Welcome back to our travelling research fellow – Tanya Dupagne Camp Kulin Manager. She has just returned from a 6 week study tour of the USA learning all about their summer camps, as well as fitting in a bit of sightseeing along the way. The photos she has showed the office look spectacular and no doubt all of Tanya's learnings will be enthusiastically put into practise. The Camp Kulin kitchen is nearing completion and will be up and running in time for the October camps.

Council is busy investigating the logistics and feasibility of the soon to be implemented Container Deposit Scheme. This is a significant state-wide initiative to compliment the existing recycling activities that already take place within local communities via the "kerbside recycling bin collection". Council is working with our neighbouring Shires via RoeROC to determine the most appropriate methods, within each town to implement this system. The three options for collection points are:

1. Refund Points - large scale operations relevant to metro and regional centres. EOI currently open and closes 27 September 2019;
2. Flexible Refund Point (FRP) '...to meet the requirements of smaller or fluctuating populations and could be provided on a part time, seasonal, mobile, or event based (pop-up) basis'. EOI currently open and closes 27 September 2019; and
3. Donation Points – allow public to donate their containers as a means of fundraising ie no refund given – opportunity for community/not for profit groups. Groups currently invited to register interest and is open ended

On the Works side of things the crew are currently working on 101 Gate Road. I must say I drove the hockey bus to Kukerin last week via some of our gravel roads, which are a credit to the works crew, considering the recent rainfall events the roads were in superb condition.

The 25th Kulin Bush Races is rapidly approaching. I hear the online ticket sales are almost sold out. Might be time to check out the form guide and see if you can pick a winner.

It poses to be a big month of high expectations for the Kulin community, but we wouldn't have it any other way in this great town.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS SATURDAY 19 OCTOBER 2019

CANDIDATE NOMINATION PACKAGE

The Shire of Kulin has nine (9) Councillors on four (4) year terms, with ordinary vacancies alternating every two (2) years.

To be eligible to nominate for Council you must be:

- 18 years or older; and
- An elector of the district

This year, new laws have been introduced which makes it compulsory for all candidates nominating in a local government election to complete an online induction.

You will be asked to declare that you have completed the online induction when filling out your nomination form. It is an offence to make false or misleading statements on the nomination form.

At the end of the online induction you will need to fill in your details to register your completion. Please make sure you press the registration button at the end or your completion will not be registered. You should receive an email confirming you have completed the induction. Please keep this for your records. The induction should take no longer than one hour to complete.

Nominations open on 5 September 2019 and close on 12 September 2019. The Shire of Kulin has five (5) vacancies all with four (4) year terms.

Untidy Blocks



With the advent of spring and the annual Bush Races many visitors will be coming to our town for a multitude of reasons, not the least being we are quite simply a fantastic place to be at.

With the above in mind the Shire, on behalf of all those residents who do the right thing, appeal to all to set aside some time to clean up around your home and in particular make the effort now to get rid of potential fire hazards that will exist once the grasses dry off. There is also the issue that long grass and rubbish makes an ideal home for snakes and other unwanted pests.

In past years the Council has not seriously considered issuing infringements however this year there will be no warnings given to anyone not complying with the firebreak order.

Firebreaks must be done by 31st October 2019.

The section of the firebreak order that applies to townsite land is as follows:

“Land Area less than 1 hectare:-

- All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;
- It be recommended that at least a 2m wide area, immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs.”

For information any land of one hectare or above the rural provisions apply.

VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION STICKERS

Shire of Kulin's Bushfire Brigade AGM agreed to investigate and arrange for supply of DFES VIS (Vehicle Identification Stickers) to be issued to all relevant Brigade members with appliances and all Fire Control Officers. These stickers on vehicles and water tanks allow bushfire personnel to pass WA Police road blocks when attending a fire incident. On those occasions when WA Police have been requested to create a road block – they are required not to let any personnel through. Instances where fire respondents have also been turned away from assisting in fire control measures resulted in DFES and WA Police adopting a sticker based system to ensure the correct vehicles are allowed entry.

The Shire has now obtained stickers which expire in Sept 2020. These are available by collection from the Shire Office, please call in to collect yours from Trish when you are next in town.

Claytons Farm - North Jitarning

this was a common sight in the 20's and 30's.



this team of 8 pull a bashaw(?) seeder. (20 row seeder) from about 8 til noon when a spare brings out a second team that works till late afternoon.

about 25 horses were needed to be cared for. They would do about 16 to 20 acres per day.

by the late 40's the day of the horse was in the past.

here a 203 massey-harris (50 horse power=25 horses) pulls two AL Sunshine Harvesters. See the extension shaft between the front harvester and the tractor. the tractor worked from 9, about when the dew has dried, doing about 5 acres per hour. (about 2-3 bags per acre)
