CEO CORNER

The Water Corporation has approached the Shire as part of a state wide project affecting 90 Shires to create consistency in relation to the commercial, community or fire suppression use of standpipe water. Most Shires have standpipes, all operate in different ways and for different purposes; but the main aim of the exercise is to reduce unpaid consumption for farming and commercial purposes, and to gain control in terms of what the water is used for.

Kulin has a process of tanks, card readers and standpipes; and can without much ado implement the controls that the Water Corp are expecting. Combined with a significant increase in the price per kilolitre, standpipes now will also attract a significant annual fee and the Shire will also need to levy a portion for the maintenance of the equipment already installed. As an example, last years usage and fees would increase threefold under the new arrangements and the Shire is not in a position to carry this cost. On-charging for water usage is inevitable and will come into play 1 July 2019.

The Shire is still working the processes around this new arrangement with Water Corp, but as a heads up – if you are a standpipe user, it may be time to consider the implication of these changes and plan ahead where possible. More information will follow in the next Update; including dates for a meeting or two to alert the community to the changes. Happy to field any enquiries in the meantime.

Changes to the Scheme

- ◆ Changes have been made to continue allowing 'First and last' mile access on roads between the paddock and the nearest road approved for Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV) Network access. The changes ensure there are no adverse effects on road safety and Main Roads legal obligations are met.



Register for HMMS

- ◆ If you wish to participate in HMMS, continue to register your vehicles with a participating Grain Receiver.
- ◆ If RAV access is required on roads between the paddock and the nearest road approved for RAV Network access under HMMS, you must apply to Main Roads by submitting a HMMS Road List form to advise us of the RAV combination & roads being used.
- ◆ Your HMMS Road List must be endorsed by Main Roads before starting HMMS operations on these roads. Apply now to avoid delays.



Processing Your Application

- ◆ Main Roads will check the nominated roads between the paddock and the nearest road approved for RAV Network access to ensure they are safe for the proposed RAV combination.
- ◆ If deemed safe, your HMMS Road List will be endorsed and any additional access conditions specified (if necessary).

Harvest Mass Management Scheme

What you need to know for 2018-2019 Harvest Period



Access Conditions

- ◆ The Main Roads endorsed HMMS Road List must be carried in the RAV.
- ◆ The most direct route must be used between the paddock and the nearest road approved for RAV Network access.
- ◆ The RAV combination being used must not be a higher RAV category than the nearest RAV Network.
- ◆ When travelling on the roads between the paddock and the nearest road approved for RAV Network access, the maximum speed is 40 km/h and you must display an amber flashing warning light.



Future Planning

- ◆ Main Roads will use the HMMS Road Lists to prioritise onsite route assessments, with the aim of adding the roads to the relevant RAV Network.
- ◆ This will eliminate the need to continue providing the HMMS Road List in future.



Other Access Options

- ◆ Use a Category 1 RAV vehicle combination that is 20 m or less in length and 50 t or less in gross mass.
- ◆ Use a RAV that is greater than a Category 1 RAV vehicle combination on approved RAV Network roads.
- ◆ Apply to have my road (s) added to the RAV Network through the standard process.

Bushfire Brigade Update

Bush Fires Act 1945 - Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Kulin

PURSUANT TO THE POWERS contained in Section 33, you are hereby required on or before 31st October 2018 and thereafter up to and including 15th March 2019 to have a 3 metre firebreak clear of all inflammable material on all rural and townsite rural land owned or occupied by you:

1. Immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and
2. In such other positions as is necessary to divide land into areas not exceeding 500 hectares, each completely surrounded by a firebreak; and
3. Immediately surrounding any part of land used for crop; and
4. Parallel to and within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps on the land; and
5. Immediately surrounding receptacles used for the storage of fuel, whether they contain fuel or not; the firebreak required to comply with this item shall be no less than 5 metres wide; and
6. Immediately inside land which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not); the firebreak required shall be no less than 7 metres wide. Where the land is prepared for clearing by burning after 19th September 2018 you shall provide the firebreak immediately.

Burning Periods

The RESTRICTED burning period commences on Wednesday 19 September through to Wednesday 31 October 2018. Effectively this means that no burning can be carried out unless you have a permit from your local Fire Control Officer. The exception is burning rubbish and garden refuse after 6pm (needs to be extinguished by 11pm). Other conditions apply.

PROHIBITED burning will commence on 1 November through to 15 February during which time **NO BURNING** is to take place within the Shire of Kulin.

Protective Clothing

Council will once again subsidise 50% of the cost of Full Face Respirators & Filters (full cost is approx. \$300). Fire fighting jackets and trousers can also be ordered through the Shire (no subsidy available). Estimated costs at this stage are \$125 for jackets and \$80 for trousers.

A duty of care exists for a Fire Control Officer to ensure that persons attending an incident has appropriate PPE (personal protective equipment), the same responsibility rests with those attending so please ensure you wear the required clothing, otherwise insurance issues may arise.

Please be advised that:

- It is the landowner's responsibility to ensure that they check with a Fire Control Officer, the Shire Office or the Harvest Ban Information line (98801511) if they have any doubt whatsoever on whether a harvest and vehicle movement ban should be in place.
- The Council accepts no responsibility should your mobile number be omitted, deleted or otherwise not listed as a contact at any time and for whatever reason.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

SHIRE OF KULIN

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Kulin

PURSUANT TO THE POWERS contained in Section 33, you are hereby required on or before 31st October 2018 and thereafter up to and including 15th March 2019 to have a 3 metre firebreak clear of all inflammable material on all rural and townsite rural land owned or occupied by you:

1. Immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and
2. In such other positions as is necessary to divide land into areas not exceeding 500 hectares, each completely surrounded by a firebreak; and
3. Immediately surrounding any part of land used for crop; and
4. Parallel to and within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps on the land; and
5. Immediately surrounding receptacles used for the storage of fuel, whether they contain fuel or not; the firebreak required to comply with this item shall be no less than 5 metres wide; and
6. Immediately inside land which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not); the firebreak required shall be no less than 7 metres wide. Where the land is prepared for clearing by burning after 19th September 2018 you shall provide the firebreak immediately.

Townsites – area less than 1 hectare

All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;

It is recommended that at least a 2m wide area immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs."

(Note: any land of one hectare or above - rural provisions apply.)

Firebreak Variation

If it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impractical to clear firebreaks to comply with this notice due to soil erosion, the spread of salinity or for any other reason, a request for a variation may be made to the Council no later than the 1 September of each year. Such a request must be in writing and include a detailed plan showing the proposed location of firebreaks or of the alternative fire protection methods to be used.

Harvesting Operations - Mobile Fire Fighting Units

An operational mobile engine powered firefighting pump unit with no less than 500 litres of water shall be in attendance during grain harvesting operations. If the unit is trailer mounted the trailer must be attached to a vehicle at all times during harvesting operations and the unit must be in the paddock, or adjoining paddock, where the harvesting operation is being carried out.

Automatic Harvesting Bans

A Harvest Ban will apply automatically on Christmas Day and New Year's Day.

Other Matters

If for hardship reasons, it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impossible to clear firebreaks required by this Notice, you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to seek alternative options. Claimants of hardship, should do so with sufficient time to allow alternatives to be enacted. Claims of hardship does not automatically exempt owners and occupiers from the requirements of this Notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this Notice is a fine not exceeding \$5000.00. A person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of the Shire or a contractor performing the work directed in this Notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the due date. If the requirements of this Notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

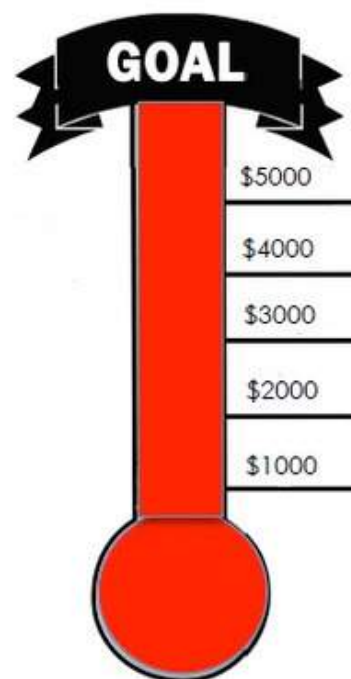
