A big congratulations to the local Kulin Community Bendigo and Rural Bank as well as the CRC for organising such a wonderful event further showcasing our great community and the 'spirit of connection'. Great stuff by Tom, Jocelyn and Alana for all their work as well as our resident DJ Red for his audio visual and IT skills behind the scenes.

As I draft this latest update I notice a few puddles outside and some precipitation in the air. Perhaps a few days overdue, but welcomed none the less. Everyone's crops appear to be hanging in there, but they certainly need a good drink.

Some big sporting events around Kulin this weekend. The Golf Club hosting the annual Clayton Cup. The course had a bit of run yesterday so hopefully a big field and a few low scores, unfortunately Mylesy peaked a week early with his good score on Sunday. Well done to the local footy lads on two great wins on the weekend, I hear top spot is up for grabs over the next few weeks and the boys look to be peaking at the right end of the season. They take on the Rock at home this Sunday in a pivotal late season match.

This week sees myself and 3 Councillors head to Perth for the annual Local Government Convention. This is great opportunity for Council to with meet with all Council's as well as State government representatives to discuss the political drivers within local government and lobby for our fair share of the funding pot. I am pleased to announce that this year Councillor Haydn McInnes will be receiving a Long and Loyal Service Award for his contribution to the community over the course of his 24 years on Council. Congratulations to Haydn and I'm sure his volunteering efforts will continue to be as strong as ever.

After the budget was adopted at the July Council meeting Fiona has been working tirelessly to bill rates. If she can get the printer to cooperate we hope to have rates billed before the end of the week. The due date remains similar to previous years, being the last Friday in September, however the notices are going out a little bit earlier.

On the Works side of things Judd is back from sunning himself up north on holidays for a few weeks. The crew will be ramping up their road construction projects over the next few months. This financial year we have \$430K of Roads to Recovery funding, \$365K of Regional road Group funding and \$100K of Blackspot Funding towards our road program. This funding will go a long way towards our annual road asset renewal works and will keep Judd and his team busy for the months ahead.

The Shire's new 3 x 2 transportable house is due for delivery next week. Many of you will have already seen the preparatory works that have taken place on Ellson Street in readiness for the delivery. Post-delivery, Shire staff will be working with various local trades to hook up the necessary services to make the house liveable.

I hear the KDHS students had a great time in Canberra last week. Well done to all those involved in the organising of such an expedition.

There are currently 2 staff vacancies that are advertised at the moment – CRC Manager and Trainee Finance Officer. I encourage any local community members with the skills or interest in either of these roles to make an enquiry or application to come and work as part of the great team we have at the Shire.

As part of the role you will oversee the running of the Community Resource Centre as well as providing specialised administrative support to the Shire administration in tourism, desktop publishing, event management and media and community engagement. The successful applicant will possess excellent time management skills, will have relevant experience in an associated field and will be committed to working closely with Council to ensure potentially viable projects are fully developed.

Council are prepared to offer an annual salary in the vicinity of \$50-\$65k dependent upon qualifications and experience. The package also includes access to Council's superannuation matching scheme, salary packaging options and subsidised housing.

Trainee Finance Officer

What is involved?

As a Councillor you would be involved in running an organisation with the responsibility of making decisions that have a major impact on our lifestyle. As a representative of your community you will find the role enjoyable, challenging and stimulating with involvement in matters as diverse as recreation, the environment, town planning, health, roads and many more. Meeting fees and some expenses are paid.

Who can nominate?

Any person who is an Australian Citizen over the age of 18 years who is an elector of the district and is not disqualified under the *Local Government Act 1995* may nominate for council. It is not a requirement that a candidate lives or owns property in the ward for which they nominate.

When are elections held?

Local Government ordinary elections are held on the third Saturday in October every two years. The next local government ordinary elections will be held on 19 October 2019.

Councillors are elected for terms of four years in Western Australia. Elections are held every two years for half of the council, and candidates are elected using the first-past-the-post voting system. If a vacancy occurs within a term, an extraordinary election is held.

What training is available?

To ensure the Council members have the necessary training to understand and carry out their role, universal training for candidates and council members is being introduced, part of this training is to complete an online induction prior to nominating for election.

More information will be out soon in regards to Shire of Kulin Local Government elections, in the meantime, if you have thought about nominating to become a Councillor, but aren't sure if the role is for you please register for a free webinar to have all your questions answered!

KULIN CHILD CARE CENTRE

If you have driven past day care over the last couple of weeks you would have noticed the new cubby and sand pit that the children are absolutely loving. New and exciting games are emerging for the children in other aspects of the yard as well. Playing outside has so many benefits for children some of these include:

1. Learning

Playing outside helps children to develop their learning abilities. By putting educational equipment outdoors, children are soon learning through play, which is a fun way of helping children to learn new information and skills. As well as this, outdoor learning encourages children to think of learning as an ongoing process instead of just something done in the classroom.

2. Creativity

Outdoor play is great for encouraging children's creativity. Away from the constraints and confinement of indoor play, whilst being outside children's imaginations are stimulated by the objects around them and they quickly tap into their creativity.

3. Health

There are numerous health benefits to playing outside. With more room to play, children are often more active when outside, which helps them to build strong bones and good fitness levels, while also enabling them to burn off extra energy and calories. As well as this, being in the sunshine, even in winter, means children naturally absorb vital vitamin D, a lack of which can lead to Rickets.

4. Social skills

As outdoor spaces are usually less crowded than indoors, it is less intimidating and helps children to naturally come out of their shells and be more social. This means that children will be more willing to join in games and activities, while they will also be more likely to talk to different children and make new friends. This all encourages children to learn social skills and how to interact with other children away from adult supervision.

5. Well-being

Giving children the freedom of playing outdoor helps them to feel happier and calmer. As already stated, being outside means that children naturally get vitamin D, which is proven to help improve moods and create a positive mental attitude. The freedom of outdoor play also encourages children to get rid of built up energy, particularly if they tend to be fidgety when sitting for long periods of time, this leads to them becoming calmer and ultimately helps them to be more focused when in the classroom.

6. Independence

The large space in which to play means that when outside children are often away from direct adult supervision. This helps them to learn independence when socially interacting with other children, as well as learning to play by themselves. They learn how to take turns playing games, to pick themselves up when they fall, and how to negotiate unfamiliar equipment, resulting in children learning how to be independent and self-reliant.

7. Explore

Often outdoor play equipment has a little more risk than indoor toys. Whether it is encouraging children to use slides they might be a little afraid to go down, or to try challenging play trails; outdoor play equipment can help children to learn to push their boundaries and become good at risk assessment. It also teaches them to explore new games and become confident in learning to try new things without being guided by adults.
