## Are you Bushfire Ready? Q&As!

This was one of many questions answered by Anika Keeling (DFES Business and Training Support Officer) and Danielle van Rooyen (DFES Volunteer Management Support Officer) during the two-hour Bushfire Safety Workshop which took place two weeks ago at the Freebairn Recreation Centre in Kulin.

The major questions answered during this workshop were

- 1) How to prepare for a bushfire?
- 2) How to get notified about a bushfire?
- 3) How to receive updated information on a current bushfire?
- 4) Decision-making – leaving or staying?
- 5) When to leave?
- 6) Where to go to?
- 7) Who to call?
- 8) What to put into an Emergency Kit?

### Preparation

Annika explained that the best chance of surviving a bushfire is to PLAN what you would do if one was to come your way. Even

if you intend to stay and defend your property, you still need a backup plan. Take five minutes now with your household or neighbour to discuss these three simple questions:

- When will you know to leave?
- Where will you go?
- Which way will you go?

### How do I get notified about a bushfire?

If a bushfire approached and threatened the Kulin region, the community would be notified by wailing sirens and/or emergency service personnel knocking on residents' doors asking them to evacuate.

### How do I keep informed when a bushfire approaches my region?

The state-owned website [www.emergency.wa.gov.au](http://www.emergency.wa.gov.au) provides current information on official warnings and alerts for bushfires, storms, cyclones, and floods. If the internet connection fails, listening to the ABC Local Radio or 6PR Emergency Bulletins is recommended.

- DFES also advises making sure that your phone company has your up-to-date details. A telephone warning might be sent to your mobile phone or landline in extreme circumstances. This warning system (Emergency Alert) uses the address held by your phone company. DFES recommends keeping your address details up to date with your phone company to give yourself the best chance of receiving a warning if one is issued.

### Decision making:

Whether you decide to leave or whether you are prepared enough to defend your property will depend on a case-to-case scenario and your personal conditions. Information on how to prepare your home in the worst-case scenario is available at the Kulin CRC or at <https://www.dfes.wa.gov.au>.

### When to leave?

Waiting to see flames before you evacuate is too late. You must at all times be prepared to activate your own plan, so DFES. With only a limited number of fire

trucks and emergency service personnel, you cannot depend on others when a bushfire threatens.

### Where to go?

If the Kulin region was under threat, the evacuation centre would not be in Kulin. Depending on the weather conditions residents would be advised on a case-to-case scenario which of the surrounding towns would be the safest to head towards.

### Summary:

DFES eminently emphasises the importance of having a plan, checklists to conduct the plan and an Emergency Kit with essential items ready to go. It is important to stick to your plan to ensure that in an emergency every family member knows what to do. Having a plan and a

### Who to call?

Make sure you call someone when you are leaving and when you get to your location, so they know you are safe.

### The Emergency Kit

Please refer to pages 6 and 7 for details on what an emergency kit could look like. In addition to the Emergency Kit checklist, Anika Keeling recommended scanning all important documents including prescriptions onto a hard drive/ thumb drive. Pharmacies are likely to accept these documents in an emergency to get access to required medication. Kids' entertainment and personal items that are essential for family members (e.g. glasses) should also be part of a bag

checklist helps to remain calm and to keep a clear mind when the adrenaline kicks in.

### Further information

The Department of Fire & Emergency Services offers a variety of information on how to prepare for bushfires or general emergencies. Brochures, information leaflets, fridge magnets, and emergency checklists are freely available at the Kulin Shire office Mon-Fr 8:30 am – 4:30 pm. The Shire of Kulin encourages the community to be prepared and to use the available information. According to DFES “the biggest killer is indecision. To survive a bushfire you must make your own decisions.”

## PREPARING YOUR EMERGENCY KIT

This kit can be used for all types of disasters, not just bushfires. To prepare your Emergency Kit you will need a bag large enough to fit all the items and an easily accessible spot in your home where it can be permanently stored.

Everyone in your household should know where the Emergency Kit is kept.



### ESSENTIALS

Prepare before bushfire season

- Drinking water
- Portable battery operated radio with spare batteries
- Waterproof torch
- First Aid Kit
- Candles/waterproof matches
- Woollen blanket
- Emergency contact numbers
- Bushfire protective clothing** (see back)

### IMPORTANT EXTRAS

Pack on the day of a disaster

- Wallet, keys and phone with charger
- Medication and toiletries
- Specific requirements for your family members
- Important documents and valuables (in a plastic bag)
- Spare clothes
- Combination pocket knife

### PACKING FOR PETS

- Food, water and bowls
- Bedding
- Medication or special requirements
- Registration/microchip information
- Lead

## BUSHFIRE PROTECTIVE CLOTHING

It doesn't matter if you're staying or leaving, everyone needs protective clothing.  
Radiant heat from a bushfire can kill you from over two football fields away.

## **FRC ACCESS GUIDELINES – REVISED ADVICE - G. Yandle, CEO**

Please be advised of the following changes to public access privileges to the Freebairn Recreation Centre. Where necessary, please ensure these are communicated to your children.

### FRC Gym

- Access is to change to be accessible via its own separate external door with lockbox code.
- Code to be obtained from FRC Manager.
- Access from gym to courts will be removed when FRC is not staffed.

### FRC Courts

- Access will only be during times when centre is staffed, unless organised by prior arrangement with FRC Manager.

### Under 18

- Access to FRC Courts when FRC Bar is open only up until 7pm if unaccompanied by an adult.
- Access to FRC Courts if participating in organised sport or event.
- If parent or guardian is present at FRC Bar then individuals can use courts up until closing time.

### Over 18

- Access to FRC Courts when FRC is open only up until closing time, unless organised by prior arrangement with FRC Manager.

# RAINWATER TANK REBATE

## Rainwater Tank Rebate

### Did you know?

Installing a rainwater tank could save you up to 20% of your in-house water use each year? A 125m<sup>2</sup> roof area can collect up to 51,000 litres of water annually, helping to supply part of your household's water needs.

To help you save precious water and adapt to climate change, we're offering a rebate on the cost of purchasing, replacing, or plumbing in an existing rainwater tank to your toilet and/or washing machine.

This rainwater tank offer is available to eligible customers until 31 May 2022.

### Where to start?

There are a few things to consider before you buy a rainwater tank. How much does a rainwater tank cost? What size rainwater tank do you need? To help you get started, [read our quick guide to rainwater tanks.](#)

### Rainwater tank offer

This waterwise rebate is available to Water Corporation customers connected to scheme water in various locations. Kulin is amongst them.

If you're eligible, you can apply for one of the following rebates:

New rainwater tank and plumbing - up to a maximum of \$1,000 for a new rainwater tank with a capacity of 2,000L or more that is plumbed.

OR

Plumbing in an existing rainwater tank - up to a maximum of \$500 for the rainwater tank with a capacity of 2,000L or more.

OR

Replacing an existing plumbed in rainwater tank - up to a maximum of \$500 for the rainwater tank with a capacity of 2,000L or more.

### How to apply for the rainwater tank offer

1. Complete, sign and submit the application form.
2. Include a copy of the tax invoice for the purchase of your rainwater tank.
3. Include the licensed plumber's declaration, as well as a copy of the tax invoice and receipt for plumbing work

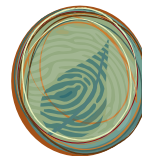


baby's area. These will be well utilised.

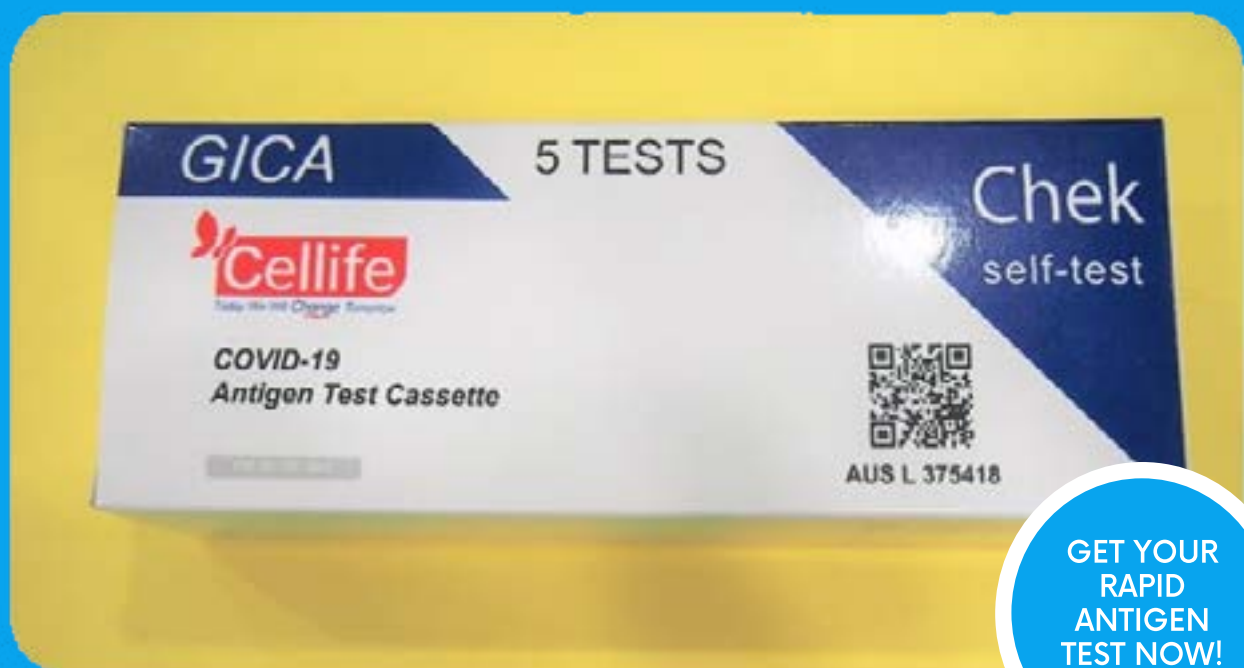

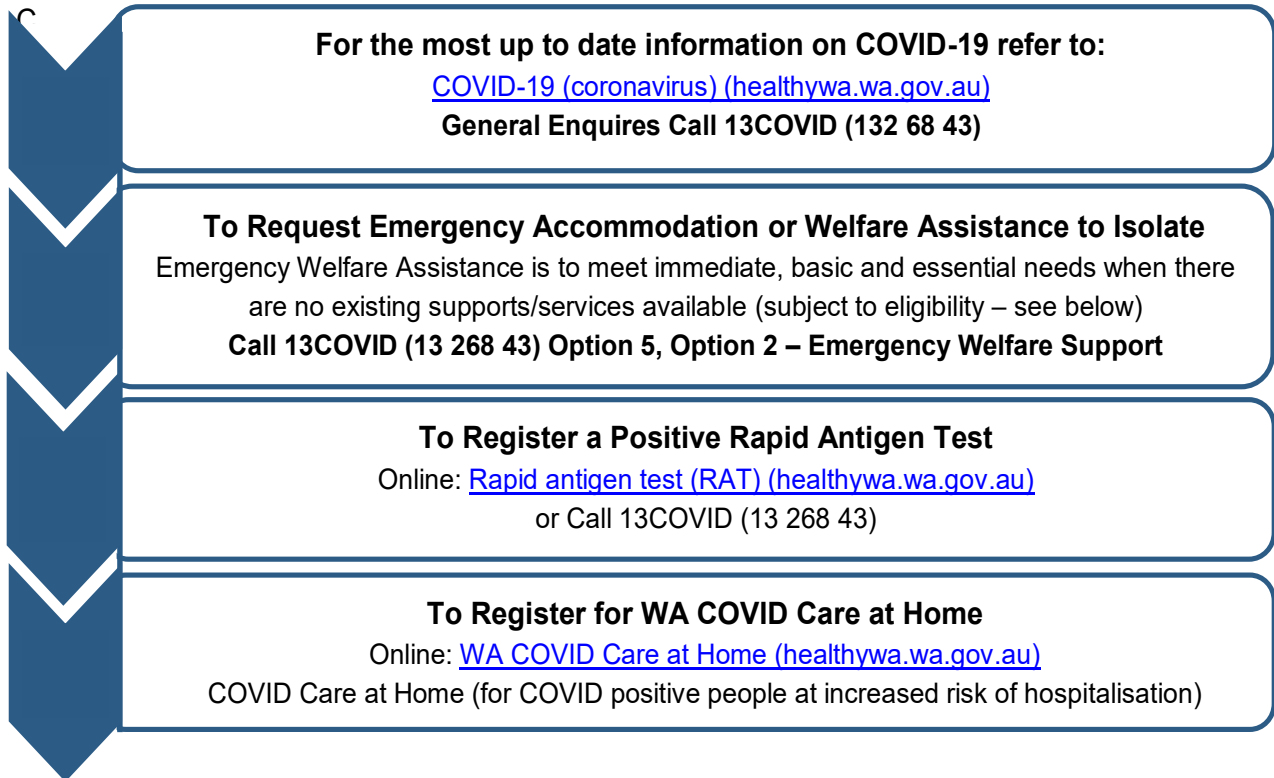

## Community Service Support Referral Pathway for COVID Positive People



**Communities will conduct a welfare assessment to determine the individual’s needs and capacity to self-manage.**

**To be eligible for emergency welfare services a person must:**

- be currently located in Western Australia, and
- require emergency welfare support within the following Welfare Domains.

**Welfare Domains – To meet immediate, basic and essential needs while isolating:**

Emergency Accommodation	Requests for emergency accommodation are subject to an assessment based on public health infection control principles
Emergency Food	Includes essential food items * Excludes alcohol and tobacco
Emergency Clothing & Personal Requisites	Basic essential clothing, toiletries and baby-care items
Personal Support Services	Continuity of existing care remains the responsibility of the provider Includes general information to assist people to access necessary supports or self-support * Excludes psychosocial, medical or clinical support



## COVID-19: Testing and isolation protocols



### I have tested positive for COVID-19

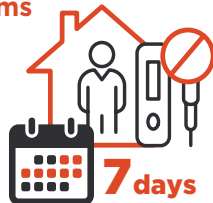
With COVID-19 in the community, it is important for you to know what to do to keep yourself and others safe. This protocol will help you know when and how long you need to isolate for if you are COVID-19 positive.

If you return a positive Rapid Antigen Test (RAT), you must register your result with the Department of Health.

Isolate at home for 7 days.



No symptoms after 7 days  
No further test is required.



Symptoms on day 7  
Remain in isolation until symptoms cease.



OR

You can leave home. Wear a mask indoors and outdoors for the next 7 days.



You are cleared by a medical professional.



Symptoms include:



Fever



Sore/scratchy throat



Runny nose



Fatigue



Shortness of breath



Dry cough



## COVID-19: Testing and isolation protocols



### I am a close contact and have no symptoms

With COVID-19 in the community, it is important for you to know what to do to keep yourself and others safe. This protocol will help you know what to do if you are a close contact but have no symptoms.

Isolate for 7 days from date of contact.



Monitor for symptoms.



#### Symptoms

Refer to 'I am a close contact who develops symptoms' protocol.



No symptoms  
Take a RAT on day 7.



#### Test positive

Refer to the 'I have tested positive to COVID-19' protocol.



#### Test negative

You can leave your home after day 7 of isolation, providing there are no new cases in your household. For the next 7 days, wear a mask indoors and outdoors and don't visit high risk settings (exemptions apply).



If someone in your household tests positive, isolate for 7 days (start this process again).

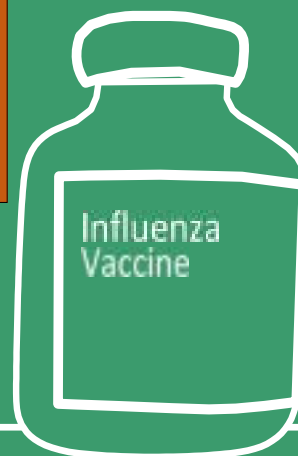
