vigilant when driving near such works.

COVID saw WACFL call off the Country Week Football Championship which was no doubt disappointing to those prospective players. Fortunately, HockeyWA were still able to host the Junior Country Week event last week with the Roe District Hockey Association winning both a Junior Boys and Junior Girls Division. Well done to the local players and coaches involved in this.

As always plenty happening in Kulin. Until next time safe travels.

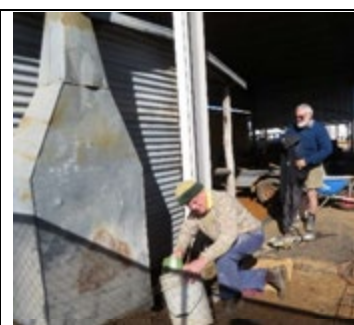

Visitors are intrigued by the lollipop spark-arrester. **Please tell us your memories of any Vickers tractors or their incredible range of products they engineered.** Vickers began in Sheffield, UK, in 1828 as a steel foundry making castings; their church bells are still sought after. Their innovative engineers ventured into all areas, railways, shipbuilding, aircraft,

Wolseley cars, rifles, guns, tanks, torpedoes, bulldozers and tractors in 1925 but competition and rubber tyres in 1935 saw the demise of these bone-rattlers. The company closed in 1999.




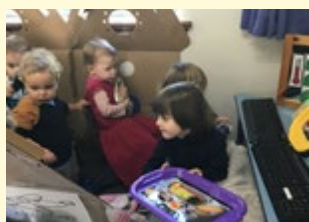
Dinosaurs is always a fun topic to discuss with the children as we all try to pronounce the names and debate our favourite dinosaurs and why.

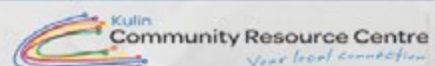

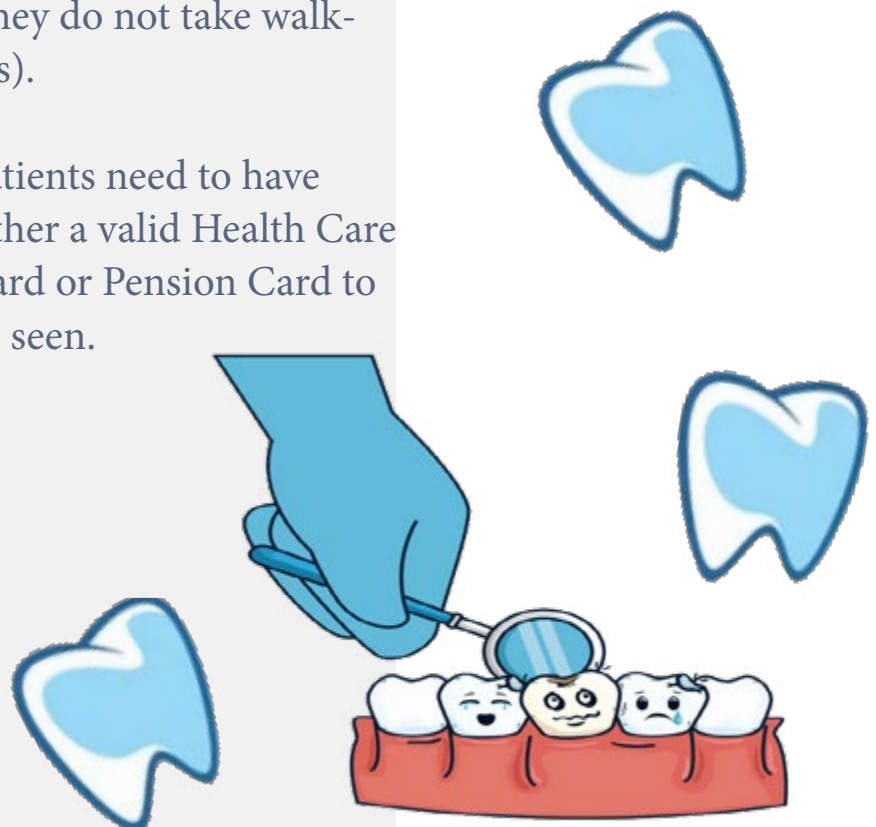

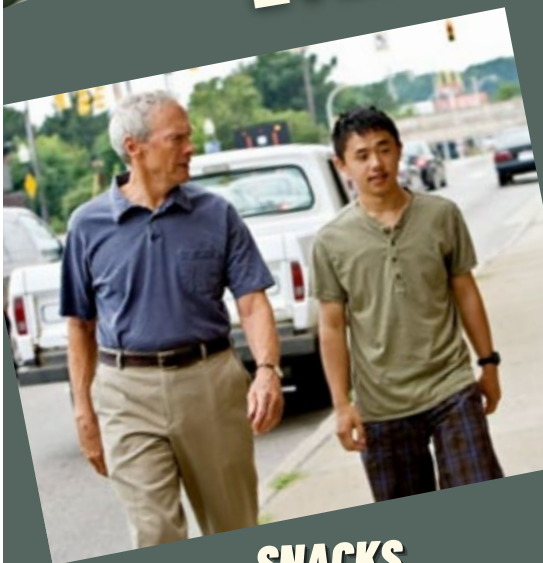
