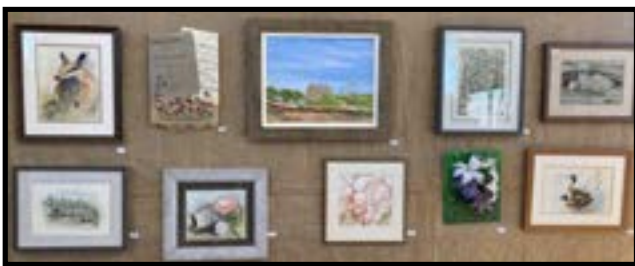

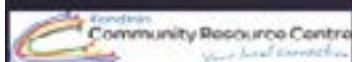

The Club and community hold a heavy heart with the sudden loss of John Wilson during the week due to a tragic farming incident. John 'Stretch' Wilson was a much loved member of our football club. He was what every country football club hopes occurs, with John playing juniors for the club, returning from school back to the family farm and committing to the club as a senior member/player. John's passion for all sports along with farming was very evident from a young age. He just loved all things sports, football, tennis, hockey, NFL, NBA, cricket you name it he knew the ins and outs of what was happening in all sports. His long levers gave him a distinct advantage in every sport he played, from a talented tennis player with a sharp serve, to an up and coming ruckman in the EDFL that could run all day. For the Kulin Kondinin Blues the past 5 years he has improved from a dominant reserves ruckman to an up and coming league player that could play back or in the ruck. John always rolled up to preseason in great nick, training the house down and barely missing a session. His running capacity as a tall man was his greatest strength along with his pride in his performance. John's growth as a footballer coincided with his growth as a person off the field. He loved any off field functions and always attended post season football trips, where his bond flourished with his peers. Stretch wasn't one to leave a party early. Any volunteer work required for the club John always obliged straight away. Whether it was bringing a plate for arvo tea or washing the dishes when the football club did dinner, John was there. leftover food which suited Stretch. The man could eat. No idea where the food went, the bloke had hollow legs, a testament to how much energy he burnt at work and on the sporting field. John's sudden passing has left a massive hole in our club. He was just 24 years old which is the same number he proudly wore on his back for the Blues. Johns funeral will be held in Kulin on the 4th of July.

School Proposal – Purpose of Sponsorship

Held early in the year (first half of Term 1) the Kulin District High School Belongingness Camp is designed to build school culture, a sense of camaraderie amongst our High School students and a sense of belongingness to our school and school community.

We work hard at our school to offer our High School (Years 7-10) as a viable option for students and their families, rather than students being sent to Boarding schools outside of our community. We want to be a choice parents and carers consider when thinking about the high school years for their children. We also have students from our feeder schools Kondinin PS, Hyden PS and Yealering PS join us in Year 7.

The Belongingness Camp at the beginning of the school year becomes an important time and adds something unique to Kulin DHS. 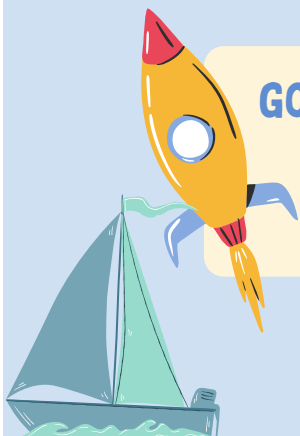

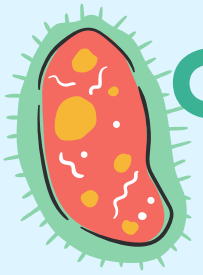

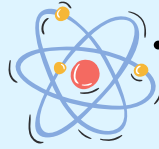


COVID-19, WHAT TO DO

I HAVE TESTED POSITIVE

What to do if you are a confirmed positive case:

- Isolate at home for 7 days,
- If you have no symptoms after 7 days, then no further test is required, and you can stop isolating
- If you have symptoms on day 7, stay in isolation until those symptoms clear or get clearance from a medical professional before leaving isolation
- Tell your close contacts and your workplace that you have COVID-19.

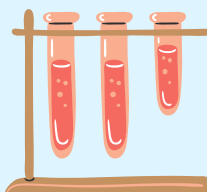
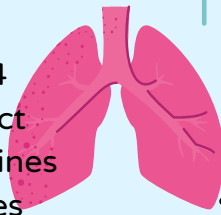


WHAT IS A CLOSE CONTACT?

- a household member or intimate partner of a person with COVID-19 who has had contact with them during their infectious period,
- someone who has had close personal interaction with a person with COVID-19 during their infectious period, where they spent 4 hours of cumulative contact with them in a residential setting (including a home, residential care facility, boarding school, maritime vessel, or other accommodation facility) in any 24-hour period where masks have been removed by both people during the period of contact
- someone who is informed by WA Health that they are a close contact.


I AM A CLOSE CONTACT WITH SYMPTOMS

- Take a PCR test or RAT within 24 hours of becoming a close contact
 - If positive – follow the guidelines for confirmed COVID-19 cases
 - If negative, isolate until symptoms resolve. If you took a RAT, take another RAT in 24 hours
- Take a PCR test on day 6 or RAT on day 7
- Once symptoms have resolved, close contacts who are not positive cases should follow the guidelines for close contacts with no symptoms for the balance of the 7-day isolation period
- If a close contact tests positive, they must isolate for 7 days after their positive test result and follow the guidelines for positive COVID-19 cases.

Close contacts who do not have symptoms can leave their place of isolation if they:

- Take a RAT and have a negative result on each day they would like to leave isolation
 - If positive – follow the guidelines for confirmed COVID-19 cases
- If symptoms develop, follow the guidelines for close contacts with symptoms
- Wear a mask at all times outside of the home
-  Avoid high-risk settings

Activity notice: Airborne survey over Kulin Project

Venture Minerals is exploring the broader Kulin area for nickel, copper, palladium and platinum and has scheduled an Airborne Electromagnetic (AEM) survey to start in August 2022. The survey is expected to take 2-3 weeks depending on weather. The flight path is from the Shire of Kulin to the northern part of the Shire of Dumbleyung. During this time you may observe a single pass by the helicopter along spaced flight lines 400 meters apart.

Further information, regarding timing notably, will be published in The Kulin Update closer to the survey starting date. A letter box drop will also be conducted for landowners residing, or with properties, within the survey area.

AEM survey: technicalities

AEM surveys are widely used by governments and industry for mapping rock types or finding conductive mineralisation hidden beneath the ground surface. In this case a helicopter fitted with electromagnetic instruments will record variations in the electrical conductivity of the ground without disturbing it. AEM surveys are non-invasive technologies and are not harmful to humans or livestock.

All flight plans have to be approved by the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) before start of the survey. The survey happens in daytime and involves a transmitter and a receiver loop dragged at a height of 35 metres above ground (terrain clearance may vary based on the pilot's judgement of safe flying conditions).

Survey results

Should any ground water body be noticed/hint upon by geophysicists, information will be passed on to the relevant landowner(s).
