Interview - Meet Claire Brennan



Please tell us a bit about yourself

Welcome back to another CEO corner for 2022...

After seeding got off to a flyer in late March early April, things seem to have tapered off weather wise, hopefully a bit more precipitation is on the radar for this week to kick start things off again.

Things are busy within the Shire office as work is in full swing putting together the 22/23 budget and finishing off the 21/22 projects. Next year poses to be another busy year with additional external funding assisting to fast track a number of initiatives outlined within the recently endorsed Strategic Community Plan. The challenge will be finding enough staff, local contractors and external contractors to deliver within the specified timeframes.

Last week we were informed by incumbent Federal Member, Rick Wilson, that we have been successful in obtaining \$3M over 4 years for the upgrade of 27km of Kulin-Holt Rock Road to become sealed all the way to South-East Hyden Bin via their Remote Roads Upgrade Program. This represents approximately \$750K per year in additional funding in our roads budget. Key funding for capital projects in 2022/2023 cumulating above \$5M includes:

- Regional Road Group \$375K
- Roads to Recovery \$530K
- Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network \$2.9M
- Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program \$600K
- Remote Roads Upgrade Program \$750K.

It's great to see the FRC Court Refurbishment project completed and the first fixtures held. Reports are the surface is more vibrant and "springy".

Stage 2 of the All Ages Precinct is also well underway with the Ninja Warrior Obstacle Course currently being installed. Hopefully works are completed by the end of May. This specific component will certainly be unique to Kulin and provide a challenging workout for locals young and old, plus attract a few tourists to town.




















































This fortnight we have been so busy at KCCC. We have been using up more of the wonderful donated wool to create more beanies and giant pom poms. Next project will be creating interesting items out of old jeans and bird nest bowls. We explored tie dying and coloured a huge amount of donated fabric that we sewed up to make some Mum and Child aprons for Mother's Day.

If you go past the centre you might spot the newly planted flowers at the entrance, or even spy some petunias popping up out of the jeans on the fence. Even though the weather is becoming cooler we are enjoying spending most of our day in the sunshine exploring the nature play areas, gardening and planting out our seedlings we have germinated in recycled containers, feeding the worms and chickens.

We have been looking after the chickens by clearing out their pen and adding the straw to the compost, collecting the eggs and picking vegies such as zucchini and tomatoes to use in our cooking. This week we made a delicious zucchini, tomato and herb quiche.

For a different group game, we set up our home made large "Kerplunk" which we had a blast taking turns to remove the sticks and not drop the balls into the bucket. We also enjoyed the lovely sunshine to explore the nature garden, using the logs as props for play, picking flowers, picnics on the lawn and simply enjoying the natural play spaces.

During Compost Awareness Week we learnt how to reuse

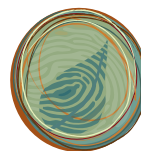

NOTICE OF BAITING PROGRAM FOR WILD DOGS

The Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group (EWBG) advises that from January 1st 2022 ongoing, heavy baiting programs (using 1080 meat baits) to control wild dogs will be carried out by Licensed Pest Management Technicians on Unallocated Crown Land to the east of the State Barrier Fence. In addition to 1080 baiting programs, technicians will be using foot hold traps treated with Strychnine to remove Wild Dogs that are currently impacting the livestock industry in the EWBG region.

From January 1st 2022, the standard wild dog control methods will be ongoing and this may include setting of traps and dispersing of 1080 meat baits in the groups operational area.

The poison baits will remain toxic for a number of months or until substantial rainfall is received. People are advised to take care when working within or visiting these areas.

Warning signs have been placed where applicable on Unallocated Crown Land and main access roads.

Picnic sites and recreational reserves are **not** included within the baiting program; however, baiting may take place adjacent to such areas and domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times.

1080 baiting is an integral part of the wild dog pest management program to protect livestock from death and injury caused by wild dogs.



Exercise caution to prevent your pets from being poisoned by 1080 baits.



If a wild dog is sighted, please report to the Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group immediately.



If poisoning occurs, contact a doctor or Poisons Information Centre (phone 13 11 26).

The WA Government's free RAT program has expanded, with thousands of more free RATs available for collection for close contacts across regional Western Australia.

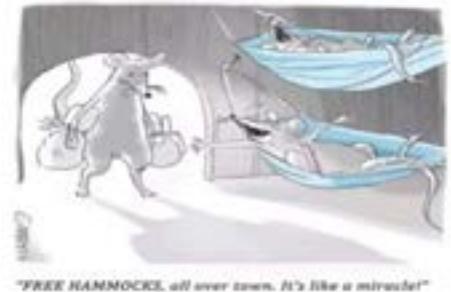
RATs will be available for collection at more than 70 additional regional COVID-19 testing sites across the state, in the Gascoyne, Goldfields-Esperance, Great Southern, Kimberley, Midwest, Peel, Pilbara, South West and Wheatbelt regions.

To access free RATs at these locations, people with no symptoms are required to verbally confirm they are a close contact to access their 10 free RATs. They may also collect RATs for other close contacts in their household up to a maximum of 30 RATs.

The additional locations support the testing protocols for asymptomatic close contacts who need to return a daily negative RAT. A full list of collection points can be read on the WA free RAT program page on WA.gov.au.
