Welcome back to another CEO corner for 2022 and life in Kulin continues to be busy and vibrant. Last week we saw the Kulin Aquatic Centre host both the KDHS Faction Swimming Carnival as well as the Kulin Triathlon. Well done to Jones, Ruth, KDHS and all the volunteers for both events. These were just a warm up for the Interschool Swimming Carnival to be held this Friday at the Aquatic Centre. Good luck to the defending champions KDHS.

This week marks Council's Annual Electors Meeting. No doubt there will be a few community members coming along with suggestions, ideas, queries and maybe even a gripe or two. Whilst Council and staff are constantly involved in community engagement through various processes, this provides a formal opportunity for the community to meet directly with Council.

Last week Cultivating Kulin Committee and Council hosted a whistlestop visit from Rick Wilson, the incumbent Federal member. Rick was certainly impressed with recent projects delivered with Federal funding including the All Ages Precinct and CBH Access Road. He was fortunate to have a brief

discussion with tourists, who raved about our tourism facilities. This is certainly a feather in Council's cap and the foresight people within the community continue to undertake to keep our communities thriving.

Next week the long-awaited FRC Court Replacement project begins. As a result, the courts will be out of action for a month. This project has been a long time in the planning as a result of discussions with FRC Committee, plus the Netball and Basketball Clubs.

Following the recent bushfire events around Corrigin and Babakin, DFES will be running a "Bushfire Safety Workshop" for community members and those generally not involved with the Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades. DFES has recognised communication challenges between DFES and the community during these recent events. This workshop will provide community members with an opportunity to liaise directly with DFES. The "Bushfire Safety Workshop" will be held at the Freebairn Recreation Centre on Thursday 31st March 2022 at 5pm and will focus on the "keys to survival" during a bushfire.

Topics will include:

- Understanding bushfires and warnings
- Deciding when to leave early or stay and defend
- Identifying hazards around your home
- Preparing yourself and your family
- Preparing a Bushfire Survival Plan

TRIATHLON 2022

The 2022 Kulin Triathlon has been run and won! Saturday March 12 was the big day when almost 50 participants converged on the Aquatic Centre to participate in the event. We had a great number of kids sign up in teams to swim, ride and run their way around the course. There weren't quite as many adults who submitted entry forms but still a good crew were there to give it a go both as teams and in an individual capacity.

After a restless night (after having read the forecast for thunderstorms to hit Kulin between 8am and 10am on Saturday) we awoke to a clear but somewhat steamy morning. It was a good morning to be the swimmer! Thankfully that said the storms hit surrounding areas and we were left with a clear morning with a bit of breeze to combat mainly out on the bike leg.

The competition was tight throughout all categories. In the Under 12 Division Teagan Williamson tackled her first triathlon ever and tackled it as a solo entrant! Fabulous effort by Teagan to complete all 3 legs in her maiden event.

There were a lot of teams who came together to compete in the Under 12 Female Division and in a hotly contested race we saw the Speedy Squirrels (Kensi, Peyton and Miley) emerge triumphant. Not far behind in the runners up position were the Wild Burritos (Molly, Willow and Maddie).

In the Under 12 Male Division it was Ronan, Ned and Hugh who just held out Flynn, Sam and Ollie. Not as much emphasis was put on the team names in the male

division – maybe next year!

The next category was for 12-16 year olds with a good mix of male and female participants. The fastest team over the longer distance in the male category were Deacon, Eli and Tarkyn. Well done boys on a solid team effort. Tadhg, Fraser and Kade were less than a minute off the pace and took out the runners up prize. In the female category the Three Spicy Pigs emerged the fastest with Amber, Maggie and Zari forming a formidable combination. The mixed team of Nadia, Toby and Ethan covered the course in the fastest time of all the 12-16 year olds with each of them performing very strongly in their respective legs.

We then moved into the “big kids” section consisting of both Long and Short Course distances. We welcomed competitors from both Narembeen and Corrigin and thank them for their involvement in our event. It was fabulous to welcome Mrs Lorraine Lethlean to the race and I am sure she won't mind me saying that it was a great inspiration to us all to see that age is certainly no barrier to participation and activity. Lorraine is over 70 years old and more than held her own across every leg of the day as she completed the Short Course as a solo entrant and emerged victorious over her fellow Narembeen competitor Tamara Clarkson. The Short Course Team event saw some locals go head-to-head. Rynelle, Chad and Minnie representing the Vipers Hockey Club managed to hold out the team of Fi Jasper and Dave Tyson who both performed strongly with the one solid training session

under their belt in the lead up to the race!

We had a few tackle the long course event with veteran competitor Gary Harris from Corrigin showing that he is strong across all three disciplines and it's so nice to see he always has a smile on his dial.

The teams event saw husband and wife Dave and Jess Ball team up with me to cover the course in a time of 1 hour and 14 minutes. Thankfully we finished the race without any mishaps as there is a preceding reputation we were aiming not to uphold.

As always, these events would not be possible without the combined efforts of multiple people. I am indebted to everyone who came along on the morning to help out as timers, marshals, cooks, recorders and supporters! Thanks also to the Works boys who assisted both in the lead up and on the day of the event. A massive shout out to Jones who, as Pool Manager, quietly and diligently goes about his business ensuring everything is in place to facilitate the event. Thanks to you all – your help and smiles are greatly appreciated.

Overall, it's fair to say the triathlon was a success. Apart from a truckload of sheep wanting to access the course to get to the weighbridge we got through everything pretty well..... thanks for sorting that curveball out for me Grantly.

CHILDCARE HAPPENINGS

This fortnight we have been learning about primary colours and ways to blend them to create secondary colours. Teaching the children about colours and shapes is a great way to give them some vocabulary for describing the world around them. This opens up new and exciting avenues for verbal communication. As the children are learning to identify colours and shapes, they can sort and classify objects around them based on these attributes. Colours are also important to give us information about health and safety. For example, we use red in our culture to indicate 'danger' or 'stop,' such as red stop signs. Our celebrations this week are focused on the colour green for St Patricks Day, and rainbows of

colours as we celebrate Holi Week - Indian Festival of Colours – celebration of seasons, friendships and harvest. We also had a "crazy Hair Day" where we wore our hair in very interesting ways, and of course in many vibrant colours. We also painted rainbows on our faces – a fun day.

We are also spending a lot of time in our garden harvesting the last of our summer crops of heirloom cherry tomatoes, rockmelon and zucchini. We are cleaning up the area and filling our compost bins in readiness for Autumn planting. Can't wait to get our new heirloom seeds germinating.

of recycled items for our sustainability crafts and the honky nuts for our loose parts play. Thanks also to Julia (from Robyn) for the wonderful wool, lace and pretty trays – they will be put to good use. Thanks to the school for our very cute colour posters – very timely. We have purchased a circular knitting machine and will be exploring ways to knit up head bands and beanies for the coming cooler months, so watch this space for the photos.

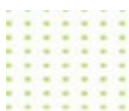

COVID-19: Testing and isolation protocols



I have tested positive for COVID-19

With COVID-19 in the community, it is important for you to know what to do to keep yourself and others safe. This protocol will help you know when and how long you need to isolate for if you are COVID-19 positive.

If you return a positive Rapid Antigen Test (RAT), you must register your result with the Department of Health.

Isolate at home for 7 days.



No symptoms after 7 days
No further test is required.



Symptoms on day 7
Remain in isolation until symptoms cease.



OR

You can leave home. Wear a mask indoors and outdoors for the next 7 days.



You are cleared by a medical professional.



Symptoms include:



Fever



Sore/scratchy throat



Runny nose



Fatigue



Shortness of breath



Dry cough



COVID-19: Testing and isolation protocols



I am a close contact and have no symptoms

With COVID-19 in the community, it is important for you to know what to do to keep yourself and others safe. This protocol will help you know what to do if you are a close contact but have no symptoms.

Isolate for 7 days from date of contact.



Monitor for symptoms.

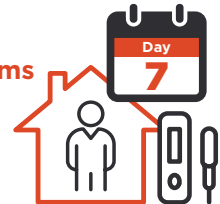


Symptoms

Refer to 'I am a close contact who develops symptoms' protocol.



No symptoms
Take a RAT on day 7.



Test positive

Refer to the 'I have tested positive to COVID-19' protocol.



Test negative

You can leave your home after day 7 of isolation, providing there are no new cases in your household. For the next 7 days, wear a mask indoors and outdoors and don't visit high risk settings (exemptions apply).



If someone in your household tests positive, isolate for 7 days (start this process again).

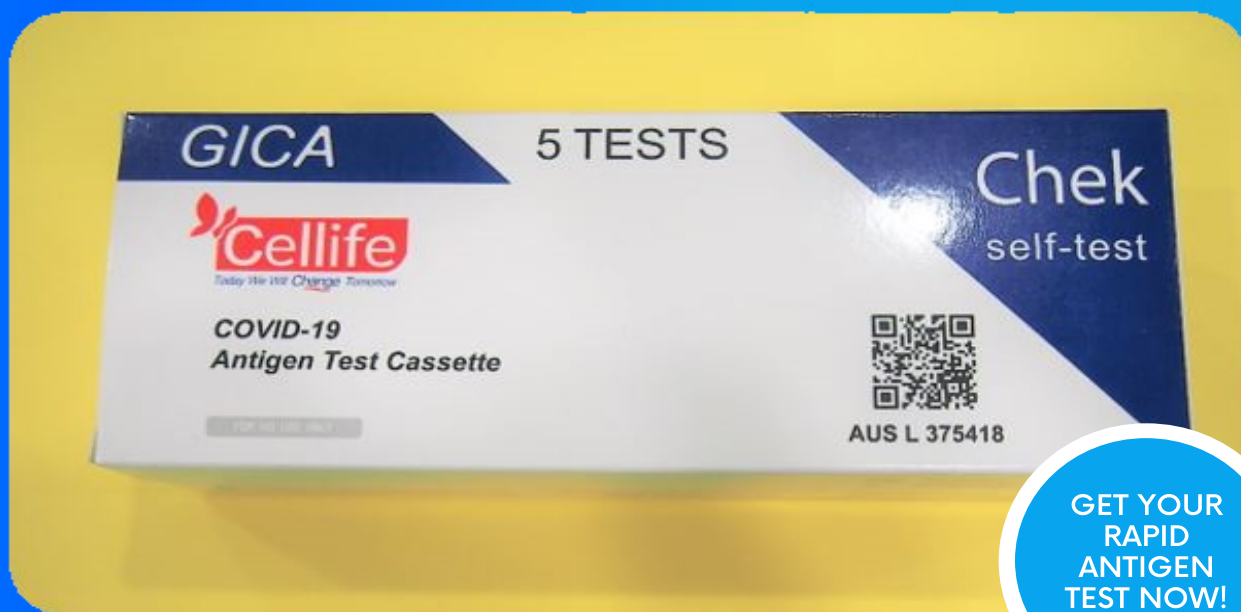

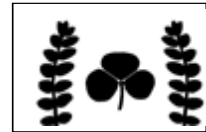
