What is involved?

As a Councillor you would be involved in running an organisation with the responsibility of making decisions that have a major impact on our lifestyle. As a representative of your community you will find the role enjoyable, challenging and stimulating with involvement in matters as diverse as recreation, the environment, town planning, health, roads and much more. Meeting fees, travel and IT expenses are paid.

Who can nominate?

Any person who is an Australian Citizen over the age of 18 years who is an elector of the district and is not disqualified under the *Local Government Act 1995* may nominate for council.

When are elections held?

Local Government ordinary elections are held on the third Saturday in October every two years. The next local government ordinary elections will be held on Saturday 21 October 2023.

Councillors are elected for terms of four years in Western Australia. Elections are held every two years for half of the council, and candidates are elected using operational preferential voting. If a vacancy occurs within a term, an extraordinary election is held.

What training is available?

To ensure the Council members have the necessary training to understand and carry out their role, universal training for candidates and council members is being introduced, part of this training is to complete an online induction prior to nominating for election.

More information will be out soon in regards to Shire of Kulin Local Government elections, in the meantime, if you have thought about nominating to become a Councillor, but aren't sure if the role is for you please register for a free webinar to have all your questions answered!

Truck Driver

Applications are invited for the position of a full time Truck Driver with the Shire of Kulin.

The successful applicant will be required to operate council's plant and machinery to maintain and improve the Shire's road network as required, the main focus of the position is the operation of a Prime Mover Side Tipper combination. It is a requirement to hold a minimum "HC" class license, applicants holding an "MC" licence, or be willing to be upskilled to obtain this will be held in high regard.

Conditions of employment are in accordance with the Local Government Industry Award 2020, Industrial Agreement.

The successful applicant will be offered a remuneration package between \$70,000 and \$80,000 depending on qualifications and experience and will work an 84-hour fortnight spread across nine days (including an RDO). There is potential for higher earnings should the applicant be willing to complete additional overtime hours.

The package includes subsidised housing (subject to availability at time of offer) or a housing allowance, and in addition the Shire offers generous additional superannuation for longer term employees, along with free membership for employees to local recreational clubs and facilities.

Kulin is located three hours south east of Perth, has a district population of 1000 and is well serviced in terms of health care and schooling (to year 10). There are recreation facilities second to none, and an energetic community provides the opportunity for plenty of active participation and quality living.





SHIRE NOTICES

CAMBODIA HOUSE BUILDING TRIP 2023

Congratulations to **Amber McAdam** and **Amelia Spurr** who were selected to represent the Kulin Community on a life changing 9-day trip to Cambodia in October 2023 to help build homes for some of the world's poorest families.

Amber and Amelia will be travelling with Miss Sanford, Mrs Frantom and Ben Whisson from Consult Ag Kulin to work with The Helping Foundation Australia, who have coordinated volunteer building tours to Cambodia since 2008 and have built over 1,000 houses.

Eight out of ten Cambodians live in rural Cambodia, in fragile structures that offer little protection from the elements. During the rainy season, houses are often flooded and limited possessions are lost. Parents often get sick and cannot work. In Cambodia, if you do not work you do not earn. Children need to fossick for food

for the family, so they have no time to attend school. Having a sturdy house not only provides shelter and security, but parents are also healthier, possessions are not lost to floods, and children in weatherproof housing are ten times more likely to attend school and are on a path to better employment and a better life.

The initiative is being coordinated by Ben and Gen Whisson from Consult Ag Kulin (Croppportunity Pty Ltd) and aims to provide Kulin DHS students with an experience of a lifetime, building leadership and an appreciation of the incredible perks of life in Australia.

A big thank you and congratulations to all six high school students who applied. All applicants were incredible. The community panel who assisted with the selection process were highly impressed with the written applications and how

all students conducted themselves at their interviews. The depth of the talented and compassionate students/youth we have at our school and within our community shone through and the panel was very proud of each student.



COOKING CORNER

NUTELLA RASPBERRY CUPCAKES AND COCONUT BOUNTY SLICE

Nutella Raspberry Cupcakes

Ingredients

- 1 1/4 cup all purpose flour
- 2 tbsp unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1/4 cup butter, room temperature
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1/3 cup Nutella
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup milk
- 24 whole raspberries
- extra Nutella for topping

Method

Step 1

Preheat oven to 180C. Line a 12 cup muffin pan with paper liners.

Step 2

In a large bowl, whisk together flour, cocoa powder, baking powder and salt.

Step 3

In a large bowl, cream together butter and sugars until light and creamy. Blend in egg, followed by Nutella and vanilla extract. Mix in half of the flour mixture, followed by the milk. Mix in the remaining flour mixture and stir until no streaks of dry ingredients remain.

Step 4

Divide batter evenly into prepared muffin cups. Push two whole raspberries into each cup of batter, spreading the batter on top to cover them.

Step 5

Bake for about 20-23 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the centre of

the cupcake comes out clean or with only a few moist crumbs attached.

Step 6

Carefully turn cupcakes out onto a wire rack to cool completely.

Step 7

Once cupcakes are cooled, top each with a couple of teaspoons of Nutella and a dusting of crush, freeze-dried raspberries.

Makes 12

Coconut Bounty Slice

Ingredients

Base

- 10 pitted Medjool dates
- 1 cup almond meal
- 1 1/2 cup shredded coconut
- 2 tbsp brown rice syrup
- 2 tbsp cacao powder
- 2 tbsp chia seeds
- pinch pink Himalayan salt

Coconut Filling

- 3 cups shredded coconut
- 1 cup raw cashews, soaked for 2 hours
- 1/3 cup coconut butter
- 1/3 cup brown rice syrup
- 1 tsp vanilla bean powder
- 2 tsp coconut water
- pinch Himalayan salt

Chocolate Drizzle Topping

- 1/3 cup cacao powder
- 1/4 cup cacao butter
- 1/3 cup virgin coconut oil
- 1/4 cup brown rice syrup

Method

Step 1

Combine base ingredients into a food processor and blend until it forms a sticky crumbly dough.

Step 2

Press mixture into a lined tin (9 inch square or equivalent) and place in freezer while you make the filling.

Step 3

Place all filling ingredients into a food processor until all ingredients are combined evenly.

Step 4

Remove base from freezer. Spread the coconut filling on top of the chocolate base. Press down flat and refrigerate for about half an hour or freeze to speed up the process.

Step 5

Remove from the fridge and use a cookie cutter to carefully cut out hearts or alternatively cut into slices.

Step 6

For the topping, melt down the coconut oil and cacao butter in a double boiler (heat resistant bowl over pot of simmering water). Stir with a whisk to combine.

Step 7

Add sifted cacao powder and rice syrup to the bowl. Whisk together until all ingredients are well combined and a smooth runny chocolate forms.

Step 8

Drizzle the chocolate topping over the cut-out bounty pieces/slices.

Step 9

Refrigerate until set.



RECREATIONAL VEHICLE (RV)

1. Use An RV Departure Checklist

There is nothing like getting on the road and finding out that you forgot to unplug your power cord. There are a lot of things to remember before you pull out.

A visual checkleest, either printed or on your smartphone, will help to ensure you don't forget anything. Print out this free RV Departure Checklist and keep it somewhere easy to access.

2. Know The Height Of Your Rig

Find out how high your rig is. Write the height on a label or piece of masking tape and put it on your dashboard. Watch for low-hanging branches and take note of the height of overpasses before you proceed. Use an RV-safe GPS to make sure you have a safe route.

3. Level Your RV Before Filling Your Freshwater Tank

Levelling your RV before filling your tank will ensure that you are really getting a full tank.

4. Mount Towel Bards On Your Walls With Exterior Grade Gorilla Mounting Tape

Exterior grade Gorilla mounting tape adheres to RV walls much better than Command strips or anything else.

5. Replace Your RV Showerhead

This trick will help you to conserve water, while still having decent water pressure.

6. Use An Instant Pot Pressure

Cooker

The instant pot pressure cooker will allow you to make almost effortless, delicious meals in a lot less time than traditional cooking methods.

7. Bring A Basic Tool Kit

Be prepared to make minor repairs if you need by having a basic tool kit with just the essentials. This includes a screwdriver or cordless drill, a few different bits, some screws, and electrical tester and wrenches like a torque wrench.

8. Pack A Hairdryer

A hairdryer can be used for more than just giving you good hair. You can use a hairdryer to thaw frozen foods or blow warm air onto cold kindling when lighting a campfire.

9. Pack A First Aid Kit

Be prepared for emergencies by packing a first aid kit for both humans and pets.

10. Bring A Collapsible Storage Tote Or Two

Collapsible storage totes can be used to tote campfire supplies like s'mores ingredients, napkins, glasses and beverages and make decent impromptu tables to put campfire essentials on.

11. Board games will help your family enjoy time indoors if the weather gets too ugly to play outside.

12. Repurpose Your Dishwater

When you are boondocking, your time off-grid and unhooked will be much better if you don't run out of water.

Washing and rinsing dishes uses more water than anything besides your RV toilet, so it makes sense to repurpose your dishwater. Use a basin to wash your dishes and then use grey water to flush your toilet.

13. Make Sure Your Campfire Is Really Out Before Leaving It

Abandoned campfires are one of the leading causes of forest fires. Not all of these fires were intentionally left smouldering.

Campfires heat the ground underneath them, hot enough to reignite anything combustible in your firepit hours later. No one wants to be "that guy/girl" so use a lot of water or dirt to thoroughly smother your campfire when you are done with it.

As a rule of thumb, you should be able to put your hand comfortably on the ground in your fireplace before you leave.

14. Wash Your Clothes As You Travel

Put dirty clothes, water and laundry soap into a five-gallon bucket with a tight lid. Make sure the lid is on snug because if it isn't it makes a huge mess. Find a place in your rig where you can make sure the bucket will stay firmly in place. If you have a place to secure it, even better.

Every bump you hit and turn you take will agitate the clothes in the bucket as you drive, just like a washing machine does. After an hour or two of driving, your clothes will be perfectly clean, ready to be rinsed and hung to dry in fresh air.

NATIONAL SOCCER DAY 28TH JULY

What Is National Soccer Day?


