CEO CORNER

Welcome back to another CEO corner for 2021 as we roll into December. Finally, we are seeing a bit of consistency with the warm weather to give the farmers their best shot at finishing harvest before Xmas and more importantly for Jones to get the water temperature in the pool. I must say this morning at 6:30am the water temperature was perfect for some early morning low impact exercise.

Two weeks ago we had Council and WALGA Central Country Zone Meeting. There has been much discussion around LG Reform which has recently been announced by the State government, whilst this largely affects staff and Council, anyone in the community who would like to hear more on this issue is more than welcome to contact me to discuss. Council will be working through the proposed changes and providing a response.

We've also had some discussion regarding the new Work Health and Safety Act. A significant concern has been how this affects volunteers, particularly the local Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade. The main take home point is for LGs and the Brigades to ensure we are aware of potential risks and implementing specific processes in advance of any potential fires. This is already in place through various mechanisms including:

- Provision of PPE
- VIN stickers for volunteer vehicles
- VBFB structure, membership and registration
- FCO appointments
- Training
- LEMC

This doesn't absolve any staff or FCO of responsibility for safety on the day of a bushfire, but it outlines how the Shire and VBFB are already working at mitigating the risk associated with attending emergencies.

On a personal note, at Council Meeting, I was fortunate to have my contract renewed for another 5 years. Time flies when you're having fun and it's hard to believe that I've been in this role for nearly 3 years already. I'd like to thank Council for their faith in keeping me on, more importantly I'd also like to thank the community for making this place such a wonderful place to live, work and be an active part of. The decision for me to want to stay around was easy, because for now this is home for me and my family with the community having so much to offer, as well as Council about to embark on our updated Strategic Community Plan, which will progress the community even further.

Last week we had our Wheatbelt South Regional Road Group Meeting and I'd like to congratulate Cr Grant Robins on his re-election as Deputy Chair of WS-RRG. Auguring this with Judd's roles as President of the LG Works Association, plus his role on the WSNF Technical Committee we are well represented at a regional level when it comes to dealing with transport issues. We also host the Project Manager for WSNF, which will see Fence Road upgraded over the next 4 years with funding at over \$6M.

Whilst we talk about transport issues, last week I welcomed feedback from local farmer Simon Noble with regard to the State road between Kulin and Kondinin. This section of road has been identified by Council as having design issues particularly with pavement and seal width that affects the interaction of heavy vehicles, school buses and general traffic especially during peak seasons. Simon was pro-active in calling Main Roads directly to articulate his concerns, as well as relaying this conversation to myself. This resulted in Council submitting an official letter to Main Roads Wheatbelt Region reiterating our

concern regarding this road. It has previously been discussed between Council and Main Roads, but having local community members raise it directly with Main Roads adds weight to our argument. Thanks to Simon for taking the time to raise this issue.

From a staff perspective we have had or will have a number of jobs advertised in the coming weeks. These include:

- Childcare Centre Co-ordinator
- CRC Manager / Community Development Officer
- Works Supervisor

If you are interested in any of these positions, please contact the Shire directly for an information pack or to discuss potential possibilities.

As you may be aware, in March 2022, Cassi-Dee Lewis will be taking extended leave for a period of 12 months. I'm pleased to announce that during this period Fiona Murphy will be Acting DCEO. Congratulations for Fi on her appointment and it's always good to promote staff into higher roles from within the organisation. Within the finance team next year, we will also have Nicole Thompson and Cindy Mullan, congratulations to all those on their appointments and welcome Cindy to the LG family.

The Skate Park, Pump Track and Hangout Zone continue to be a hive of activity. Every time I drive past there always seems to be a bunch of kids enjoying this wonderful new facility. The adjustable basketball ring seems to be a hit as the kids channel their inner Wilt Chamberlain and practise their slam dunks.

As always plenty happening in Kulin, until next time safe travels.

GREG HADLOW HONOURED

CHOPPERS TO HONOUR HADLOW AT EVENT



Golf Club will take on a 72-hole golf challenge in December to help raise funds in honour of past member, Greg Hadlow. Run annually by the Cancer Council, The Longest Day event is a golf marathon held in December, challenging golfers to complete either two, three or four rounds of golf in one day to raise money for cancer research. 2021 marks the third year the Bunbury Golf Club Choppers will take on the event, with members Matthew Simmons, Des Shearer, Craig Reynolds, Sam Roberts, Tim Gilotti, Andrew Murphy and Aron Jones already having collectively raised over \$8,000. Jones said the motivation for the club entering the challenge was to honour Australian golfer, Jarrod Lyle, who died from

Leukemia in 2018, and the late, Bunbury golfer, Greg Hadlow. “For us, this challenge is about honouring Greg, who passed away from cancer in June this year,” Jones said. “He had a very big personality and big presence in our club, but he’d been battling a long time. “He beat the initial diagnosis but then it came back couple of years later. He was such a tough old bugger.” On Monday, December 6, the seven golfers will begin at 4.30am at the Bunbury Golf Club to take on 72-holes of golf. Jones said they estimate to walk over 40 kilometres and finish around 6pm. “It’s going to be a challenge but I’m really looking forward to it, I’ve taken a week off work for recovery,” Jones laughed. “Because we only

had three golfers in it last year, we want to build it from here. “We want to try and get more people involved and raise more money for the cause, because if this can prevent someone else from getting sick, we’ll do it.” At the time of publication, the Bunbury Golf Club Choppers were number six on the leaderboard for most money raised. Jones ranked at number four for top individuals, having already raised \$5,912 for the team. KULIN AQUATIC CENTRE

START OF ANOTHER SEASON 2021/2022

Well, we have been open now for just under a month and the weather hasn't been all that kind for pool users. It's looking a bit better now though so hopefully a few more through the gate.

Over the off season at the pool a few might have seen vehicles parked at the pool. There were a few issues discovered around the pool bowl and walls. There were issues with tiles having a hollow sound behind them which is an indication the cement has been leached out from behind the tile. If left too much longer it might have been a bigger job so the Shire has spent a few \$\$ on maintenance over the off-season on the pool as well as the slide platforms being replaced at the landings. Hopefully this should see us with limited issues going forward.

Once again, I'm running the Swim to Rotto program in the pool which involves swimming the same distance as from Cottesloe Beach to

Rotto, a distance of 19.7km or 788 laps. A few might have seen the pic of Elizabeth I posted a week ago, she is the first to make the distance this season so well done. What I'm trying to do is swim as a town all the way around Australia and with the last two seasons we have swum from Kulin up through Perth to as far as about 100km north of Port Hedland so we are well on our way. At present there are 48 taking on the challenge but I think this number will grow with the warmer weather. We have done 5941 laps so far as a town which is 148km so good job everyone. Keep it up. It can't be that bad in as I've even been in a few times. Just remember I'm down here between 6-8 am for early morning swimming.

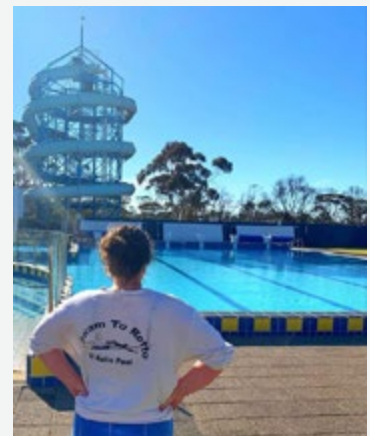
Interim lessons are under way so the kids have got some nice weather at time of writing this. Can't hear to many squeals from the pool as they are getting in.

Australia Day Awards promote national pride, community responsibility and participation.



Shire of Kulin invites you to nominate an outstanding individual or group for one of this year's Community Citizen of the Year Awards to be presented on Australia Day 26 January. The awards foster, recognise and celebrate significant contributions to community life and active citizenship in all local government areas of Western Australia.



Guidelines and criteria

Each year three local citizens and one local community group in each local government area will be eligible for the Community Citizen of the Year Awards. The recipients will be selected from people and groups who have made a noteworthy contribution during the current year or given outstanding service to the local community over a number of years through active involvement.

Auspire - Australia Day Council WA provides four awards each year for presentation in each local government area. These prestigious awards are provided to your local government for presentation during Australia Day celebrations.

Nomination Process

Shire of Kulin invites nominations for the awards from community groups and private citizens. At the council's discretion, a committee will be appointed to encourage and promote nominations. The committee or your local council may also make nominations based on local knowledge and experience.

Nominations close on 10th December and can be received in hard copy or the nomination form online.

Nominations received after the closing date will be ineligible for this year's awards.

The four award categories

- Community Citizen of the Year
- Community Citizen of the Year – Senior (65 years or over)
- Community Citizen of the Year - Youth (under 25)
- Active Citizen Award (Group or Event)

Selection Criteria

The winners will have been judged to have shown active citizenship and:

- Significant contribution to the local community.
- Demonstrated leadership on a community issue resulting in the enhancement of community life.
- A significant initiative which has brought about positive change and added value to community life.
- Inspiring qualities as a role model for the community.

Eligibility criteria

- Nominees should reside or work principally within the Shire of Kulin.
- Awards may be granted posthumously in recognition of recent achievements.
- Groups of people or couples will not normally be eligible except when meeting the criteria for a community group.
- A person may receive an award on more than one occasion in recognition of their particularly outstanding community contribution or involvement in an alternative initiative.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated in future years.
- Nominations must be apolitical in their nature and should not in any way bring the awards program or local government area into disrepute.
- Sitting members of State, Federal and Local Government are not eligible.

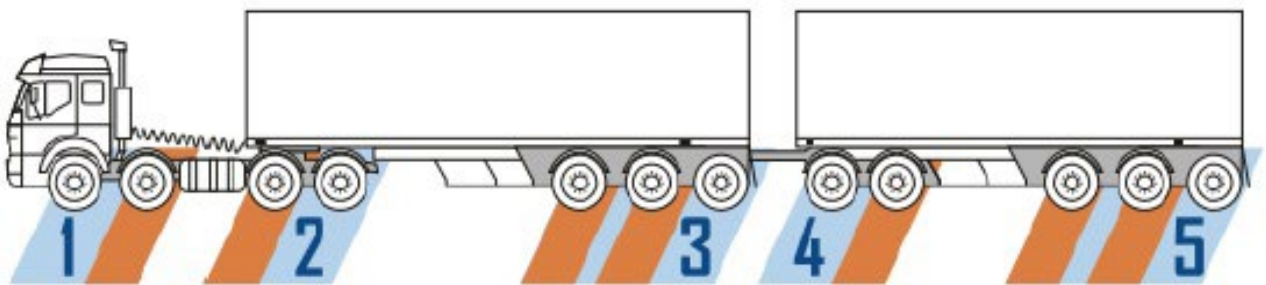

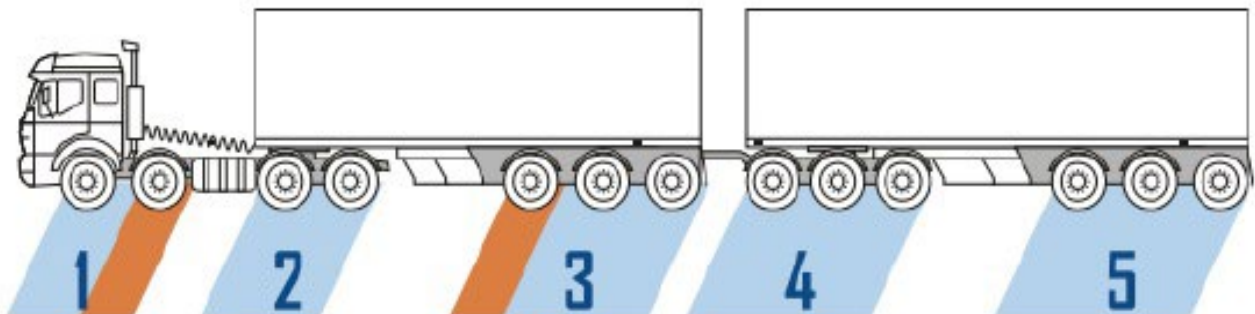
RAV Maximum Gross Weights

In accordance with Main Roads WA HVS Network Map all local farmers and transport operators are reminded of the maximum gross weights for the relevant RAV Network Categories permissible on Shire of Kulin roads.

- RAV 3 AMMS 2 – prime mover, semi trailer towing 5 axle dog trailer 86T.



- RAV 4 AMMS 2 – tandem drive prime mover, semi trailer towing 6 axle dog trailer 91.5T.
- RAV 4 AMMS 2 – tandem drive twin steer prime mover, semi trailer towing 6 axle dog trailer 96.5T.



- RAV7 AMMS1 – B-double towing a 6 axle dog trailer 110T.



Please note these are the maximum permitted weights operating under accredited mass management scheme (AMMS) on Shire of Kulin Roads and may be greater than allowed under harvest mass management scheme (HMMS).

NOTICES FROM THE SHIRE OF KULIN

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

SHIRE OF KULIN

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Kulin

PURSUANT TO THE POWERS contained in Section 33, you are hereby required on or before 31 October 2021 and thereafter up to and including 15 March 2022 to have a 3 metre firebreak clear of all inflammable material on all rural and townsite rural land owned or occupied by you:

1. Immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and
2. In such other positions as is necessary to divide land into areas not exceeding 500 hectares, each completely surrounded by a firebreak; and
3. Immediately surrounding any part of land used for crop; and
4. Parallel to and within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps on the land; and
5. Immediately surrounding receptacles used for the storage of fuel, whether they contain fuel or not; the firebreak required to comply with this item shall be no less than 5 metres wide; and
6. Immediately inside land which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not); the firebreak required shall be no less than 7 metres wide. Where the land is prepared for clearing by burning after 19 September 2021 you shall provide the firebreak immediately.

Townsites – area less than 1 hectare

All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;

It is recommended that at least a 2m wide area immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs.”

(Note: any land of one hectare or above - rural provisions apply.)

Firebreak Variation

If it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impractical to clear firebreaks to comply with this notice due to soil erosion, the spread of salinity or for any other reason, a request for a variation may be made to the Council no later than the 1 September of each year. Such a request must be in writing and include a detailed plan showing the proposed location of firebreaks or of the alternative fire protection methods to be used.

Harvesting Operations - Mobile Fire Fighting Units

An operational mobile engine powered firefighting pump unit with no less than 500 litres of water shall be in attendance during grain harvesting operations. If the unit is trailer mounted the trailer must be attached to a vehicle at all times during harvesting operations and the unit must be in the paddock, or adjoining paddock, where the harvesting operation is being carried out.

Automatic Harvesting Bans

A Harvest Ban will apply automatically on Christmas Day and New Year's Day.

Other Matters

If for hardship reasons, it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impossible to clear firebreaks required by this Notice, you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to seek alternative options. Claimants of hardship, should do so with sufficient time to allow alternatives to be enacted. Claims of hardship does not automatically exempt owners and occupiers from the requirements of this Notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this Notice is a fine not exceeding \$5000. A person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of the Shire or a contractor performing the work directed in this Notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the due date. If the requirements of this Notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.


Bush Fire Brigade Protective Clothing

A duty of care exists for a Fire Control Officer to ensure that persons attending an incident has appropriate PPE (personal protective equipment), the same responsibility rests with those attending so please ensure you wear the required clothing, otherwise insurance issues may arise.

You must be a **registered member of a bushfire brigade** within the Shire of Kulin, and have not placed an order in the past 5 years.

2. Start the timer as you turn the cold water tap on full for 30 seconds, directing the water into the bucket.

3. Stop the timer and turn off the tap.

4. If your bucket is around half full you have a water efficient showerhead. If it's much more than half full you may have an old high flow showerhead.

5. Empty the bucket onto your garden.

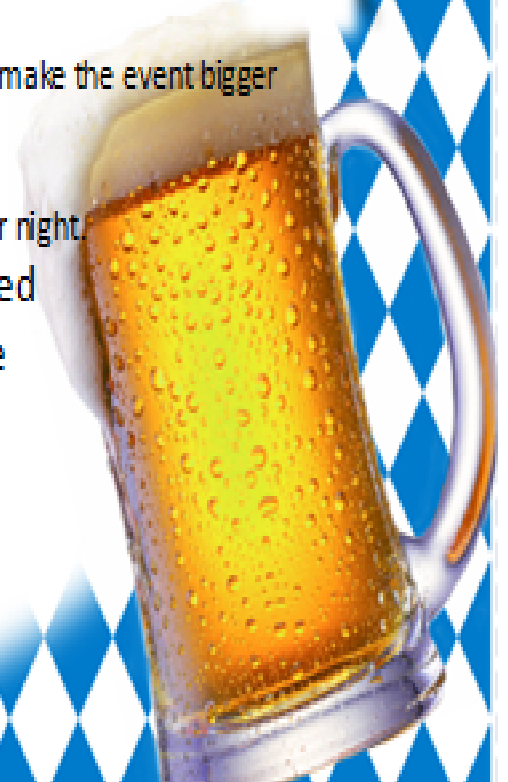

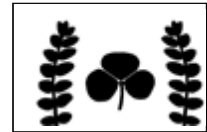
