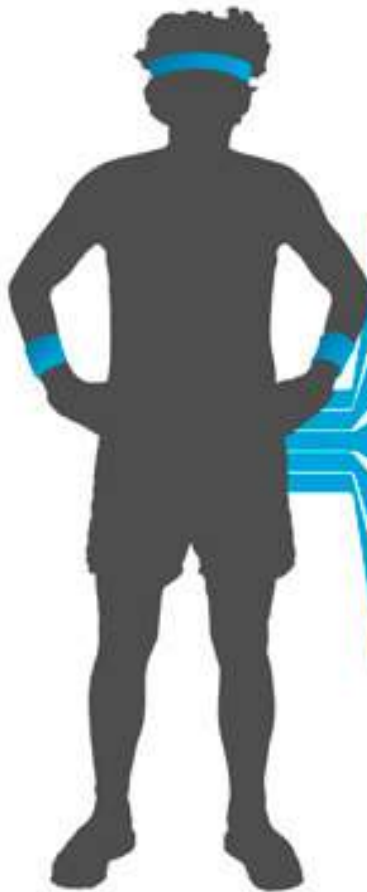

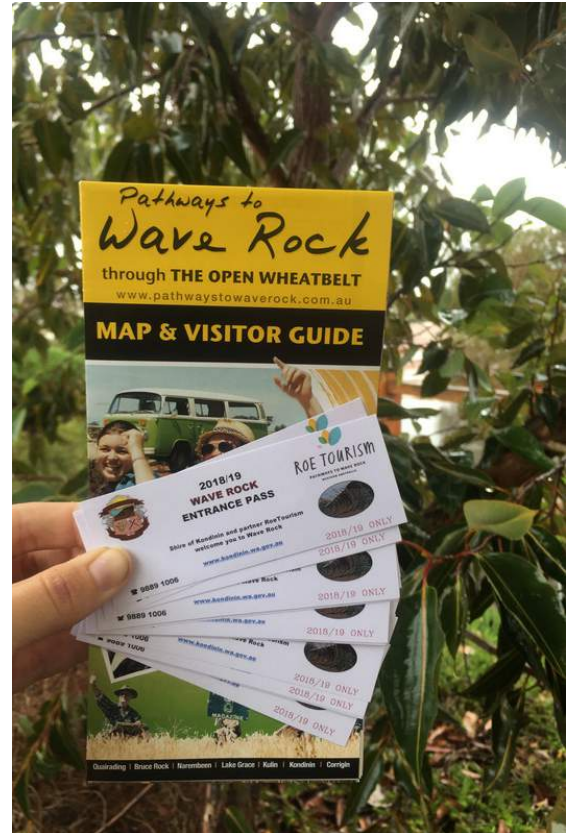

DIY Fluffy Slime

This fluffy slime will be sure to keep the kids busy over the holidays!

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup (4 ounces) school glue
- 1/2 cup (4 ounces) shaving cream
- Slightly more than 1 tbsp. cornstarch
- Borax (1 teaspoon)
- 1 cup hot water
- 1/2 cup foaming body wash,



Method

- Start off by making the borax solution. Take 1 teaspoon (4.9 ml) of borax powder and add it into 1 cup (240 ml) of hot water. Mix it until it's thoroughly dissolved and set aside for later use.
- Pour glue and shaving cream into a separate bowl.
- Add ½ cup (120 ml) of foaming body wash or soap (optional). Adding the foaming body wash or soap can make the slime fluffier, but it's okay to skip this step.
- Mix until there are no lumps. The substance should have a thick and fluffy texture, similar to marshmallow cream.
- Add in slightly more than 1 tablespoon (15 ml) of cornstarch. The cornstarch helps to thicken the slime and allows it to retain its shape.
- Add lotion to your slime. To make your slime stretchier, add in two pumps of hand lotion to your slime.
- Add in food colouring. Too much of some kinds of food colouring can stain your hands or other surfaces, so if it's a potent one, start with just two drops. Mix well.
- Add 3 teaspoons of the borax mixture to your slime. Stir thoroughly, then continue adding the borax mixture 1-3 teaspoons at a time until the slime is at the consistency you'd like it to be.
- Knead the slime. Once the slime has formed into a ball and is easy to remove from the bowl, place it on a flat surface and begin kneading it with your hands to thoroughly mix it.
- If the slime is still too sticky, add about 1 teaspoon (4.9 ml) of the borax mixture and carefully knead it in.

Preparing for the NDIS in WA

The Commonwealth and Western Australian Governments have announced that the National Disability Insurance Scheme (delivered by the National Disability Insurance Agency) will be rolled out in Western Australia.

What is the NDIS?

The NDIS (National Disability Insurance Scheme) provides support for people with disability, their families and carers in Australia. The NDIS will provide all Australians under the age of 65 with a permanent and significant disability with the reasonable and necessary supports they need to live an ordinary life. The NDIS is being implemented by the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA).

How is the NDIS currently being delivered in WA?

There have been two models of the NDIS operating in WA since July 2014:

- the nationally-delivered NDIS run by the NDIA
- the Western Australian (WA) NDIS (formerly known as My Way) run by the WA government.

Both NDIS models have delivered individualised support to people with disability in different locations.

The Commonwealth and WA Governments announced in December 2017 that the nationally-delivered NDIS (delivered by the NDIA) will be rolled out in Western Australia. This means there will eventually be only one NDIS delivered by the NDIA across every state and territory of Australia.

How will the national NDIS be different to the WA NDIS?

The nationally-delivered NDIS and the WA NDIS are identical in the ways that count most, including taking a life time approach to support, using the same eligibility criteria and guidelines for making decisions about supports in a participant's plan.

The differences are minor and include format used for participant plans, different processes for participants to choose and engage with providers, some new terms used to describe supports in a participant's plan and variations to the prices that providers can be funded to deliver supports.

What does this change mean for people in the WA NDIS?

All people in the WA NDIS will receive a letter from the West Australian government asking them to give consent to transfer to the national NDIS.

Giving consent means that people in WA NDIS can easily transfer their plan and continue to access the support they need. People who transfer from the WA NDIS to the national NDIS will experience minimal change.

Have your say about proposed prepaid funeral code

Funerals are not a topic most of us are comfortable discussing but Consumer Protection is currently seeking feedback about a mandatory code of practice being developed for Western Australia's \$140 million prepaid funeral sector.

Seniors around the State have millions invested in prepaid funeral funds, and we want to make sure each and every fund is managed correctly and that the community's expectations are clear.

This proposed mandatory code of practice should provide a regulatory framework that will protect this major investment by seniors and keep the financial risk low.

But it's important we get the regulations right, so we are urging members of the public and funeral directors to review the draft code of practice and let us know what you think prior to it becoming law.

The proposed code of practice is designed to safeguard consumers from fund mismanagement and will require more clarity in prepaid funeral contracts, introduce a 30-day cooling-off period, and require funeral providers to quarantine clients' funds in accounts separate from their own.

This will strengthen an existing voluntary code for the management of prepaid funeral funds - a standard already met by members of the Australian Funeral Directors' Association.

The tightened requirements will reach funeral directors who are not members of the Association, as well as 'funeral brokers', who provide prepaid funeral funds but are not certified funeral directors.

The proposed mandatory code of practice under the Fair Trading Act will cover all sellers of prepaid funeral packages. Requirements in the proposed code include:

- Information that must be included in a prepaid funeral contract, including what happens in the event of late or missed payments or the death of the consumer before final payment is made if they are paying by instalments;
- Funds to be held by the WA Public Trustee or an investment manager regulated by the Commonwealth Government;
- Consumers to be given information in writing as to how the money will be invested;
- A 30-day cooling-off period;
- Circumstances under which money paid under a prepaid funeral contract should be refunded; and
- Funeral directors to keep a register of contracts.

Biosecurity funding schemes to tackle pest threats

More than 99% of Western Australian cattle, sheep and goat producers and grain, seed and hay growers actively support the biosecurity of their industries by making financial contributions to WA's [Industry Funding Schemes](#).

Farmer contributions to Industry Funding Schemes will support a range of priority animal disease and pest control programs next financial year.

Executive Officer for the schemes, Rebecca Heath, said three-horned bedstraw, skeleton weed, virulent footrot and several cattle diseases were among the key issues to be targeted by the schemes in 2018/19.

"Industry-based management committees have determined which pest priorities are to be addressed, the scheme's areas of operation and the producer contribution rates," Ms Heath said.

The schemes are an integral part of the State's biosecurity system, helping to maintain access to domestic and international markets and supporting the viability and profitability of agricultural industries.

For the 2018/19 financial year the contribution rates remain unchanged.

Cattle: Producers pay a 20 cent contribution on the sale of each animal/carcass to fund surveillance programs for bovine tuberculosis, enzootic bovine leucosis and Johne's disease in cattle.

Sheep and goats: Producers pay a 10 cent contribution on the sale of each animal/carcass produced within the State, to fund a program to control virulent footrot. The Sheep and Goat Industry Funding Scheme management committee also anticipates funding a new program to address the impact of wild dogs on the industry. More information will be provided over the coming months.

Grains and seed: Growers pay a 25 cent contribution on the first sale of every tonne of grain and seed grown within the South West Land Division, to fund continuing programs to control skeleton weed and eradicate three-horned bedstraw.

Hay: Growers pay 12.5 cents per tonne on the first sale of hay grown within the South West Land Division, to fund the skeleton weed and three-horned bedstraw programs.

Producers/growers who wish to opt out of the scheme/s must submit a 2018/19 [Notice of Opt Out form](#) by 30 June 2018. Producers that opt out lose all entitlements to assistance and compensation via the scheme.

The continued support of producers for the schemes enables the WA livestock and grain/hay industries to identify and invest in biosecurity activities that help maintain our market advantage and the sustainability of the industries in Western Australia.

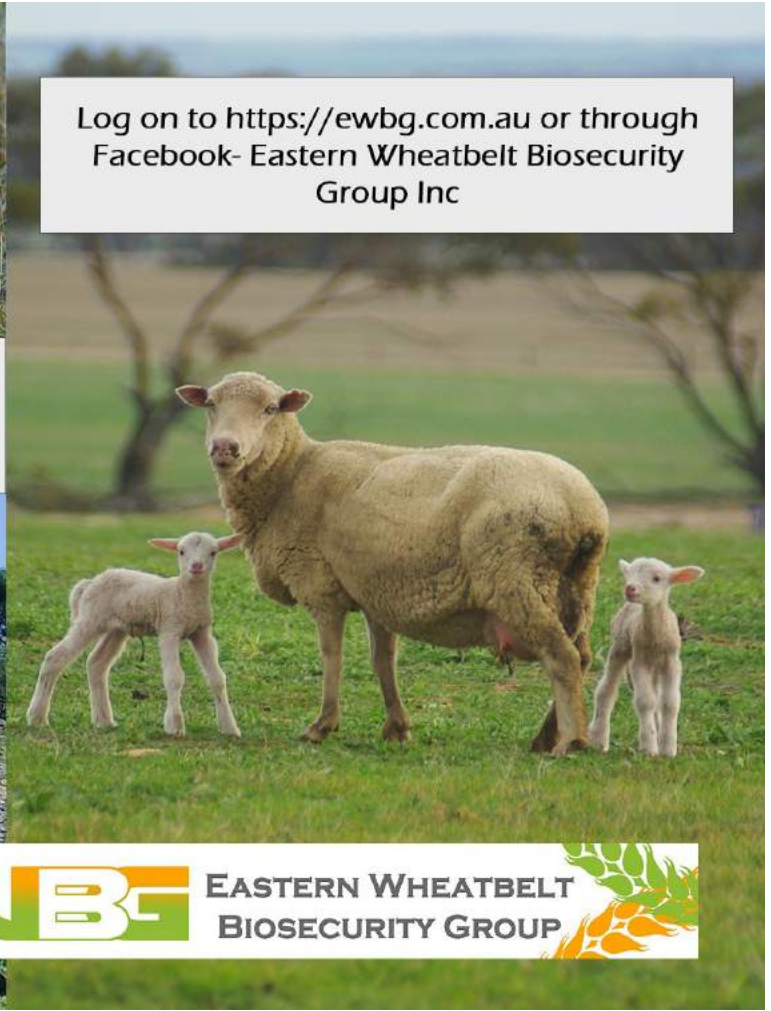
