A couple of interactive and informative sessions were held at the Shire Depot and Emergency Services Building. Council will be providing dinner and refreshments throughout the night. Council will also be taking the opportunity to present the latest work associated with our IPR process, particularly the Kulin Community Capture, which outlines major projects that have been

put forward by community members, organisations, Council and staff. At this stage there are over 80 initiatives, which we are seeking the community's involvement to determine the Top 25 for implementation over the next 4 years. Next week we will be issuing a Community Survey for members of the community to vote for their Top 25 initiatives. These will be presented to Council at the November meeting.

Next week we farewell Jordy and Manon who have been our resident backpackers at the FRC for the past 6 months. They have certainly fitted in well to the town undertaking a variety of jobs for the Shire as well as private business. We wish them well on their travels and thank them for their contribution to the community.

## Strategic Community Plan 2021 - 2031

### Overview

The Strategic Community Plan (SCP) is a long-term plan that sets out the Council's vision and strategies to achieve it. It was originally adopted by the Shire of Kulin Council at the June 2013 General Council Meeting. Desktop reviews are undertaken every two years to ensure that the accuracy of data is maintained and updated. This is part of the WA's Integrated Planning and Reporting Framework.

***The aim of this document is to allow the whole community to share in their vision for the Shire of Kulin.***

The document belongs to the community and is designed to give everyone the opportunity to participate in achieving the goals and actions set out in the Plan. The goals and actions in each of the identified focus areas reflect the words and ideas presented by members of the Shire.

### Shire of Kulin Strategic Priorities

Previously Council has categorised the information into four themes; Social, Economic, Environment and Civic Leadership in line with the WA Local Government Integrated Planning guidelines. During this review process, information has been categorised more in line with how Council conducts its day-to-day business.

1. Corporate
2. Infrastructure
3. Community
4. Regulatory
5. Recreation & Culture

Utilising these 5 Business Units as categories, Council was able to develop a subset of Specific Strategic Priorities against which Council can reference its Core Business Functions, Community Initiatives and Strategic Projects.

### How did we get here?

The vision within the Shire of Kulin Community Strategic Plan is the culmination of the process of identifying current and emerging issues facing the communities within the Shire, as well as making approaches to improve the overall wellbeing of the Council area. It is a collective community vision that focuses not only on the physical infrastructure but also on the ideals of the community, way of living, doing business and the sense of community and wellbeing.

The Shire of Kulin recognises that prolonged community development comes from positive engagement with its residents and stakeholders. Conversation will form the basis from where all community engagement begins.

The process for the 2021 update of the Plan commenced in February 2021 with:

- Business Workshop
- Community Workshop
- Community Survey
- Council Workshops

From the information gathered, Council was able to develop an understanding of what the community identified as priorities for the Shire of Kulin. To build upon the background information, further consultations were held with the Council. Consideration was also given to input received

during the development of the Forward Capital Works Plan 2021 – 2025 and the previous Shire of Kulin Plan for the Future 2017 - 2021.

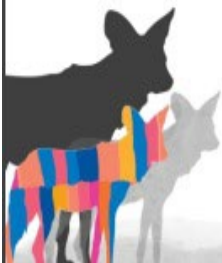

## *Community Notice*

### TO THE HOUSEHOLDER

The Kulin Shire has now completed all Town Fire Break Inspections. Letters will be sent out to those who have not yet cleared fire breaks on their property. Fire Breaks need to be done by

*Sunday 31st October 2021,*

failure to comply will result in fines being issued.

#### *Bush Fire Control is as follows:*

“Land Area less than 1 hectare:-

All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;

It be recommended that at least a 2m wide area, immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs.”

For information any land of one hectare or above the rural provisions apply.

## BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

### SHIRE OF KULIN

#### Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Kulin

PURSUANT TO THE POWERS contained in Section 33, you are hereby required on or before 31 October 2021 and thereafter up to and including 15 March 2022 to have a 3 metre firebreak clear of all inflammable material on all rural and townsite rural land owned or occupied by you:

1. Immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and
2. In such other positions as is necessary to divide land into areas not exceeding 500 hectares, each completely surrounded by a firebreak; and
3. Immediately surrounding any part of land used for crop; and
4. Parallel to and within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps on the land; and
5. Immediately surrounding receptacles used for the storage of fuel, whether they contain fuel or not; the firebreak required to comply with this item shall be no less than 5 metres wide; and
6. Immediately inside land which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not); the firebreak required shall be no less than 7 metres wide. Where the land is prepared for clearing by burning after 19 September 2021 you shall provide the firebreak immediately.

#### Townsites – area less than 1 hectare

All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;

It is recommended that at least a 2m wide area immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs.”

(Note: any land of one hectare or above - rural provisions apply.)

#### Firebreak Variation

If it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impractical to clear firebreaks to comply with this notice due to soil erosion, the spread of salinity or for any other reason, a request for a variation may be made to the Council no later than the 1 September of each year. Such a request must be in writing and include a detailed plan showing the proposed location of firebreaks or of the alternative fire protection methods to be used.

#### Harvesting Operations - Mobile Fire Fighting Units

An operational mobile engine powered firefighting pump unit with no less than 500 litres of water shall be in attendance during grain harvesting operations. If the unit is trailer mounted the trailer must be attached to a vehicle at all times during harvesting operations and the unit must be in the paddock, or adjoining paddock, where the harvesting operation is being carried out.

#### Automatic Harvesting Bans

A Harvest Ban will apply automatically on Christmas Day and New Year's Day.

#### Other Matters

If for hardship reasons, it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impossible to clear firebreaks required by this Notice, you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to seek alternative options. Claimants of hardship, should do so with sufficient time to allow alternatives to be enacted. Claims of hardship does not automatically exempt owners and occupiers from the requirements of this Notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this Notice is a fine not exceeding \$5000. A person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of the Shire or a contractor performing the work directed in this Notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the due date. If the requirements of this Notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.
