Parking on & Obstructing Footpaths

Over the past few weeks, the Shire has received a number of complaints from residents regarding vehicles parking on Shire footpaths or trailers / caravans parked on footpaths for extended periods, to the point where footpaths are completely obstructed or impassable by pedestrians.

Obstruction of footpaths with vehicles / trailers / caravans can put pedestrians in danger, particularly children, parents with prams, wheelchair users, the elderly or people with visual impairments who are forced to walk onto the road to avoid the vehicle.

The Shire invests a lot of money towards maintenance and construction of footpaths for the benefit of residents. The Shire wishes to remind residents not to obstruct footpaths and be mindful of pedestrians access.

KULIN COMMUNITY ARTS CENTRE - ERIN BAILEY

Following on from a few weeks ago, I have organised a few more interviews for the KBR 2023 Funding Round. The Kulin Community Arts Centre is a non-for-profit community organisation passionate about connecting with and supporting art groups and individual artists within the Kulin community. The Council also offers art based activities, workshops and assistance with grant applications.

What Current Project Have You Been Able To Accomplish Due To Funding?

“We have completely renovated the main room of the Arts Centre”. The walls and ceiling have been redone with a grant of \$21,000 from the Kulin Bush Races. The Kulin Arts Centre have also paid for new lights that have been installed.

How Has The KBR Helped The Kulin Community Arts Centre?

The Kulin Arts Centre have before been given small grants for minor works. With the help from the Kulin Bush Races, the Arts Centre is able to run activities and exhibitions throughout the year. The money and works that have been done to the Arts Centre enable the longevity of the building. Which then is more enticing for members, locals and tourists.

What Has The Kulin Bush Races Done For Kulin And The Community?

“Definitely put Kulin on the map, not just by having the event, and having the event done so well. I have been involved with the Kulin Bush Races since the event had started and they haven’t had a bad year yet. With no food vans at this year’s event, this opens up different aspects and jobs for the volunteers. It is truly amazing with the amount of funds Kulin Bush Races have given back to the community.”

What Does The Kulin Bush Races Mean To You?

“Quite inspirational. I think they inspire volunteers. They inspire Kulin to survive. The fact that Kulin Bush Races have been going for so long and have had fantastic events is really something to be inspired by. The Kulin Bush Races committee makes the community want to do good things for Kulin.”

What Has The Community Arts Centre Done Or Contributed To For The Community?

The Kulin Community Arts Centre has been around for 50 years, in many different ways. This is the first time where they have created their own space to create activities and

displays. The country tends to be very sports orientated. This is great for the Arts Centre as it enables them to put activities on and have tourist, locals and other towns visit the Centre. They now have two exhibitions a year and multiple activities that run throughout the year. Most of it comes down to having an arts centre in Kulin for the community and for anyone and everyone. The Arts Centre is hoping to have more workshops for people to get involved. They don’t have to be good at art. Just coming down and seeing what the environment is like. The arts centre is available to anyone who wants to come down at any time.

Moving Forward, What Does The Kulin Community Arts Centre Hope To Achieve?

Just getting a lot more people exposed to any form of arts, drama, music any field. Just having an arts centre that can be that focus for people to come in and use.

BUSH FIRE INFORMATION

Burning Permits

Permits for burning will only be issued during the restricted burning period and are available from your local Fire Control Officer.

Permits will only be issued if the Fire Control Officer is of the opinion that the weather conditions are suitable, and may apply restrictions. Failure to comply with the restrictions is an offence.

When a Fire Control Officer refuses to issue a permit, he must advise the Chief Executive Officer that the permit has been refused and details of the grounds for refusal to ensure that a permit is not obtained from another officer.



Protective Clothing

Do you require Protective Clothing for the Bush Fire Season?

A duty of care exists for a Fire Control Officer to ensure that persons attending an incident has appropriate PPE (personal protective equipment), the same responsibility rests with those attending so please ensure you wear the required clothing, otherwise insurance issues may arise.

The Kulin Shire cover the full cost of protective clothing (jackets and trousers) and pay 50% of the cost of Full Face Respirators & Filters (full cost is approx. \$330). Supply of jackets and trousers is only for **registered members of a bushfire brigade** within the Shire of Kulin, and if you have not placed an order in the past 5 years.

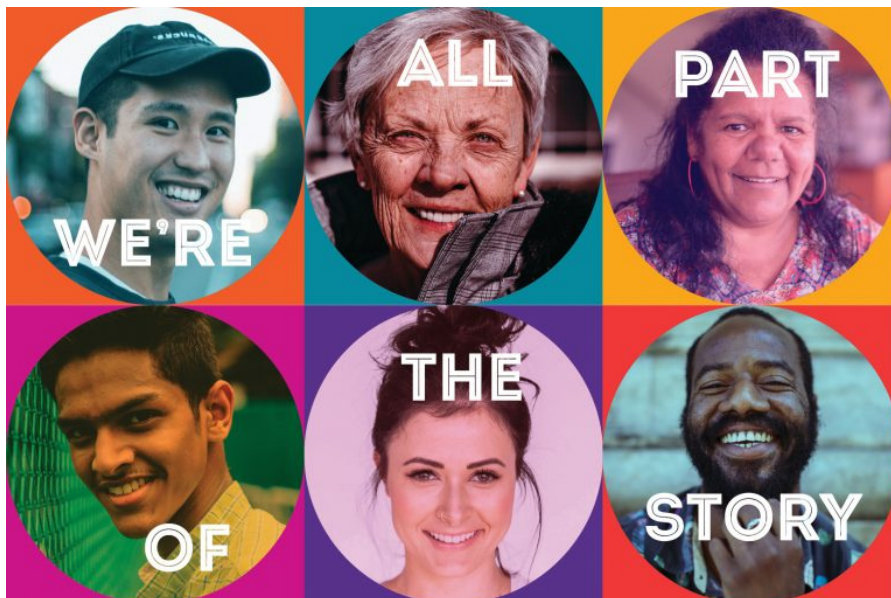

Criteria

Nominees for the individual award categories (Community Citizen of the Year, Young and Senior) must demonstrate active positive community engagement and meet the following criteria:

Significant contribution to the local community.

Demonstrated leadership on a community issue resulting in the enhancement of community life.

A significant initiative which has brought about positive change and added value to community life.

Inspiring qualities as a role model for the community.

Nominees for the group/event award category must demonstrate community engagement and meet any or all of the following criteria:

Group/event that creates community engagement.

Group/event that creates initiatives for new employment.

Created significant initiative that brought positive change.

All nominees should uphold standards of conduct that will not risk placing the Award Program or Local Government's reputation into disrepute.

Consideration should also be given to Gender, Age, Ethnicity, Cultural background and Field of Endeavour to help ensure recipients are representative of our diverse society.

Eligibility Criteria

A person must be nominated by another person to be considered for an Award. Self-nominations are not accepted. One nomination is sufficient; multiple nominations should not necessarily strengthen an individual's chances of selection.

Individuals can be recognised in one category only, so if they cross over multiple categories, a decision needs to be made which category they will be awarded in.

Nominees should reside or work principally within the local government authority presenting the award.

Awards may be granted posthumously in recognition of recent achievements.

Groups of people will not normally be eligible except when meeting the criteria for a community group.

A couple or partnership with equal standing for the achievement/contribution may be recognised in an individual category.

A person may receive an award more than once in recognition of outstanding continued community contribution or involvement in a different initiative.

Individuals must be at least 16 years of age on 26 January, though younger nominees may be considered for exceptional contribution. Definition of exceptional contribution is at the discretion of the local government/council selection committee.

Unsuccessful nominees/finalists may be nominated in future years.

Sitting members of State, Federal, and Local Government are not eligible.

R U OK?

Simple steps that could change a life.

1. Ask
2. Listen
3. Encourage action
4. Check in

A Conversation Could Change A Life

Got a feeling that someone you know or care about isn't behaving as they normally would? Perhaps they seem out of sorts? More agitated or withdrawn? Or they're just not themselves. Trust that gut instinct and act on it. Learn more about the signs and when it's time to ask R U OK?

By starting a conversation and commenting on changes you've noticed, you could help that family member, friend or workmate open up. If they say they are not OK, you can follow the conversation steps to show them they're supported and help them find strategies to better manage the load. If they are OK, that person will know you're someone who cares enough to ask.

Getting Ready To Ask

Before you can look out for others, you need to look out for yourself. And that's OK. If you're not in the right headspace or you don't think you're the right person to have the conversation, try to think of someone else in their support network who could talk to them.

To help you decide whether you're ready to start a meaningful conversation, as yourself:

Am I Ready?

- Am I in a good headspace?
- Am I willing to genuinely listen?
- Can I give as much time as needed?

Am I Prepared?

- Do I understand that if I ask how someone's going, the answer could be: "No, I'm not"?
- Do I understand that I can't 'fix' someone's problems?
- Do I accept that they might not be ready to talk? Or they might not want to talk to me?

Picked My Moment

- Have I chosen somewhere relatively private and comfy?
- Have I figured out a time that will be good for them to chat?
- Have I made sure I have enough time to chat properly?

R U OK? is calling on all of us to let the people you care about know you're here, to really hear them.

By taking the time for an R U OK? conversation and genuinely listening with an open mind, we can all help the people in our world feel supported and connected.

Let the people in your world know you're here, to here, to really here, because a conversation could change a life.

R U OK? Day 2023 is Thursday 14 September and is the national day of action when we remind Australians that every day is the day to ask, 'are you OK?' and start a meaningful conversation whenever they spot the signs that someone they care about might be struggling with life.



1. Ask



2. Listen



3. Encourage action



4. Check in



RUOK day is on the 14th / September / 2023. This wonderful initiative reminds us to ask those in our circle ‘Are You OK’? When we consider our circles, this should include our close family and friends (inner circle), our relatives, neighbours (middle circle) and those who we work with or know/notice in our great communities (outer circle).

Some workplaces, teams, clubs and individuals hold a RUOK get together such as RUOK morning tea. Following on from last month’s article a social event is good for our wellness, our Mental health, a great way to connect and be there for each other.

Asking someone ‘Are you OK’ is showing that you care. But what do we do when the person we ask RUOK replies ‘actually i’m not OK?’

This situation can be confronting and uncomfortable for both people. Remember the strength that the person who has said they are not OK has shown by reaching out, making themselves vulnerable and rescind by being strong and vulnerable yourself. Do this by being there. Reply with

something like “I’m listening tell me why you’re not OK?” Then allow the person to tell you. Remember a lot of the time the person who is not OK wants to release their thoughts and anxieties. **Listen Listen Listen.** Do not feel you need to offer advice or an opinion. Do not feel you need to try to ‘fix’ the situation for the person. Just be genuinely present. Even though inside you are thinking ‘I’m way out of my comfort zone here’ and don’t want to cause any more harm, acknowledge these feelings as real but don’t feel the need to express them. The power of being there and being present cannot be understated and can be all that the other person requires.

Do not say ‘I know how you feel’, because you don’t. You can say, ‘I can only imagine what your feeling right now’. Do not say ‘its time you moved on’, acknowledge the fact that everyone handles stress, grief and loss differently and uniquely. Never say ‘Harden up’ or ‘you’ll get over it’ no matter what you are personally feeling inside.

If your conversation is interrupted by someone else when being there for a person who is not OK. Be the person that changes the subject immediately. It’s up to the person who is not feeling OK to let others know that fact not you. You are the person that the not OK person has trusted and felt they can confide in. Respect this privilege.

The expert on knowing when we are not feeling OK is ourselves. So, listen to your mind and body.

As a counsellor I give my clients ‘Unconditional positive regard’. This means I know that the person who has had the strength to be vulnerable and confide in me, also has the strength and is best placed, to move forward in the way they feel is the right way for them to do so. I truly believe that everyone everywhere has some good in them no matter who they show me who they are. It’s not about me. I remind the person that they will get through this situation, and that I genuinely believe in their ability and strength to do so. I also commit to going on their journey alongside them; never leading them and never telling them what they need to do. I will ask them to consider a different view on their current present beliefs. Such as “I will never get through this”, I might suggest they say, ‘I cannot see how I’m going to get through this at this moment’. Ask if there has been a previous time when things were hard. “Tell me what you did to get through that situation”. Reminding them they have been able to get through a difficult situation before.

Most importantly if you feel the person needs to speak to a professional counsellor such as myself walk this walk with them and if needed be there when they are vulnerable but strong enough to make that initial call.

Checklist for claiming Farm Household Allowance

Farm Household Allowance helps farmers and their partners who are in financial hardship.

The easiest way to claim FHA is online at servicesaustralia.gov.au/farmhouseholdallowance

To claim online you need a myGov account linked to Centrelink.

You can establish your identity and get a Centrelink Customer Reference Number (CRN) online using myGov.

Once you've got your CRN you'll need to answer some questions to confirm the record is yours. Your new Centrelink online account will link to your myGov account.

Once your accounts are linked you can complete an online claim. You don't need to visit a service centre.

If you can't get a CRN online you can call us to prove your identity over the phone or in person. Read more about proving your identity at servicesaustralia.gov.au/identity

If you and your partner are both claiming FHA, you may be able to submit a combined claim.

If you can't claim online you can use a paper claim form.

For help to claim:

- call the Farmer Assistance Hotline on **132 316, Monday to Friday, 8 am to 8 pm**
- go to a service centre, Mobile Service Centre or Agent
- call the Rural Financial Counselling Service on **1300 771 741**.

Supporting documents

Every claim needs supporting information and documents. Use this checklist to help you gather the documents you need to give us.

To help get your payment faster, submit all your paperwork when you claim. You can upload your documents as a photo or pdf with your online claim.

Identity

- birth certificate, visa or citizenship certificate
- a primary document such as an Australian driver licence, birth certificate, visa or citizenship certificate
- a secondary document such as a bank ATM card
- your Centrelink Reference Number (CRN).

For a list of other documents you can use go to servicesaustralia.gov.au/identity

Income and assets form

You'll need to submit an Income and assets form*. With this form you'll need to give us:

- bank account statements for all accounts showing account names, account numbers and current balances at the time you submit your claim
- latest statements for all shares and investments, including shares required to be held by a farm enterprise
- payslips from employment income
- separation certificate if you stopped working in the last 12 months
- copy of your signed lease or tenancy agreement if you rent.

CHECKLIST FOR CLAIMING FARM HOUSEHOLD ALLOWANCE

Real estate form

You'll need to fill out a real estate form* for each property owned or partly owned by you or your partner. With this form you'll need to give us:

- rates notices
- loan documents showing any asset held as security
- latest loan statement showing current balance
- estimate value of water rights.

Business form

You'll need to fill out a Business form* for each business you or your partner are involved in.

Financial documents

- latest personal tax return for you and your partner. This isn't the tax notice of assessment
- latest business tax returns for you and your partner including financials. This includes profit and loss, depreciation schedule and balance sheet
- estimate of farming income for each separate farming business in profit and loss format for the current financial year
- Private trust form* and trust tax returns for each trust you and/or your partner are involved
- Private company form* and company tax returns for each company you and/or your partner are involved
- Compensation form* including statement of lump sum or ongoing income.

MATTERS OF INTEREST

Mr KEDDLE, charged with burning down a shed in town and lighting a bush fire near the school last December will have his next appearance in the Perth District Court on Friday 08/09/2023, where it is anticipated a Trial date will be set - He remains in custody.

POST OFFICE BURGLARY

Back on Friday 8 June 2023, a male person driving a stolen Toyota Rav4 broke into the Post Office in Kulin and stole items. He was arrested in

Ceduna on Monday 12 June 2023 and incarcerated in prison. He currently has 4 outstanding Warrants for his arrest in WA including for the offences he committed at the Kulin Post Office.

CAR v ROAD TRAIN CRASH

On Thursday the 30th of March 2023, a Saab convertible coupe driving north on Fence Road failed to stop at the "STOP" sign at the Williams-Kondinin Road intersection and collided with a fully loaded road train carry grain. The 2 female occupants although hospitalised overnight for examination and assessment were exceptionally lucky to walk away with minor injuries.

64AAA Certain driver (other than novice drivers) in excess of 0.00 Blood Alcohol Content

For this section, certain drivers are people who:

- Are subject to an order to disqualify from holding or obtaining a driver's licence imposed for an offence against section 63 or 67 or for a second or subsequent offence against 64 in the RTA;
- Do not hold a driver's licence because it has been cancelled under section 75 (2a) or (2b) in the RTA;
- Hold an extraordinary licence;
- Are a recently disqualified driver; or
- Are an alcohol offender (refer r.3 and 69C RT(AtD) Regulations 2014).

(Refer to section 64A(2) of the RTA).

64AAA also applies to a person who drives or attempts to drive a motor vehicle:

- that is equipped to seat more than 12 adult persons (including the driver) and the vehicle is carrying passengers, whether or not for hire or reward;
- that is an omnibus as defined in the Transport Co-ordination Act 1966, if the vehicle is carrying passengers for hire or reward;
- on which taxi plates are used or in respect of which a taxi-car licence has been issued, if the vehicle is carrying passengers for hire or reward;
- that has a gross combination mass exceeding 22.5 tonnes;
- that is a class of vehicle prescribed by the regulations and is being used to transport dangerous goods as defined in the Dangerous Goods Safety Act 2004.

(Refer to section 64A(5) of the RTA).

PET REGISTRATIONS (DOGS & CATS)



There is State Government legislation in place to ensure control and registration of dogs and cats in our community. The State Government also sets all of the registration fees associated with the control and registration of dogs and cats. The registration period for 1-year and 3-years expires on 31 October.

Each year from 1 June, new one-year pet registrations are half price. This registration is only valid through to 31 October, at which time it will be due for renewal.

The Shire of Kulin is responsible for enforcing and administering State Government legislation in our community. Registering and microchipping your pet makes it easier for our Rangers to help return your pet to you if they become lost.

WHEN TO REGISTER YOUR PET?

- **Dogs aged over three months are required to be microchipped and registered**
- **Cats aged over six months must be registered, microchipped and sterilised**

BASIC HOMEMADE BREAD | ANZAC BISCUITS

Basic Homemade Bread

Ingredients

- One package active dry yeast
- Three tablespoons plus 1/2 teaspoon sugar
- Two 1/4 cups warm water
- One tablespoon salt
- Six 3/4 cups bread flour
- Two tablespoons canola oil

Method

Step 1

In a large bowl, dissolve yeast and 1/2 teaspoon sugar in warm water; let stand until bubbles form on surface. Whisk together staying three tablespoons sugar, salt and three cups flour. Stir oil into yeast mixture; pour flour mixture and beat until smooth. Stir in enough remaining flour, 1/2 cup at a time, to form a soft dough.

Step 2

Turn onto a floured surface; knead until smooth and elastic, 8-10 minutes. Place in a greased bowl, turning once to grease the top. Cover and let rise in a warm place until doubled, one 1/2 hours.

Step 3

Punch dough down. Turn onto a lightly floured surface; divide dough in half. Shape each into a loaf. Place in two greased 9x5in loaf pans. Cover and let rise until doubled, one 1/2 hours.

Step 4

Bake at 375C until loaf is golden brown and sounds hollow when tapped or has reached an internal temperature of 200C, 20-25 minutes. Remove from pans to wire racks to cool.

TIPS

How Do You Use Yeast?

Yeast can be tricky at first, but once you learn how to proof yeast, you should be all set. The trick is to make sure the water is not too hot. Do not go higher than about 110 degrees.

How Do You Knead Bread?

Proofing bread allows the yeast to do it's work to help the dough grow. To proof bread, place the bread in a greased bowl and let rest in a warm, humid environment until it doubles in size.

How Do You Store Homemade Bread?

You can store homemade bread in a plastic bag or a bread box for maximum freshness. If you don't think you can finish it in a few days time, you can also freeze bread. Just wrap it up in plastic and pop in the freezer. It will keep for a few months.

Anzac Biscuits

Ingredients

- 1 1/4 cups plain flour, sifted
- 1 cup Uncle Toby's Traditional Rolled Oats
- 1/2 cup caster sugar
- 3/4 cup desiccated coconut
- 150g unsalted butter
- 2 tbsp golden syrup
- 1 1/2 tbsp water
- 1/2 tsp bicarbonate soda

Method

Step 1

Preheat oven to 170C. Place the flour, oats, sugar and coconut in a large bowl and stir to combine.

Step 2

In a small saucepan place the golden syrup and butter and stir over low heat until the butter has fully melted. Mix the bicarb soda with 1 1/2 tablespoons water and add to the golden syrup mixture. It will bubble whilst you are stirring together to remove from the heat.

Step 3

Pour into the dry ingredients and mix together until fully combined.

Step 4

Roll tablespoonfuls of mixture into balls and place on baking trays lined with non-stick baking paper, pressing down on the tops to flatten slightly.

Step 5

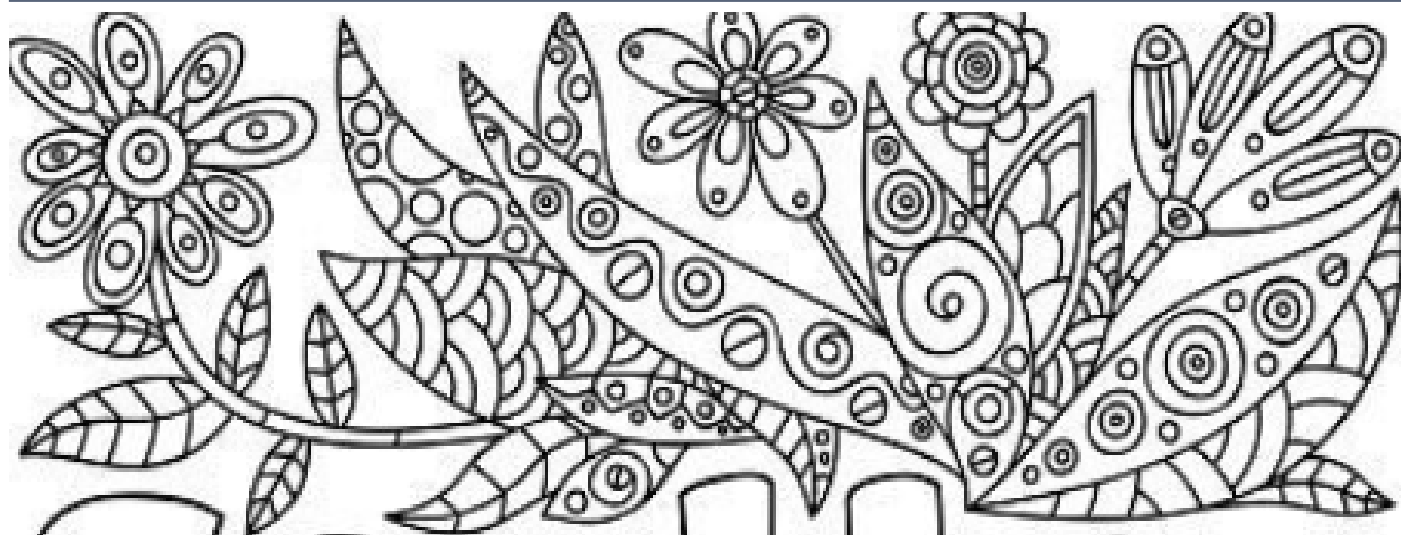
Bake for 12 minutes or until golden brown.

What Is The History Behind Anzac Biscuits?

It is not certain whether the Anzac biscuits we know, and love were first sent to the soldiers at Gallipoli, or to another battlefield of the Great War. Some historians suggest the Anzac biscuit recipe we know, and love evolved from the original wartime ration 'tile' biscuit given to soldiers, which travelled well but could only be eaten by dunking in tea or grating to make a porridge.

Authorities in Australia asked for cakes and biscuits to be made that could survive the long journey at sea sealed in a tin, so the story goes. This meant no eggs could be used to bind the other ingredients, which in turn inspired the addition of golden syrup and the Anzac biscuit's characteristic sweetness.

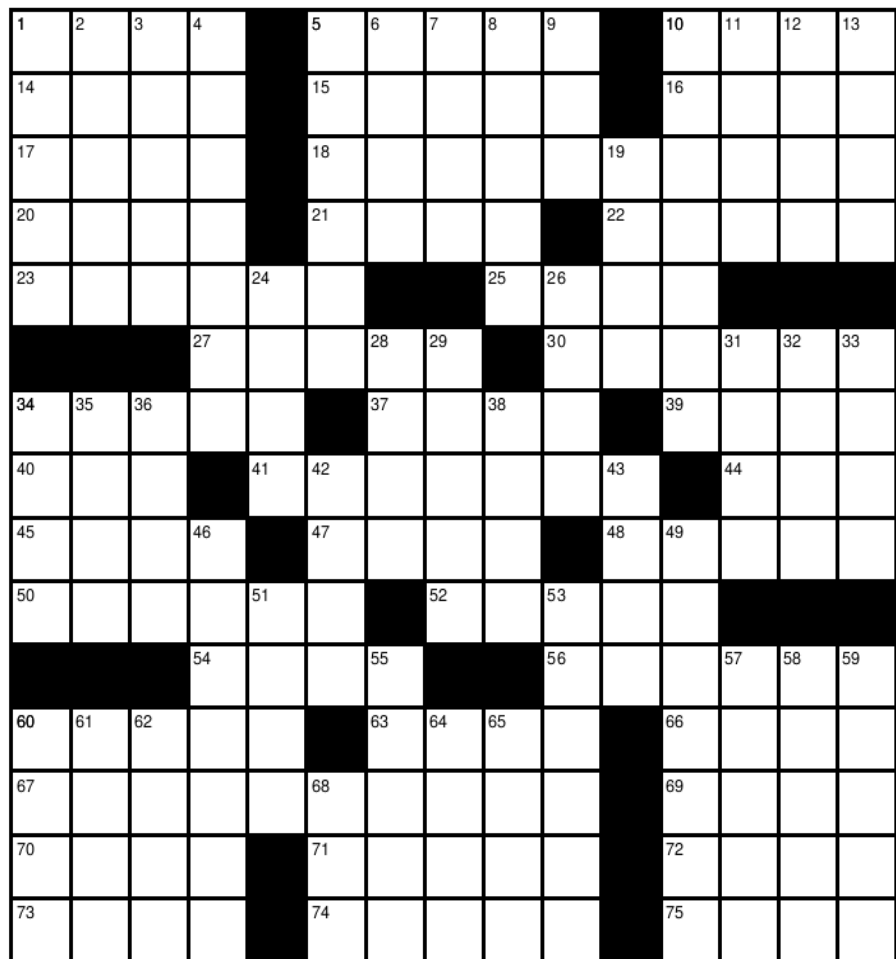

HANDY HINTS

MOTORHOME

1. Use A GPS Navigator

Using a GPS Navigator saves a lot of hassle but remember to pre-load your device with the countries you intend to visit. Also make sure that it is up to date.

2. Maps.Me

Once the app is downloaded, you need to download the area or country of the maps intend to use. This is done within the software settings. You can download as many countries as you want with the only limitation being the available memory on your device.

3. Be Prepared

If your motorhome is a hire vehicle, then there will be certain protocols for the time frames in which to report an incident back to the campervan depot. It's best to confirm this with the depot before you depart.

Keep all your insured documents handy and any emergency numbers to hand. In an accident, the last thing you need is to be rummaging around for numbers and forms.

4. Checks Before Hitting The Road

There are few motorhome tasks that need to be addressed prior to hitting the road each day.

- Turn of LPG gas
- Check all drawers and cupboards are closed and secured
- Ensure paper towels are between plates
- Check the external footstep outside the door is retracted
- Ensure the days GPS waypoint are entered into the GPS device
- Check that window and roof rents are all shut and secured
- Confirm all shower and sink drain plugs are fitted to prevent the grey water tank smells from drifting up the drains and into the vain.
- Have adequate snak-type refreshments at hand for both the navigator and driver.

5. Gas Bottles

It is best to travel with two gas bottles so that once one bottle empties, you can use the spare and then find somewhere to refill the empty gas bottle.

6. Know The Country's Road Rules

- Does it have tolls?

- Do you need to register for electronic tolls?

- Do you need a vignette?
- What are the speed regulations?
- What documents are you required to have in the vehicle?
- What other equipment should you have?

7. Have Important Documents To Hand

Have all your motorhome papers to hand such as insurance, emergency contact details and a green card. The last thing you need in case of an accident is to be searching high and low to find numbers and papers that you need.

8. Grey Water Smells

The greywater is the wastewater from the shower and sinks. Pour a nice smelling detergent into your greywater tank via the sink plug holes just before driving off. This will pretty much eliminate any bad odours caused by the movement of the water in the greywater tank when you are driving which tends to rise up the wastewater pipes and into the motorhome.



SUICIDE PREVENTION WEEK 10TH SEPTEMBER - 16TH SEPTEMBER

What Is National Suicide Prevention Week?

National Suicide Prevention Week is part of an annual awareness campaign that is typically held the first full week after Labour Day. Each year, the three observances that we listed in the previous section are united by a theme that focuses on one aspect of the effort to eliminate suicide.

This year, the theme for National Suicide Prevention Week, Day and Month is Talk Away the Dark. This theme highlights the fact that being willing to discuss this important topic can reduce stigma, eliminate shame, and serve as a beacon of light and hope for people who are struggling.

In addition to supporting people who are currently experiencing suicidal thoughts, Talk Away the Dark also focuses on the following objectives:

> Educating people about the factors that can increase a person's risk of suicide.

> Training the public to recognise the signs that someone may be considering suicide.

> Promoting protective factors that can decrease the likelihood that someone will attempt to end their own life.

As is tradition, many of the graphics, social media posts, and other visual elements that are associated with this year's theme will be accompanied by a ribbon in the AFSP's National Suicide Prevention Week colours of teal and purple.

National Suicide Prevention Week, which begins on September 10 and ends on September 16 this year, is an annual campaign to educate and inform general public about suicide prevention and to warn about rising suicide rates. It also aims to reduce the stigma surrounding suicide and encourage the pursuit of mental health assistance because going to therapy should be normalised as going to the gym.

Although suicide awareness activities

started in the 1950s, the history of suicide itself goes back to the 1700s. The act of suicide is also prominently mentioned in ancient legend and history. Ajax the great killed himself in the Trojan War and Lucretia's suicide around 510 B.C. initiated the revolt that displaced the Roman Kingdom.

How To Observe Suicide Prevention Week?

1. Raise Awareness

One of the most helpful and effective ways we can observe Suicide Prevention Week is by raising awareness of it. We need to reduce the stigma around it and raise awareness so that more and more people can reach out for help.

2. Educate Yourself

The best thing we can do is to learn more about it. We need to educate ourselves and facilitate proactive prevention in our communities so that we can shatter the silence around our mental health.

3. Look Out For Others

Most of the people suffering from poor mental health do not reach out for help, for fear, for being judged or for being misunderstood. So we need to look out for others and check warning signs. We need to help people feel heard and understood.

Why Suicide Prevention Week Is Important?

1. It Helps Prevent Suicide

We can save plenty of lives by raising awareness this week, reaching out to those affected by suicide, and connecting individuals with suicidal thoughts to treatment services.

2. It Reduces Stigma Around Mental Health

By spreading awareness during Suicide Prevention Week, the stigma around mental health has reduced a great deal and most people nowadays are not ashamed to ask for help.

3. It Fosters Compassion In People

Gaining knowledge about this week is helping people learn to empathize, be compassionate, and come together as a community to educate and support each other.

Stats And Facts

We can never underestimate the impact that every life lost to suicide has on family, friends, workplaces and the broader community.

Behind every number is a life which was valued and will be missed.

> 3144 Australians died by suicide in 2021

> Over 10 million Australian adults know someone who has died by suicide

> 1 in 2 young people are impacted by suicide by the time they turn 25

> Suicide was the 15th leading cause of death overall

> Males are around 3 times more likely to die by suicide than females

> Indigenous Australians die by suicide at a rate twice higher than non-Indigenous

> The proportion of suicide deaths recording at least one risk factor was 90% with psychosocial risk factors being the most commonly reported risk factor

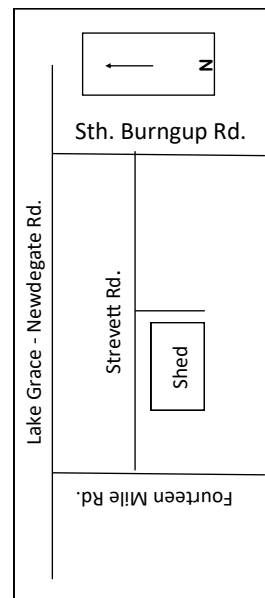

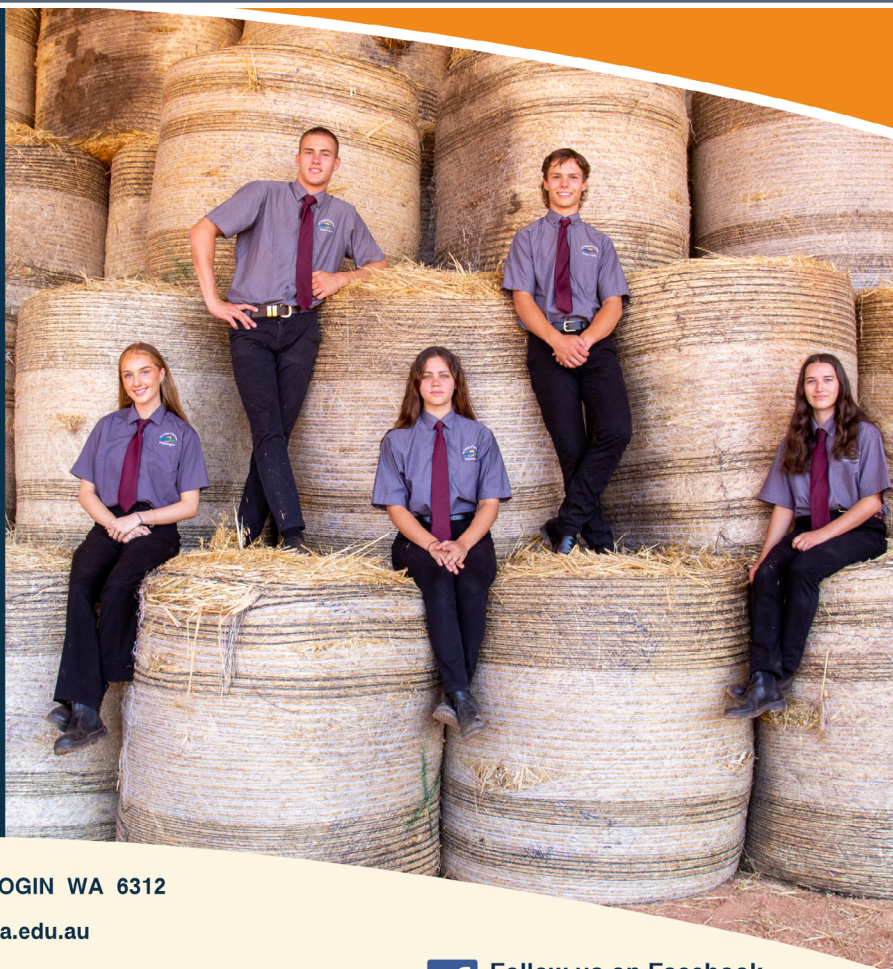
