Council Decisions

February 2020

PINGARING COMMUNITY DAM PROJECT – the purchase of 23.03 acres of Location 2075 Pingaring-Varley Road, Pingaring was authorised for the purpose of establishing the Pingaring Dam project.

WHEATBELT ROCKIES – Council agreed to a request from the Wheatbelt Rockies to waive the costs (excluding kitchen hire) associated with the 2020 South Central Senior Games being held at the Freebairn Recreation Centre on 24 March 2020.

BORE INVESTIGATION DRILLINGS – a budget amendment of \$20,000 was approved for the installation of two bores at sites in Pingaring and Kulin.

PRIME MOVER CHANGEOVER – Council awarded the Request for Tender Prime Mover to Truck Centre for the purchase of a Mack Granite Prime Mover. A 2013 Isuzu and 2014 Hino will both be traded to Truck Centre.

CHANGE OF SPEED LIMIT SIGNAGE – an application to Main Roads WA to revise the location of speed limit signs on the Williams-Kondinin Road on the southern edge of town was approved.

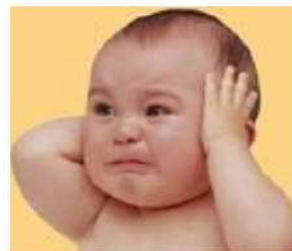

LGBTI survey for the Wheatbelt

The LGBTI Community Care group, based in Northam, is conducting one of the first and most detailed surveys of LGBTIQA+ people in the Wheatbelt.

The group has secured funding through AVIVO to create a snapshot of the LGBTIQA+ community that exists within the Wheatbelt. In doing so they are hoping to establish what needs are currently not being met from their local community.

The aim of LGBTI Community Care is to support and to be an advocate for LGBTIQA+ people within the Wheatbelt through acceptance and acknowledgment. They strive to achieve social change through knowledge, understanding, empathy, respect and support.

In the future LGBTI Community Care wish to work within the Wheatbelt region raising awareness of the needs of LGBTIQA+ people and provide a range of resources, support and services including advocacy.

Very little research has been conducted previously in this region, so the participation in the survey will provide inaugural data that will help identify areas where extra support can be provided.

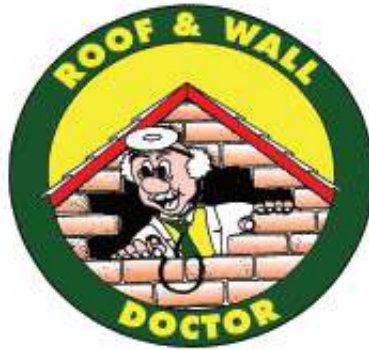
