- Be aware of your truck rating/capacity and the road Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV) rating – It is your responsibility to ensure you comply with the relevant regulatory requirements.

Roadworks have begun to reconstruct 4km of the Dudinin-Jitarning Road. Thank you to everyone for their patience while these works are being undertaken. Please ensure you abide by traffic management instructions and roadworks signage in place.

Kulin Arts Events



Kulin Arts' recent exhibition at the Kulin Community Arts Centre had no theme with a size restriction of no bigger than 30cm X 30cm on all exhibits. We encourage a range of 2D and 3D mediums. We were rewarded with 48 exhibits of watercolour painting, acrylics painting, oil painting, graphite pencils, coloured pencils, patchwork, kiln fired glass, ink pen, mosaics, pottery, hat making, mini tin horses, model building, digital art and photography. Exhibits came from artists in Kulin, Corrigin, Karlgarin, Merredin, Lake Grace and Hyden.



The People's Choice award—\$200 donated by Pat Trengove (Corrigin) - for this section went to Peyton Lewis (which she might have to share with her aunty who I believe nagged her to get it finished).



The children's section included 30 artworks done in Art classes at Kulin DHS. The People's Choice award—\$100 worth of art supplies—for this section goes to Aliyah Hemi (year B).

We had 194 adults and 68 children viewing our exhibition thanks to the Kulin Bush Races visitors in town. All money raised from our events go to the repairs needed at the Arts Centre. For the \$2 entry fee visitors went into the draw to win a pot plant and planter (made by Jock Carruthers).

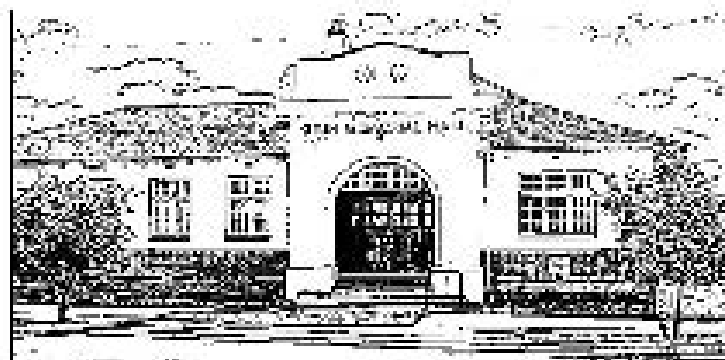

KNOW YOUR FIRE DANGER RATING

The Fire Danger Rating System has changed. Know the changes – they could save your life.

A new nationally consistent Fire Danger Rating System has been created. It's now simpler, clearer, and it could save your life. The new System has four levels. Each level tells you how dangerous a bushfire could be if one starts and comes with clear actions to take. The higher the Fire Danger Rating, the more severe the bushfire could be.

Fire Danger Ratings are important because they provide people with information so they can take action to protect themselves and others from the potentially dangerous impacts of bushfires. Ratings are calculated using a combination of weather forecasting and information about vegetation that could fuel a fire. They do not indicate the chance of a fire occurring, although this is a common misconception.

What do the ratings mean and what should I do?



Restricted Burning Period

The Shire of Kulin has entered its restricted burning period which runs from 19 September to 31 October.

A permit for burning is required and may be obtained by contacting your local bush fire control officer.

Burning Dates

Restricted 19 September – 31 October 2022

Prohibited 1 November 2022 – 15 February 2023

Restricted 16 February – 15 March 2023

Rating	What to do?
No rating	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> On days when there is minimal risk, the Fire Danger Rating will be set to 'no rating'. Bushfires which start in these conditions are unlikely to spread in a dangerous or life-threatening way, but you will still need to remain alert and abide by local seasonal laws and regulations.
Moderate	<p>Plan and prepare Most fires can be controlled.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Stay up to date and be alert for fires in your area. Check your bushfire plan. If you do not have a plan, make one now.
High	<p>Be ready to act Fires can be dangerous.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> There's a heightened risk. Be alert for fires in your area. If a fire starts, your life and property may be at risk. Review your bushfire plan. If you do not have a plan, make one now. Leave bushfire risk areas if necessary.
Extreme	<p>Take action now Fires will spread quickly and be extremely dangerous.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> These are dangerous fire conditions. Put your bushfire plan into action. If a fire starts, take immediate action. If you and your property are not prepared to the highest level, plan to leave early. Avoid travel through bushfire risk areas
Catastrophic	<p>For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas If a fire starts and takes hold, lives are likely to be lost.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> These are the most dangerous conditions for a fire. It may be too late to make a bushfire plan. Prepare your emergency kit and choose where you will go and different ways to get there. Stay safe by going to a safer location early in the morning or the night before. Homes cannot withstand fires in these conditions. You may not be able to leave, and help may not be available. <p>Don't leave it too late to make a bushfire plan. Get prepared for bushfire season and create or update your plan now.</p>

Community Notice TO THE HOUSEHOLDER

The Kulin Shire has now completed all Town Fire Break Inspections. Letters will be sent out to those who have not yet cleared fire breaks on their property. Fire Breaks need to be done by **Monday 31st October 2022**, failure to comply will result in fines being issued.

Bush Fire Control is as follows:

"Land Area less than 1 hectare-

All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;

It be recommended that at least a 2m wide area, immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs."

For information any land of one hectare or above the rural provisions apply.

COMMUNITY CITIZEN AWARDS

Australia Day Awards promote national pride, community responsibility and participation.



Auspire – Australia Day Council WA presents the Community Citizen of the Year

Your local government invites you to nominate an outstanding individual or group for one of this year's Community Citizen of the Year Awards to be presented on Australia Day 26 January. The awards foster, recognise and celebrate significant contributions to community life and active citizenship in all local government areas of Western Australia. His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia is the Patron and signatory for the awards.

Guidelines and criteria

Each year three local citizens and one local community group in each local government area will be eligible for the Community Citizen of the Year Awards. The recipients will be selected from people and groups who have made a noteworthy contribution during the current year or given outstanding service to the local community over a number of years through active involvement.

Auspire - Australia Day Council WA provides four awards each year for presentation in each local government area. These prestigious awards are provided to your local government for presentation during Australia Day celebrations.

Nomination Process

Your local government invites nominations for the awards from community groups and private citizens. At the council's discretion, a committee comprised of people from community organisations and citizens, will be appointed to encourage and promote nominations. The committee or your local council may also make nominations based on local knowledge and experience.

Nominations open on 1 September and close on 31 October and can be received in hard copy on the original nomination form or online at www.citizenshipawards.com.au.

Nominations received after the closing date will be ineligible for this year's awards.

Selection Criteria

The winners will have been judged to have shown active citizenship and:

- Significant contribution to the local community.
- Demonstrated leadership on a community issue resulting in the enhancement of community life.
- A significant initiative which has brought about positive change and added value to community life.
- Inspiring qualities as a role model for the community.

Eligibility criteria

- Nominees should reside or work principally within the local authority making the award.
- Awards may be granted posthumously in recognition of recent achievements.
- Groups of people or couples will not normally be eligible except when meeting the criteria for a community group.
- A person may receive an award on more than one occasion in recognition of their particularly outstanding community contribution or involvement in an alternative initiative.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated in future years.
- Nominations must be apolitical in their nature and should not in any way bring the awards program or local government area into disrepute.
- Sitting members of State, Federal and Local Government are not eligible.

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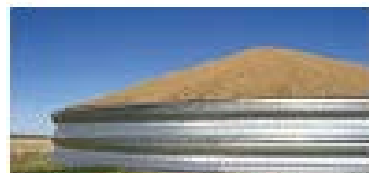
