## Welcome back to another CEO corner for 2022...

...and the weather seems to be in the process of turning with a bit of rain about this week. Thanks to those who turned out for the Annual Electors Meeting a couple of weeks ago. From a compliance perspective our Annual Report has been signed off by the Auditors without too many glaring concerns.

A reminder that following the recent bushfire events around Corrigin and Babakin, DFES will be running a “Bushfire Safety Workshop” for community members and those generally not involved with VBFB. DFES recognises communication challenges between DFES and the community during these recent events and provide community members with an opportunity liaise directly with DFES and will focus on the “keys to survival” during a bushfire and will be held at FRC on Thursday 31st March 2022 at 5pm. Topics include:

- Understanding bushfires and warnings
- Deciding when to leave early or stay and defend
- Identifying hazards around your home
- Preparing yourself and your family
- Preparing a Bushfire Survival Plan

The long awaited FRC Court Refurbishment project is well underway. Things seems to be tracking ahead of schedule

with the courts likely available for use after Easter.

The Works Crew have just completed works on reconstructing 9 kilometres of Fence Road South in the Dudinin area. This project was over \$2M and represents one of the largest road projects ever delivered by Council in a single year. Well done to Judd, the Works Crew and all the local contractors that assisted in the delivery of the project. Next year, the budget is even bigger as \$3M sees more works on Fence Road South right through to the Dumbleyung border.

The Works crew and contractors have continued to work on other local projects, including the sealing of Medical Centre Car Park and will next week finish the Jilakin Street intersection.

The Kulin Aquatic Centre season has come to a close, albeit a few days earlier than expected due to the weather. Congratulations to Jones and his team on another busy season. Whilst most weekends the pool and slide are busy, he’s also fitted in some significant events including:

- Australia Day
- KDHS Faction Swimming Carnival
- Kulin Triathlon
- Interschool Swimming Carnival
- Water Aerobics.

It looks like COVID has finally made its way to town. This has been a matter of time, but I’m

sure the community will handle the challenges as individuals and a collective. Unfortunately, it is something that is going to be part of everyone’s lives in the immediate future and we will all have to adapt.

The community may have noticed a few challenges with the Shire run fuel facility. This is something we are working through. Fiona and Annie are in the process of procuring a new payment terminal, which will be online late June. Hopefully the issues with the existing one aren’t too bad between now and then, and changeover is relatively smooth. We thank everyone for their patience as we deal with this challenging issue.

School holidays, winter sports season, Easter and ANZAC Day are all on the radar in the coming months. As always plenty happening in Kulin, until next time safe travels.

Included in this edition of the Kulin Update are some revised access guidelines which have been formed to better define the parameters for FRC access. I have included a copy of the guidelines:



## **FRC ACCESS GUIDELINES – REVISED ADVICE - G. Yandle, CEO**

Please be advised of the following changes to public access privileges to the Freebairn Recreation Centre. Where necessary, please ensure these are communicated to your children.

### FRC Gym

- Access is to change to be accessible via its own separate external door with lockbox code.
- Code to be obtained from FRC Manager.
- Access from gym to courts will be removed when FRC is not staffed.

### FRC Courts

- Access will only be during times when centre is staffed, unless organised by prior arrangement with FRC Manager.

### Under 18

- Access to FRC Courts when FRC Bar is open only up until 7pm if unaccompanied by an adult.
- Access to FRC Courts if participating in organised sport or event.
- If parent or guardian is present at FRC Bar then individuals can use courts up until closing time.

### Over 18

- Access to FRC Courts when FRC is open only up until closing time, unless organised by prior arrangement with FRC Manager.



## Freebairn Recreation Centre - Manager

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An exciting opportunity has arisen for an energetic and self-motivated person for the position of Freebairn Recreation Centre Manager at the Shire of Kulin. The successful applicant will be responsible for the daily operations of the Freebairn Recreation Centre including bar, staff, stock control and reconciliation of bar products as well as the bookings, scheduling and promotion of sporting fixtures and other functions.

Our recreation centre is the home to all local sporting clubs and is busy in both winter and summer sports seasons. Facilities within the complex include 2 large function rooms with commercial bar and kitchen facilities, two indoor netball/basketball courts, a hockey field, football/cricket oval, 12 rink bowling green, 8 tennis courts, an 18 hole golf course and a small gymnasium/fitness centre.

# RAINWATER TANK REBATE

## Rainwater Tank Rebate

### Did you know?

Installing a rainwater tank could save you up to 20% of your in-house water use each year? A 125m<sup>2</sup> roof area can collect up to 51,000 litres of water annually, helping to supply part of your household's water needs.

To help you save precious water and adapt to climate change, we're offering a rebate on the cost of purchasing, replacing, or plumbing in an existing rainwater tank to your toilet and/or washing machine.

This rainwater tank offer is available to eligible customers until 31 May 2022.

### Where to start?

There are a few things to consider before you buy a rainwater tank. How much does a rainwater tank cost? What size rainwater tank do you need? To help you get started, [read our quick guide to rainwater tanks.](#)

### Rainwater tank offer

This waterwise rebate is available to Water Corporation customers connected to scheme water in various locations. Kulin is amongst them.

If you're eligible, you can apply for one of the following rebates:

New rainwater tank and plumbing - up to a maximum of \$1,000 for a new rainwater tank with a capacity of 2,000L or more that is plumbed.

OR

Plumbing in an existing rainwater tank - up to a maximum of \$500 for the rainwater tank with a capacity of 2,000L or more.

OR

Replacing an existing plumbed in rainwater tank - up to a maximum of \$500 for the rainwater tank with a capacity of 2,000L or more.

### How to apply for the rainwater tank offer

1. Complete, sign and submit the application form.
2. Include a copy of the tax invoice for the purchase of your rainwater tank.
3. Include the licensed plumber's declaration, as well as a copy of the tax invoice and receipt for plumbing work

## Kulin childcare happenings

Our programme this week has been centred around “Harmony Week” which is a wonderful time for early childhood services to celebrate and raise children’s awareness and appreciation of the diverse cultures around them, and encourages young children to share the message that ‘everyone belongs’. We have been learning this in so many fun ways - painting friendship hands, paper doll chains to resemble friends and family, and discussions about differences and sameness, foods and cultures. We have also been playing lots of group games that encourage cooperation.

We are also exploring sustainability, the 3 R’s – Recycling, Repurposing and Reducing. Teaching children to care for the environment is a learning experience that is an important part of growing up. It gives them skills in respect, empathy, patience, responsibility, and teaches them about consequences. But it also teaches them valuable lessons about sustainability and how we want to leave the world for future generations. Showing children how to recycle properly is like passing the baton to them for a cleaner and brighter future.

We are doing this in many ways, from using different colour lidded bins for the children to put their waste into, a “chook” bucket that we can put our scraps into



for our chickens, worm farm and compost bins, gardening, using recyclables for our art and crafts, catching water when it rains to put onto our garden, making our own paper and turning old material into pod bags and material to tie dye. We are also reusing scrap wool for our knitting projects.



Loose parts play is also a good way of repurposing “rubbish,” we love to use our tools to pull things apart whenever items are donated to the centre. We also use wood offcuts, sawdust and computer discs for our creations – we can turn just about anything into treasures!!

Our sustainability project this week is using up clear plastic containers and turning them into mini hot houses where we are planting some heirloom seeds for our



Autumn vegie garden. We would like to thank Jayde for her very kind and prompt donation of the rain gauge – hopefully we will put it up in time for the first rains

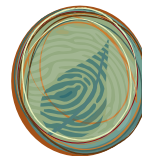

## **INCREASE COUNTRY FUEL CARD AND OVERHAUL PATS, DAVIES**

**29<sup>th</sup> March 2022**

The Opposition has called for the McGowan Government to ease cost-of-living pressures on West Australians by increasing the value of the Country Age Pension and Emergency Services Volunteer fuel cards as petrol prices across the nation soar to record levels.

Local Member for Central Wheatbelt Mia Davies MLA said the value of the Country Age Pension Fuel Card had not been increased for the entire time Labor has been in Government.

“The McGowan Government has a \$5.8 billion surplus and plenty of scope to assist those on fixed incomes with limited or no access to public transport in regional WA,” Ms Davies said.

“Boosting the Country Age Pension Fuel Card would make a swift and significant difference to regional pensioners doing it tough.”

Ms Davies said the McGowan Government had introduced cost savings for public transport users in the Perth metropolitan area by slashing train and bus fares.

“In the regions we are reliant on our own vehicles to remain mobile, attend medical appointments, and visit loved ones,” Ms Davies said.

“The McGowan Labor Government has failed to increase the value of the Country Age Pension Fuel Card for the past five years in line with increased cost of living.

“Petrol prices have spiked and the value of the card has effectively been halved.”

Ms Davies said the Opposition is also calling for an increase in the Patient Assisted Travel Scheme (PATS) rebate.

“The 16-cent subsidy buys just 73 millilitres of fuel at current fuel prices and that’s just ridiculous,” she said.

“It needs to be increased in the upcoming budget to reflect the challenges we are facing with fuel prices.

“We don’t want people postponing travel to specialist appointments so they can put food on their tables or meet other household expenses.”

## AgMove fact sheet - relocation assistance to take up short term agricultural work

### What is AgMove?

AgMove is a reimbursement of costs for eligible people who relocate to take up **short-term agricultural work**, including harvest work.

If you move away from home to take up **short-term agricultural work**, you may be able to get financial help to cover the costs of your move.

### Am I eligible for AgMove?

From 1 November 2020, relocation assistance is available to people who are at least 18 years of age who relocate to a regional, remote, or harvest area to take up **short-term agricultural work**.

From 5 May 2021, 17-year-old job seekers who have graduated from Year 12 can also access AgMove.

This includes Australian job seekers; Australians who are not receiving income support such as 'grey nomads'; and those with the right to work in Australia such as working holiday makers and international students.

Seasonal workers who are in Australia under the Seasonal Worker Programme or Pacific Labour Scheme are not eligible for AgMove.

### How much money can I receive?

If you have relocated and started a short-term agricultural job between **1 November 2020 and 4 May 2021**, you need to complete at least 120 hours of work over at least 6 weeks to be eligible for reimbursement up to:

- \$6,000 if you are an Australian worker
- \$2,000 if you are a temporary visa holder with a general right to work in Australia.

If you relocate to start a short-term agricultural job between **5 May and 30 June 2022**, you need to complete at least 40 hours of work over 2 weeks to be eligible for reimbursement up to:

- \$2,000 if you are an Australian worker
- \$650 if you are a temporary visa holder with a

If you continue to work for at least a total of 4 weeks and complete 120 hours of short-term agricultural work, you could be eligible to be reimbursed up to a total of:

- \$6,000 if you are an Australian worker
- \$2,000 if you are a temporary visa holder with a general right to work in Australia.

The maximum amount of AgMove assistance is \$6,000 for Australian workers and \$2,000 for temporary visa holders with a general right to work in Australia.

### Where can I move to?

When you relocate to take up **short-term agricultural work**, your new location in Australia must:

- be at least 90 minutes drive away from where you currently live, based on your normal mode of transport
- be in one of the 16 Harvest Areas (served by Harvest Trail Services providers) or a regional or remote area
- not be within the same capital city or in a metropolitan area.

### Who do I contact to apply for AgMove?

- If you have any general inquiries about AgMove, call the National Customer Service Line on **1800 805 260**.
- People looking for work who are interested in Harvest work can find job opportunities at <https://jobsearch.gov.au/harvest/search>.
- Jobs advertised with a Harvest Trail Services logo include contact details for the relevant [Harvest Trail Services provider](#) who will be able to help you apply for relocation assistance.
- People looking for non harvest jobs in agriculture (such as work with livestock or on dairy farms) or for harvest jobs outside Harvest Areas, can call the **Harvest Trail Information Service** on **1800 062 332** for assistance.



## How will I receive AgMove assistance?

- You will have to pay for your relocation costs, and you will be reimbursed by your Harvest Trail Services or Harvest Trail Information Service provider.
- If you are in financial hardship and cannot afford to relocate to start a short-term agricultural work, your [Harvest Trail Services provider](#) or Harvest Trail Information Service provider may be able to pay your relocation costs upfront.

## What can I use AgMove for?

AgMove relocation assistance is flexible and can be used for a range of items, including:

- Accommodation costs such as rent, motel, caravan, or campsite fees
- Travel costs such as fares, petrol, car hire
- Some employment-related expenses such as safety clothing, uniforms, and work boots.

A Harvest Trail Services provider or the Harvest Trail Information Service provider will consider if you can receive assistance as a reimbursement, payment directly to the supplier or where financial hardship is assessed, an upfront payment to cover basic costs.

AgMove is a reimbursement of costs to eligible people who move to take up a **short-term agricultural job**. It is not a grant or an entitlement and cannot be used for non-work related or luxury items, such as travel costs for a holiday, or for the purchase of designer sunglasses, hats or sneakers.

## What is short-term agricultural work?

You can get AgMove if you relocate to take up **short-term agricultural work**, including:

### Harvest Work

- Production of harvest crops, including picking and pollinating
- Planting and preparation for planting of harvest crops
- Propagation of harvest crops, including growing new plants from seeds
- Processing and packing operations for harvest crops and packing shed operations
- Local storage and transportation of harvest crops

### Livestock and Dairy Work

- Manufacturing dairy produce from raw material
- Immediate processing of animal products, including shearing, butchery, packing and tanning
- Livestock laboring: feeding, breeding, and raising livestock

## What are my responsibilities?

You must have:

- received and accepted an offer of employment for agricultural work, including harvest work, (with a confirmed job start date and pay and conditions); or
- commenced agricultural work, including harvest work, after 1 November 2020; and
- entered into an AgMove Agreement with your Harvest Trail Services provider.

To receive relocation assistance, you will be required to give the following to your Harvest Trail Services provider:

- invoices, receipts, or other evidence of valid relocation costs to be reimbursed to you or directly to a supplier
- any other additional evidence, including quotes if requested
- if you are not placed into a job by your Harvest Trail Services provider, a copy of the offer of employment with full contact details of your employer, such as ABN, address, and contact telephone number.

## Time for G2G system to be dropped

28 March 2022

The Opposition has called for the State's G2G Pass system to be dropped, saying it was an unnecessary burden for travellers given Western Australia no longer has a hard border.

Opposition Leader Mia Davies said there were other ways to check vaccination status, using certificates and the ServiceWA app.

"We have a highly vaccinated population, COVID-19 already in our community, and other methods of checking vaccinations, making the G2G Pass redundant," Ms Davies said.

"Why should people who want to visit loved ones, conduct business, or simply see what Western Australia has to offer, not be allowed to just show their vaccine certificate?"

"WA remains the only state or territory in the country to still use border passes - it is time for the G2G Pass requirement to be removed."

Ms Davies said the G2G Pass had not only caused unnecessary frustration for travellers, but also took up police resources and time as officers remain posted at WA's borders.

"The application has been consuming vital police resources that could be better directed elsewhere," she said.

"Through Operation Tide, we know there are as many as 200 police officers tasked with managing and checking the G2G Pass system, including at our borders and airports.

"This drain on vital staff in the WA Police force comes as we see out-of-control youth crime in regional WA and vicious, unprovoked attacks in Northbridge.

"The G2G Pass should be dropped to allow police to resume their usual duties, and if the Premier won't bin the requirement, then he should at least reveal an end date."

Ms Davies said West Australians finally had a light at the end of the pandemic tunnel with Level 2 restrictions being eased from next week.

"We have been calling for this certainty for weeks and welcome the announcement by the Premier so that businesses, community organisations and those trying to plan events in coming weeks can get on with it.

"We have opened our borders, and in the McGowan Government's own words, our hospitals are coping with COVID-19 in the community.

"We now call on the Government to provide clarity and justification for the mandates that remain in place and for how long the State of Emergency provisions will remain in place.

"The West Australian public deserves transparency when it comes to rules and restrictions that impact their lives and livelihoods."

#### Where do I get one?

Visit your local government to collect a free pulse oximeter for you and your household (each eligible household can receive one pulse oximeter but supplies are limited). Do **not** pick up a pulse oximeter if you are already COVID-19 positive. 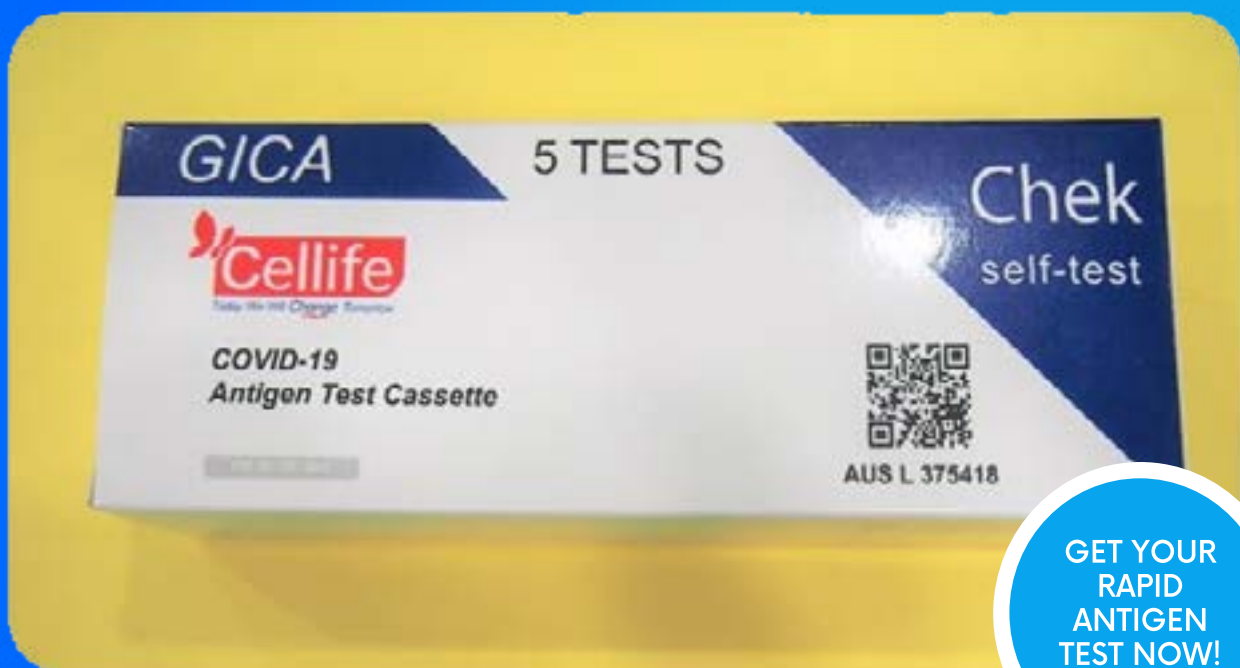

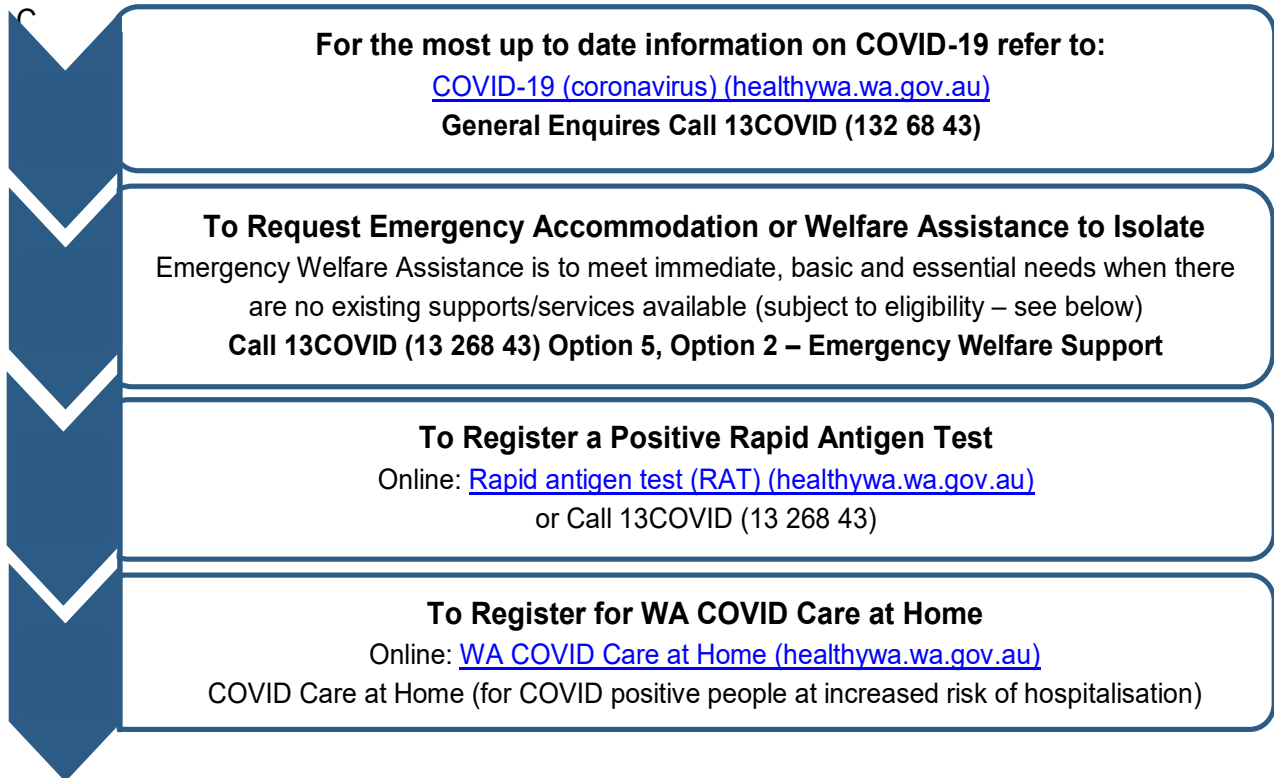

## Community Service Support Referral Pathway for COVID Positive People



**Communities will conduct a welfare assessment to determine the individual’s needs and capacity to self-manage.**

**To be eligible for emergency welfare services a person must:**

- be currently located in Western Australia, and
- require emergency welfare support within the following Welfare Domains.

**Welfare Domains – To meet immediate, basic and essential needs while isolating:**

Emergency Accommodation	Requests for emergency accommodation are subject to an assessment based on public health infection control principles
Emergency Food	Includes essential food items * Excludes alcohol and tobacco
Emergency Clothing & Personal Requisites	Basic essential clothing, toiletries and baby-care items
Personal Support Services	Continuity of existing care remains the responsibility of the provider Includes general information to assist people to access necessary supports or self-support * Excludes psychosocial, medical or clinical support



## COVID-19: Testing and isolation protocols



### I have tested positive for COVID-19

With COVID-19 in the community, it is important for you to know what to do to keep yourself and others safe. This protocol will help you know when and how long you need to isolate for if you are COVID-19 positive.

If you return a positive Rapid Antigen Test (RAT), you must register your result with the Department of Health.

Isolate at home for 7 days.



No symptoms after 7 days  
No further test is required.



Symptoms on day 7  
Remain in isolation until symptoms cease.



OR

You can leave home. Wear a mask indoors and outdoors for the next 7 days.



You are cleared by a medical professional.



Symptoms include:



Fever



Sore/scratchy throat



Runny nose



Fatigue



Shortness of breath



Dry cough





## COVID-19: Testing and isolation protocols



### I am a close contact and have no symptoms

With COVID-19 in the community, it is important for you to know what to do to keep yourself and others safe. This protocol will help you know what to do if you are a close contact but have no symptoms.

Isolate for 7 days from date of contact.



Monitor for symptoms.



#### Symptoms

Refer to 'I am a close contact who develops symptoms' protocol.



No symptoms  
Take a RAT on day 7.



#### Test positive

Refer to the 'I have tested positive to COVID-19' protocol.



#### Test negative

You can leave your home after day 7 of isolation, providing there are no new cases in your household. For the next 7 days, wear a mask indoors and outdoors and don't visit high risk settings (exemptions apply).



If someone in your household tests positive, isolate for 7 days (start this process again).

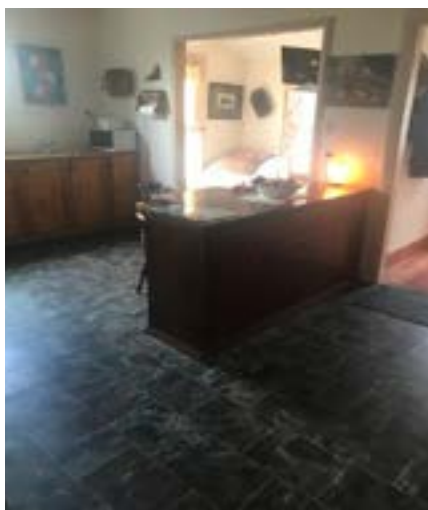
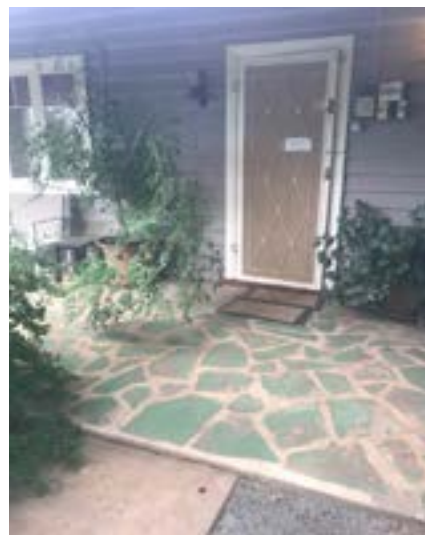

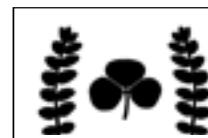
