

Happy New Year and welcome back to the first CEO corner for 2020... Well, for January it's the Acting CEO corner while Garrick is away sunning himself on the shores of Thailand!

The Shire's extended workforce is back at it after a two week break over the Christmas and New Year period. A big thank you to the few staff who worked during the break to keep things afloat; to Jay and Jonathon who worked between the public holidays to keep the gardens watered and the town looking beautiful and to Trish who worked every day looking after our patrons at the caravan park. Kulin is a sleepy little town during January and it seems many of our residents take off on their much deserved annual holidays. The Shire office is much the same with many of the staff taking their annual leave during the month. I hope you all are able to relax and enjoy some time with your loved ones.

Camp Kulin delivered the first of the scaled back version of summer camps between the 6th and 10th of January. Well done to Amy for taking on the Acting Manager's role; from all accounts the camps went very well. A big thanks to Cathy for her supportive role, to Ash Buttigig who took on the kitchen duties for the week and to all of the other volunteers who took time out to help run the camps. The camps could not have gone ahead without your help. The second and final camp of the summer will take place between the 20th and 24th of January, we wish you well for the challenge ahead.

While the Freebairn Recreation Centre is quiet during January we are busy fitting the windows within court area with shutters. The installation is taking place as I write and is expected to take the best part of this week. The shutters are being installed to help us control the temperature more easily during periods of extreme heat and cold. Also at the Rec the gym refurbishment was completed late in 2019. During the refurbishment the existing floor was removed then repoured and relevelled before new floor coverings and gym equipment were installed. I'm not sure if it is the allure of new equipment or the 'New Year, New Me' sentiment but there has been an influx of new users at the facility. Whatever the case may be it is great to see people using the centre.

Judd and the outdoor crew are busy trying to knock off a few capital works jobs over the next couple of weeks. You may have noticed some kerbing which has been removed from the road verges on Price Street; this is in preparation for the installation of a new footpath along the east side of the street. The kerb will also be realigned to bring the road back to a common width. Construction has begun on the Dudinin Jitarning road which we expect to reseal once the construction is completed. Main Roads have contracted the Shire to replace two culverts, one 3km east of Kulin on the Lake Grace Road and the other on Johnston Street in town. Expect some traffic interruptions and possible road closures for the culvert replacement in town during the first week of February as well as on the Dudinin Jitarning Road between now and February when the work is completed.

After being awarded a grant of \$100,000 to build a dam in Pingaring from the Department of Water the Shire expects to start test drilling in the next week. The dam being built is expected to be 70m x 70m and hold 25,000m³ of water. It will go a way towards further drought proofing our shire, if we continue having years as dry as the last we will certainly need all the water we can get.

As you are probably aware, our publican Megan Anderson, would like to move on to the next phase in her life and the hotel lease is available.

Over the last few years, neighbouring towns have had their hotels purchased by foreign investors. This is their right, but it has negatively changed the dynamics of those hotels. It has had a negative impact on the services provided and we have had people from those towns now dining at the Kulin Hotel.

Megan has kindly given our community the first chance to purchase the option of her lease. This will allow us to control and preserve our own hotel as we wish it to be.

It would be ideal to raise \$220,000.00 which is a large amount, especially coming off an extremely tight year. We have had commitment pledges of \$150,000.00 from 11 people at this stage.

The Kulin Hotel is an important asset to our community, a social meeting place, excellent food and accommodation for the travelling public. Also, with the caravan travellers increasingly using Kulin as a stop over point, Acres of Taste and the Kulin Hotel are essential establishments.

Substantial information has been sourced to this stage, far too much to provide by email, but we would appreciate your support to whatever level you may be comfortable with.

MEMBERSHIP PRIVILEGES

FULL MEMBERS

All members of a Kulin sporting club (hockey, netball, football, basketball, tennis, etc) **MUST** join as full adult members of the centre. Additionally, individuals wishing to use the centre gym facilities must also become a member. Full and financial members of the Freebairn Recreation Centre are entitled to the following privileges:

- Voting rights and the right to hold any Centre office.
- Use of all sporting facilities in un-programmed times and under management rules.
- Full use of social facilities including the bar area
- Entitled to a membership discount for hire and programming

SOCAL MEMBERS

If you do not play sport for a Kulin club but enjoy drinking, eating and socialising at the Freebairn Recreation Centre you are required to be a social member of the Centre. Social members of the Freebairn Recreation Centre are entitled to the following privileges:

- Use of social facilities of the Centre including the bar area.

Social members are **NOT** entitled to hold any office of the Centre nor be present or vote at any meeting of the Centre.

A social member is **NOT** entitled to use of the any sporting facilities including gymnasium
A social member is **NOT** entitled to a membership discount for hire or programming.

JUNIOR MEMBERS

If your child is 13+ and doing Physical Education at school, or playing sport for a Kulin club (hockey, netball, football, basketball, tennis, etc) they must be members of the Freebairn Recreation Centre. A junior member of the Freebairn Recreation Centre is a person between thirteen to eighteen years and are entitled to the following privileges:

- Full use of all sporting facilities in un-programmed times and under management rules.
- Full use of social facilities including the bar area subject to Liquor Licensing Rules.

Junior members are **NOT** entitled to hold any office of the Centre nor be present or vote at any meeting of the Centre.

Junior members will need to become full members of the Centre on obtaining the age of eighteen years.

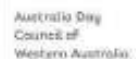
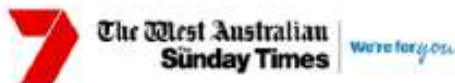

How often do you take the time to check yourself, your family?

“Remember skin cancers are not usually painful.”

If you can answer 'yes to two or more of the following questions you may be at risk of developing 'Skin Cancer'.

- A mole or freckle that is changing size or colour
- Fair skin that burns rather than tans
- Had blistering sun burn as a child
- Any inflamed sores that do not heal
- A family member has had a malignant melanoma
- Previously had moles or skin cancers removed
- Five moles (not freckles) on your arms

SKIN CANCER SCREENING Kulin Lions Club

If you can answer

‘YES’ to three (3) of the following you may be at risk.

- A family member who has had a malignant melanoma. (Mother, Brother, Sister or Grandparents)
- Five or more moles (not freckles) on your forearms.
- Previously had moles removed that were not cancers
- Previously had skin cancer.
- A mole or freckle, which is changing, size, colour or shape
- Fair skin that always burns rather than tans
- Had blistering sunburn as a child enough to stay off school
- Any inflamed skin sores that do not heal

Messages for volunteer fire fighters and fire brigades

What to do in an emergency...

When a bushfire event starts and before you hook into the water supply system, **call us on 13 13 75** (24 hours a day/7 days a week).

If we know where your crews are headed, we might be able to provide you with a better location where you can maintain pressure for longer OR we might be able to do something to our water supply system which will mean that we can keep it running for a fraction longer.

HOWEVER, there is no guarantee that we can prolong supply or pressure, and experience has shown that once the town is threatened and there is mass demand, the supply will lose pressure and may empty.

Hydrants

Location – if you are unsure where your hydrants are located, please contact DFES or our Operations Centre on 13 13 75 who will provide you with the exact geographical locations.

Testing - If you intend to test hydrants in your area, please let us know first. Often a side-effect of using the hydrants is that nearby residences receive discoloured water.

If we're aware of the exercise beforehand, we can ensure our operators are prepared and ready to respond to any complaints.

Broken hydrants

Please note – any issues with hydrants should be reported up through DFES.

DFES will contact Water Corporation and a work order will be actioned immediately.

Reminder to residents in your Shire

Help us spread the word to people that they cannot rely on mains water in a bush fire when other critical infrastructure such as power has been damaged.

TOTAL FIRE BAN

A Total Fire Ban is declared on a day when a fire is most likely to catch and spread rapidly or if there are already widespread fires.

If you ignore a Total Fire Ban, you may receive an infringement up to \$2,500.00 with possible jailed time.

WHAT YOU CAN AND CAN'T DO

BARBECUING/COOKING OUTDOORS

You can NOT use any BBQ or cooker (including Webers) that requires solid fuel:

- Wood
- Charcoal
- Heat beads

You CAN use a gas or electrical BBQ or cooker if:

- It's a permanent BBQ in a public space
- It's in your home
- It has an enclosed flame
- You clear all material that could burn within a 5m radius around it

LOOKING AFTER YOUR FARM

If you're a farmer, you CAN:

- Harvest your crop
- Feed or water your stock in a paddock
- Operate or move an airplane or helicopter

If you conduct any of the above activities, you must ensure:

- Your vehicle is mechanically sound
- The exhaust system is in good condition
- All reasonable precautions have been taken to prevent bushfire starting

During a total Fire Ban AND a Harvest and Movement Ban in place, you can NOT use a vehicle, equipment or machinery that is powered by an internal combustion engine on land covered by bush, crop, pasture or stubble.

ANYONE WHO LIVES IN WA

In open-air, you can NOT:

- Light, maintain or use a fire (even when camping)
- Burn leaves, garden waste or grass cutting
- Use an incinerator
- Grind, weld, solder, gas cut or use any other type of 'hot work'
- Use fireworks
- Operate a hot-air balloon
- Use an outdoor wood-fired pizza oven or stove

In any area where there is bush, crops, pasture, or stubble, you can NOT use equipment powered by an internal combustion engine, such as:

- A chainsaw or lawnmower
- A plant or grass trimmer
- Bobcats, excavators, bulldozers or other similar machinery
- A welder
- A car
- A tractor
- A motorbike or quad bike
- An angle grinder
- A dune buggy
- A generator

You CAN undertake these activities inside your shed ONLY IF it is fully enclosed on all sides.

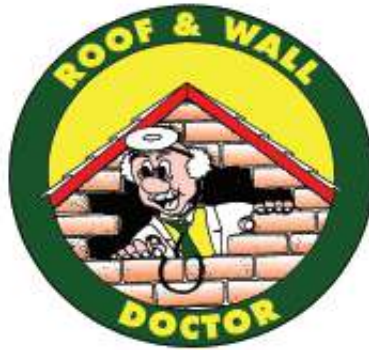
