Federal Economic Stimulus to get Kulin moving

Last week the Federal Government announced the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program. The Shire of Kulin was fortunate enough to be allocated \$571,720 of this funding for the 2020/21 financial year. This funding is allocated to communities to improve and develop infrastructure within our community.

In January 2020, the Australian Government announced Shire of Kulin would be eligible to apply for up to \$500,000 under the Drought Communities Programme Extension. This program is for councils experiencing hardship due to the drought. The programme is to fund local infrastructure initiatives.

Both these programs will provide an economic stimulus for the Shire of Kulin and enable us to improve and develop infrastructure within our community.

Shire staff will undertake community consultation to ascertain the communities projects and priorities. The Shire of Kulin Corporate Business Plan and Strategic Community Plan will provide direction also. Community consultation will form part of our Corporate and Community planning in 2021.

In light of the recent drought conditions and COVID-19, these funding programs are a great opportunity for Shire of Kulin to undertake significant projects that will have long term benefits to our community.

Shire staff and Council look forward to working with the community.

For now, we are endeavouring to adhere to all of the guidelines in place for each sport and from an FRC perspective we are looking forward to welcoming a bit more activity here over the coming month and beyond.

On a different front, Madi and I have been concentrating on getting the Centre ship shape and ready to go if and when that time comes and have been spending some quality time together cleaning and creating inventories! I'm sure Madi is counting down the days until her time with the Shire is over!! However, it has been a productive time albeit on a different front and I cannot thank Madi and Wout enough for the work they have put in during their time here.

We will continue to offer our takeaway alcohol sales on a Friday and Sunday as we have over the past 2 months.

Return to training checklist

- TRAINING GROUPS OF NO MORE THAN 20 - The club can undertake training in team groups no larger than 20 people. This includes both players & coaches.
- STRICTLY NO CONTACT - The club must advise its participants, coaches, volunteers and parents that all training must be strictly NON-CONTACT (i.e. No Tackling, No Bumping, No Marking Contests, etc)
- 1.5m SOCIAL DISTANCING - The club must advise its participants, coaches, volunteers and parents that all training must strictly observe social distancing requirements of 1.5m, and adhere to the requirement of no more than 1 participant per 4sqm.
- NO ACCESS TO CHANGEROOMS - The club is aware that all club rooms, changerooms and wet areas are NOT to be used as part of the Return to Training.
- BALLS ALLOWED, BUT NO OTHER SHARED EQUIPMENT - The Club is aware that shared balls can be used for small group training, however no additional equipment is permitted, and also understands the restrictions in place for small group training.
- CLUBS & TEAMS UNDERSTAND THE RETURN TO TRAINING PROTOCOLS - The club and all teams have read, understood and agree to adhere to the Guidelines for a Return to Training
- HYGIENE PROTOCOLS ARE IN PLACE - The club must implement good general hygiene protocols and educated players and support staff.
- A REGISTER OF PARTICIPANTS - The club must implement a log, or register, to keep a track of which participants are in attendance at all training sessions, and make this available upon request by the Shire of Kulin or health authorities.
- ONLINE EDUCATION COMPLETED - Coaches, Presidents & Club Committees must complete the online COVID-19 infection control training prior to commencing training. <https://www.health.gov.au/resources/apps-and-tools/covid-19-infection-control-training>
- LOCAL GOVERNMENT APPROVAL - The club has received approval from the Shire of Kulin to access the recreation facilities (ovals, courts, course, greens) for training, and understand that they must follow the direction and advice of Police, Local Government and the SSO at all times

KDHS School Board Sheep Fattening Project

On behalf of the KDHS Board, I would like to give you an update on the Sheep Fattening Project that the Board commenced in December 2019.

This project was to raise funds for our secondary students to attend a 'Belongingness Camp' that would be available at no cost to every secondary student.

A total of 288 sheep were purchased through West Coast Livestock and distributed in lots of 10 to 24 farming families in our community. The sheep were weighed on pickup and an average weight assigned. Each family agisted the sheep until April 10, at which time they were returned to be re weighed and shorn. A number were sold shortly there after and currently there are 150 being agisted until final sale in the near future. At this stage we are hoping to raise approximately \$15,000 for our school.

This is a tremendous effort and could not have been made possible without the contributions of many people. Thank you to every family that agisted them, as well as some special thanks as follows:

- Ty Toa, Vernon Hayden, Craig McInnes, Stephen Meikle and Josh Saunders for the shearing of the sheep at the Bowey shearing shed.
- Brad Miller and crew for shearing the sheep around Dudinin.
- John and Brian Bowey for the shearing shed and rousing
- Michael and Allison Lucchesi for the agistment of sheep until sale
- Peter Thompson from Tincurrin Transport for cartage
- Milne Feeds for donating 1 Tonne of pellets to assist final agistment
- West Coast Livestock for financing the purchase of the sheep

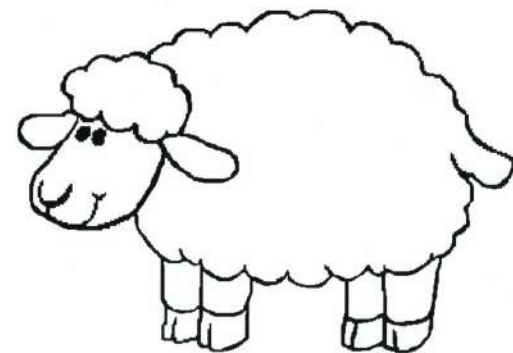
A huge thankyou to Barry Gangell, our Board member responsible for co-ordination of this project. With the evolving COVID-19 scenario, managing this project was not as straight forward as we would have liked, but the result was achieved in the end, so many thanks Barry.

And now to the results:

- We had 288 sheep distributed and 286 returned – fantastic effort
- The weight gain of the sheep varied from 26kg to 4kg per head
- Average weight gain of wool was 3kg per head

And the winners are:

- First: Jarron and Tracey Noble with an average gain of 26kg
Second: Brendan and Gab Savage with an average gain of 24kg
Third: Brian and Elle Bowey with an average gain of 22.5kg
Fourth: Mike and Kathy Wilson with an average gain of 18.5kg



Due to restrictions on camps for students, we are not able to organise the Belongingness Camp, but funds will be held over until such time as they can be utilised. We were also not able to hold our 'Weigh day' as a community function, but we hope to be able to continue this fundraiser in the future as part of our school and community calendar. We sincerely thank everyone for their participation.

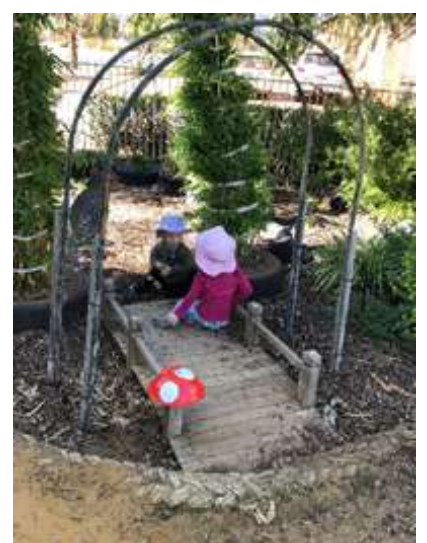
We have continued to focus on learning our numbers, shapes and colours. The children are like little sponges, naming colours and shapes all around the room and backyard.

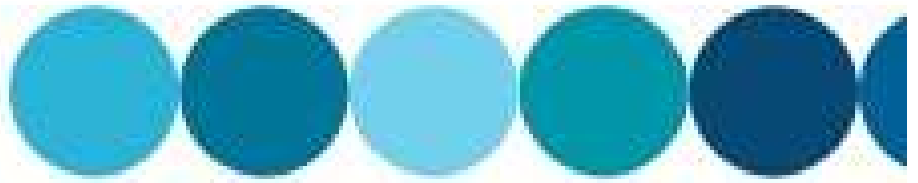

Malleefow

Did you know this amazing bird is losing its fight against feral predators and habitat loss. Did you know they are part of a group known as Megapodes – which means 'large foot' due to the strong legs they use to dig their nesting mound.



Black cockatoos

There are three species of black cockatoos in WA and they can all be found in the Wheatbelt. The iconic Carnabys cockatoo is known as the bringer of rain. This is probably related to their habit of returning to the Wheatbelt in winter to breed. Did you know they nest in tree hollows and only old eucalypts around 150 years old have the right type of hollows and restore it?

Wheatbelt Woodlands

The Wheatbelt Woodlands include some of our iconic eucalypt woodlands such as salmon gums, York gums and about 31 other species. We are working to protect patches of remnant bushland in good condition. Do you have your favourite woodland patch? Do you want to protect it and restore it?

Have you seen any of these special birds, or do you have a patch of woodland? Contact us to share your knowledge and help us protect our Wheatbelt wonders.

The WA Wheatbelt is home to a huge number of unique flora and fauna species. And Wheatbelt NRM is on the lookout for some of our most wanted. These species are considered threatened and we are working with community to ensure they don't go extinct.

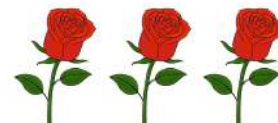

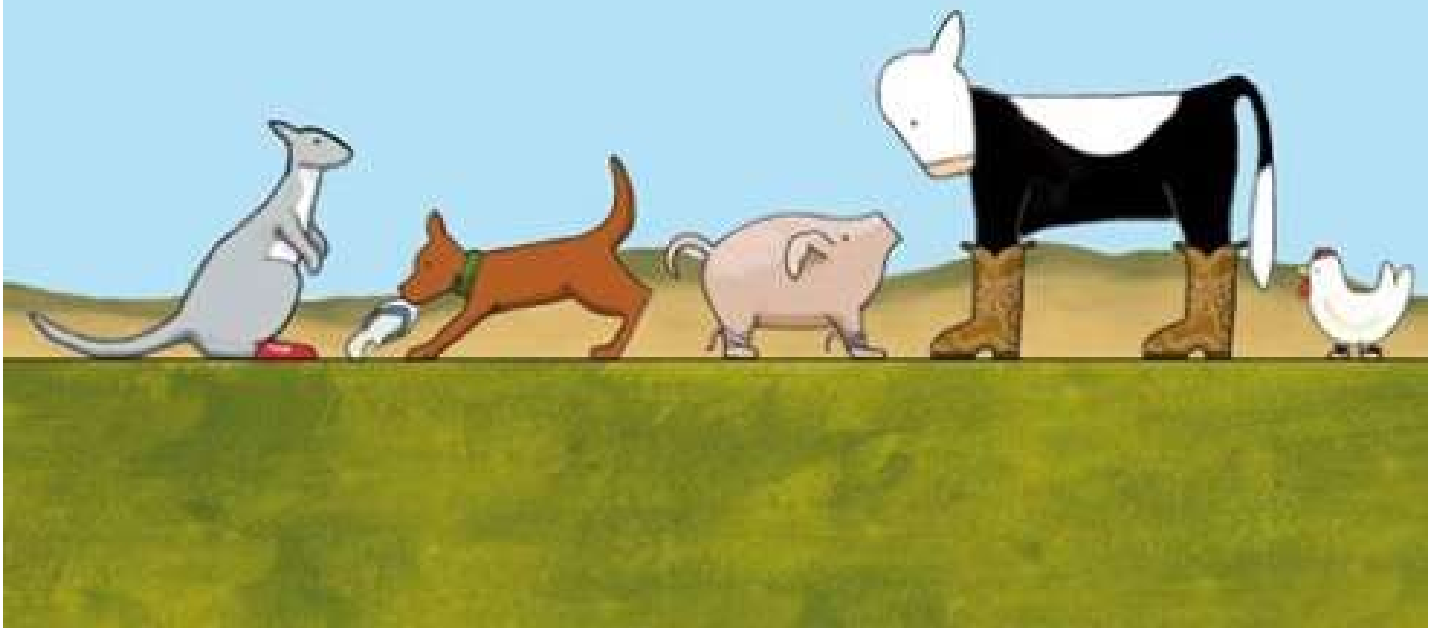
