Well, just as I started my last report, the big dry continues around the district. Aside from 10mm a couple of weeks ago, I'm sure the lack of rain continues to frustrate local farmers.

The Federal election posed an interesting and possibly a surprising result for the wider Australia, maybe not so for this area. Shire officers and Council staff have worked closely with local members in recent times on issues such as live export, as well as successfully obtaining \$70M Roads of Strategic Importance funding for key local freight routes within the region. This year the Shire of Kulin will continue to receive approximately \$400K in Roads to Recovery funding which will be put towards renewal projects on our local road network. Shire officers will continue to work with the Federal local member Rick Wilson to identify additional funding opportunities for strategic projects within the community.

Last week was National Volunteer week and the Shire was honoured to hold a "red carpet" dinner recognising the valuable contribution of the great volunteers within our community. Whilst the timing of the function may not have suited all members of the community it was great to see a number of long term volunteers enjoying the hospitality of the evening, especially Mr Harold Proud who probably has the badge of Kulin's current longest serving volunteer. Well done to the ladies at the CRC and FRC for organising this event. Congratulations to all those who were also involved in Australia's Biggest Morning Tea event held at the CRC.

We have recently received the news that the long await ABC program Back Roads episode featuring the Shire of Kulin will go to air on Monday 15th July. The Shire is currently investigating options for a potential community event and screening of the show at the FRC. Feedback and ideas on such an event are most welcome. There was some talk that since Rob Doust reckons he features so heavily in the show that maybe he should brave the elements and go down the waterslide on the day of the screening as a bit of gala opening.

At the last Council Meeting, Council passed its proposed fees and charges for 2019/20. This will be advertised over the coming months. Including in this is new water standpipe fees that will be implemented as a result of Water Corporation's increased charges. A summary of the proposed standpipe fees will also be separately advertised via the Kulin Update over the coming months. This was not a fee that was introduced lightly by Council and it involved discussions at multiple meetings, however Council has unfortunately been put in a predicament by the increased Water Corporation fees which is likely to cost Council in excess of \$50K annually. Water Corporation have indicated they are going to install an additional tank at the standpipe on the Lake Grace Road, so this is one bonus to come out of recent discussions.

From a Staff perspective we are still feverishly preparing next year's budget. Key details of this will hopefully be presented to Council for initial discussion in June with the official 2019/20 Budget to be presented to Council for adoption in July.

I attended a town meeting a couple of weeks ago that entailed some fruitful discussion regarding the development of a "Kulin Cooperative". It was great to see so many interested community members there partaking in the discussion and thrashing around an innovative idea for the potential betterment of the community. Can I stress that this was not a Shire driven discussion, but a community driven discussion, however the Shire remains an interested stakeholder and looks forward to seeing another community driven initiative get off the ground. Timing of the day was significant in that it brought some rainfall.
